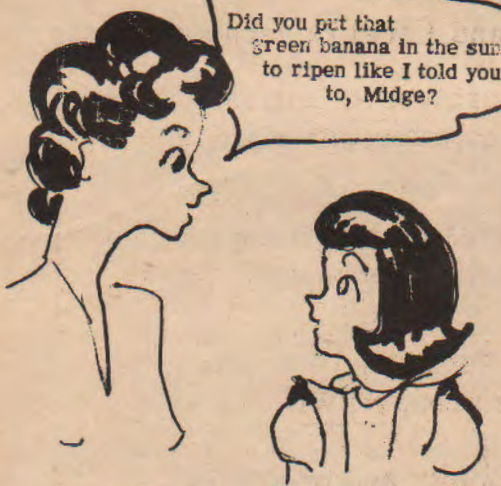

CHUGIAK: Til Wallace, local contractor has asked that anyone who is planning to install a sewer or waste disposal system be advised that they should check with the Borough Health Department to determine if they are meeting with the requirements.

Wallace said that he is aware of several instances where the systems failed to meet the specifications and were condemned by the borough and had to be relocated and modified at the owners expense.

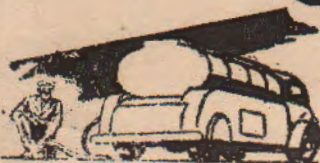
This is contrary to the previous position of the Service which had held that the Alaska School Tax was not deductible because it was not an ad valorem tax.
