ABSENTEE BALLOTS HERE FOR SPECIAL ELECTION

ANCHORAGE: Absentee ballots for the coming July 30th Special Election are now available, according to Mary Nettleton, Borough Clerk.

This is the election which will determine whether the residents of the area served by the Chugiak Volunteer Fire Company want a tax financed fire service district, and at the same time to elect three supervisors to serve in an advisory capacity for this district.

Persons wishing to vote absentee may apply at the Borough office in person and cast their ballot at that time, or they may apply by mail to the Borough Clerk, at 104 Northern Lights Blvd. in Anchorage.

When applying by mail, the applicant must give an accurate description of where they live and sign a statement of how long they have resided at that location. An accurate mailing address is also required.

Persons who will be out of the area, as well as those who will not have transportation to the polls may vote absentee, Mrs. Nettleton said.

The purpose of the event is to raise money to defray the cost of transportation for the girls when traveling with the team.



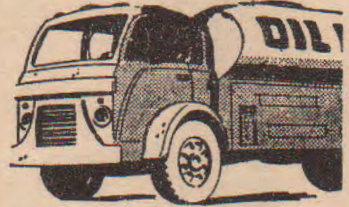

LARRY GRAHAM TO ATTEND CONFERENCE

BIRCHWOOD: In a recent announcement, Laurence N. Graham, Chugiak High School Principal, was informed that he had been selected from over two hundred vocational educators, throughout the United States to participate in a national ANALYSIS INSTITUTE FOR CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT to be held at Colorado State University, Fort Collins, Colorado, July 29th to August 2nd.

The focus of this institute will be on problems and innovations in the total field of vocational education analysis for curriculum development.

Over one hundred vocational educators from forty-seven states and Puerto Rico will share experience and presentations by world-recognized authorities in vocational education.

Twenty one guest speakers and resource individuals will be drawn from geographic areas of the United States.

A series of workshop sessions will be integrated with the more formalized presentations.

Preliminary indications show that while the spouse in attending the institute, members of several of the families will be vacationing in the area of the Rocky Mountains. Fort Collins, the site of Colorado State University, is 65 miles north of Denver, Colorado, close to Poudre Canyon and about an hour's drive from Rocky Mountain National Park.

The conference grew out of an urgent need identified by members of the U.S. Office of Education which is supporting the institute. Dr. Larson and Dr. Blake of the Department of Vocational Education of Colorado State University are the co-directors of the Institute on Occupational Analysis as a Basis for Curriculum Development.

She is also at present a junior at the University of Alaska, where she is majoring in education.

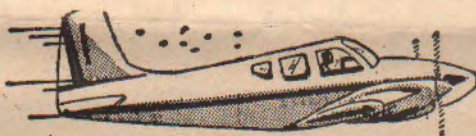

PLANE CRASH: A light military plane crashed at 11:30pm last night about 200 yards west of the Eagle River Laundromat. The pilot was killed. The crash was noted by Jack Carnahan, who immediately reported.

ROUSING WELCOME FOR GOVERNOR "MIKE": When Governor Mike Stepovich alights from the plane at International Airport Monday evening, he will be greeted by the Anchorage Red Carpet Committee, along with fans from the Chugiak Area.

PUBLIC MEETING FOR FIRE PROTECTION SET FOR AUGUST 8th: The Chugiak Volunteer Fire Co. has reached a point where it must have better community support financially in order to continue operating. The few donations the Company has received to date have not been sufficient to pay operating expenses or repairs and replacement to equipment.

The Fire Company has proposed a plan for Subscription type fire protection to be approved by a Fire Advisory Board whose eight members will be elected to office by fire protection subscribers.

EAGLE RIVER: The Obedience Training Club of Chugiak will hold graduation exercises for the current class on Thursday, July 17th at 6:30pm.

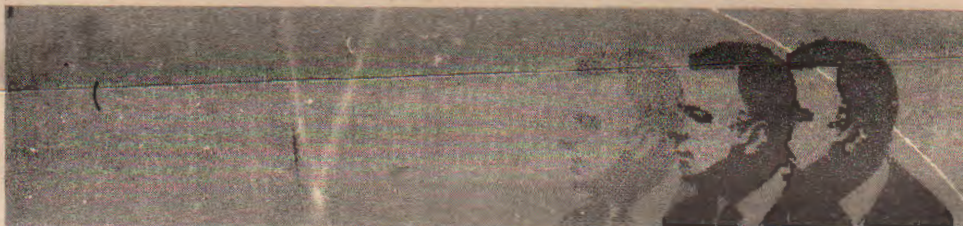

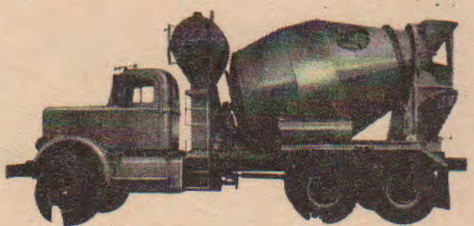
