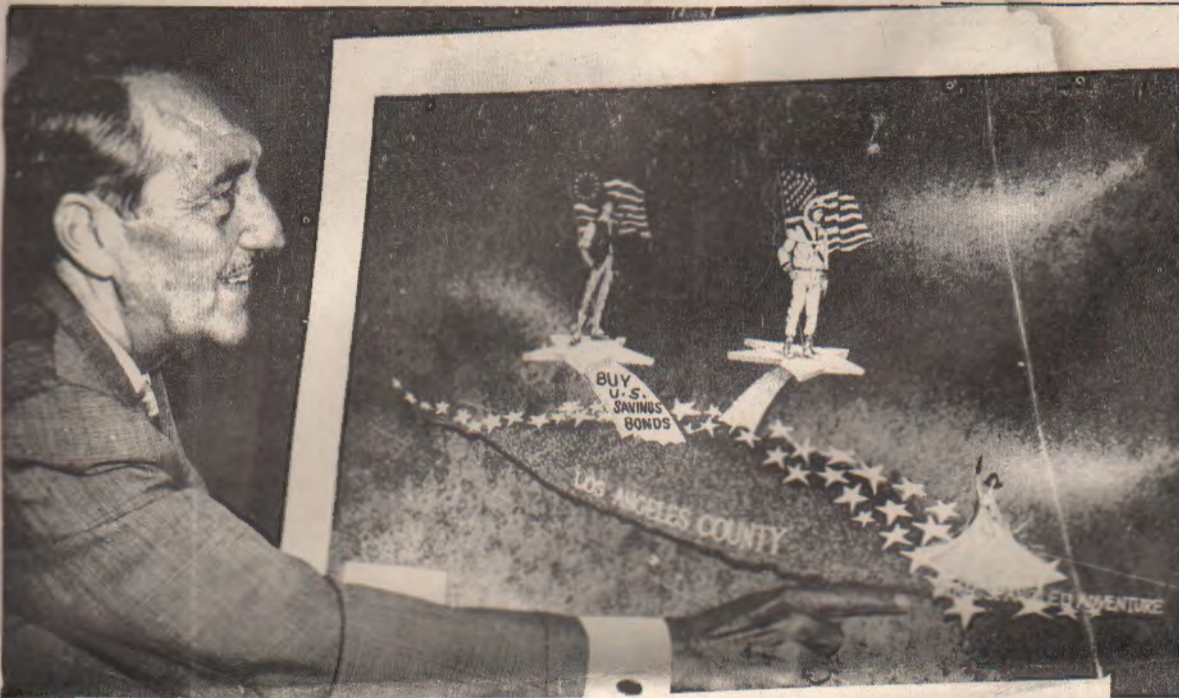

## HEAD START SLATED FOR BIRCHWOOD



**SAVINGS BOND FLOAT FEATURED IN 'TOURNAMENT OF ROSES' PARADE IN PASADENA.** Star-Spangled Adventure was the theme for the U.S. Savings Bonds float which was viewed by more than two million persons along the line of march at the Tournament of Roses Parade in Pasadena, California on January 1, 1968.

Through television, newsreels, newspapers and magazines, another 40 million discovered how Savings Bonds help support our country.

Los Angeles County Supervisor Chairman, Frank G. Bonnelli shows the design of the Los Angeles County float and he points out how Savings Bonds have extended from our Minute Man of Concord to the astronaut of today.

**CHUGIAK:** A proposal for a Head Start program in the Greater Chugiak Area has been submitted to the Office of Economic Opportunity by the Anchorage Borough school District.

This proposal calls for one class consisting of not more than 15 students to be housed in the Birchwood Elementary School.

If approved by the O.E.O., the program is scheduled to begin on January 15th, 1968

begin on January 15th, 1968 and continue until the end of the school term.

This proposal was submitted at the request of the Anchorage Community Action Agency. The idea originally was conceived by the local Community Council G.O.A.L.

Head Start differs from the conventional kindergarten in that it is an enrichment program specifically designed for children from disadvantaged homes. It includes medical and dental care, as well as free lunches.

The appropriation for this program would be in the amount of \$20,000, which provides a teacher, a teachers aid, bus transportation, lunches and medical and dental services.

### NO WORD YET FROM NEW YEAR BABY

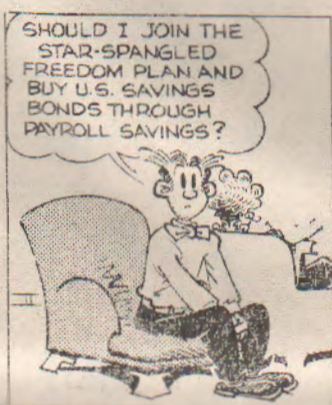
As 1968 moves into its second day, there is still no word as to whether the Chugiak New Year Baby has made his appearance.

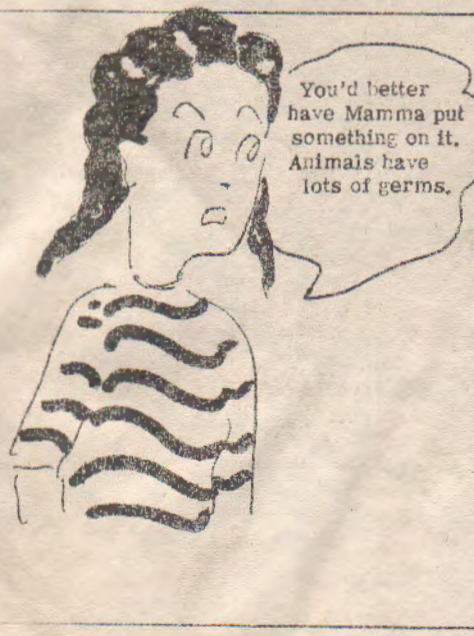

## PRE-SCHOOL EYE TESTS PLANNED

**CHUGIA:** Members of the Chugiak Health Council wish to remind parents of pre-school children in the Greater Chugiak Area of the Amblyopia (Eye) Clinic to be held here in January.

Beberly Glenn, local Public Health Nurse explains that Amblyopia, or "Lazy Eye" is a condition that if untreated in children under the age of six can lead to partial blindness.

Mrs. Glenn said that often parents are unaware of this condition because a very young child is himself unaware they he is not seeing properly, and the amblyopia is not discovered until the child has started school, at which time it may be too late to correct it.

The clinic will test all pre-school children for amblyopia at no charge to the parents. The date for the clinic has been set for January 13th, a Saturday. It will be held in the Health Center, located in the basement of the Eagle River Baptist Church between the hours of 11:00am and 4:30pm.

The Health Council is asking women from the community to assist in conducting this clinic.

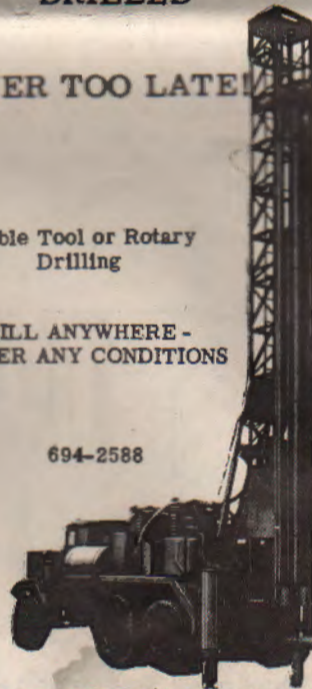

**U OF A PROF GETS AWARD**

Dr. Ghanshyer, Matt Sharma, assistant professor in the University of Alaska, Institute of Marine Science, has been awarded the American Association of Petroleum Geologists' "President's Award" for the best scientific paper published in 1966.

Presentation of the award, with a \$100 cash prize, will be made at the association's annual convention in April in Oklahoma City.

Dr. Sharma's paper, "Geology of Peter's Reef, St. Clair, Michigan", appeared in the association's publication, "The Bulletin", in February of 1966.

The study of the Michigan Region, now an active oil and gas production zone, describes the geologic formation of an ancient ocean reef.

Dr. Sharma joined the faculty means of predicting the location of similar ancient reef deposits by geologic study.

Dr. Sharma joined the faculty of the UA in 1961 after receiving his doctorate from the University of Michigan. Born in India, he was associated with the university's Douglas Marine Station near Juneau for several years until he came to the main UA campus for research work in 1965.

## FIRE COMPANY TELLS CONTEST WINNERS

**CHUGIAK:** The Chugiak Volunteer Fire Company have announced the winners of the coupon contest which they held in the three local grade schools recently.

The winning class in the Chugiak Elementary School was Mr. Ruberg's 5th grade, who collected a total of 2,904 coupons. At the Eagle River Elementary School, Mrs. Hulse' class was the winner with a total of 1,174 coupons. Winning class at the Birchwood grade school was Mrs. Emmon's first grade class with a total of 3,102 coupons.

The total number of coupons collected by all the classes at the three schools was 25,745.

The Fire Company is attempting to collect enough Betty Crocker coupons to be able to get a new fire truck through the General Mills Corp. A total of 4 million coupons are needed. To date the fire company has collected 34,204, including those obtained through the contest. The prize for each winning class was \$10 cash to be used in any manner that they see fit.

## LOCAL DRIVER IN THREE CAR CRACK UP

### ONE FIRE NUMBER RECOMMENDED

Senator Ernest Gruening (Alaska) has won F.B.I. Director J. Edgar Hoover's endorsement of his Senate Concurrent Resolution 50, proposing one uniform nationwide fire reporting telephone number and one uniform nationwide police reporting telephone number.

Hoover said in a letter to the senator, "I agree with your proposal in principle since any means which would achieve the more rapid reporting of a request for assistance would also result in a quicker police response. In the case of crime, this would result in solutions and would, of course, save lives in certain emergency situations. You are, of course, aware of the administrative and technical problems in achieving this goal."

Senator Gruening's resolution also has the endorsement and support of the National Fire Protection Association, the International Association of Fire Chiefs, the International Association of Fire Fighters, the National Sheriffs Association and the International Association of Chiefs of Police, Inc.

When introducing his resolution in November, the Alaska senator said, "Uniform nationwide fire reporting and police reporting telephone numbers will not end riots, eradicate criminals, nor prevent fires, but they would provide two sensible tools which could make it possible for a stranger passing through town to save a burning home or apartment house or let local police authorities know that a store front has been broken."

### NEITHER HURT IN TWO CAR COLLISION

OLD CHUGIAK: Neither of two local drivers were injured in a two car accident which took place at mile 17 1/2 Glenn Highway last week.

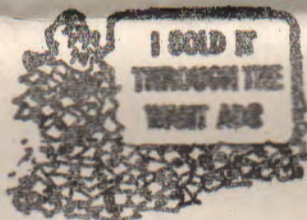
The accident was caused when both driver came upon a scene in which several cars had skidded off the road and the highway was blocked.

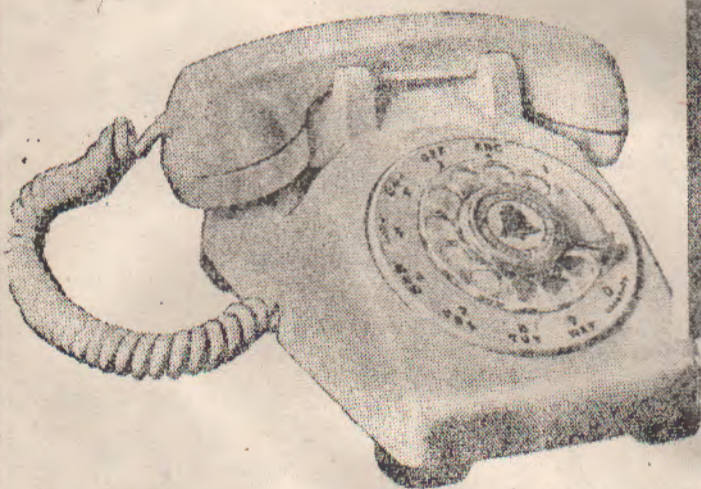
