

LOCAL ELECTION RETURNS

LINDA SULLIVAN TO CUT RIBBON

PETERS CREEK: The Mirror Lake Picnic Wayside will be officially opened August 31 at 2pm, when Linda Sullivan, Chugiak High School homecoming queen for the Class of 68, cuts the ribbon.

The newly completed facility is located at mile 23 off the Glenn Highway and will provide boating, fishing and picnic opportunities, said Ted Smith, chief of parks and recreation for the Alaska Division of Lands.

Chairman John Asplund will speak on behalf of the Greater Anchorage Area Borough, and Smith will represent the State. The Chugiak Lioness Club will provide refreshments.

The wayside represents an investment of \$82,000 with the State and the BOR sharing the costs, Smith explained. He said the wayside is designed for day use only, and overnight camping will not be permitted.

A boat launching ramp has been installed, and there is a parking space for 44 vehicles and boat trailers. Future construction will include a pier. There is a sandy beach, and a swimming area has been designated by a float boundary. Dressing rooms have been constructed.

The picnic area has 27 individual units with tables and fireplaces. A shelter provides six tables. A well furnishes fresh water, and sanitary facilities are also available, Smith said.

Route 44-7:20am, first pick-up at airstrip, turn around on Spur Rd. and proceed to south end of Glenn Highway, picking up to Chugiak High Sch.

CHUGIAK ELEMENTARY: (School starts 8:15am) Route 22-Lower Fire Lake at 7:35am and continue along Glenn H'way going north to Chugiak Elementary. Route 24-Eklutna; 7:30am first pick-up at Eklutna R.R. and proceed to Peters Creek Shopping Center on Glenn H'way. Route 25-Peters Creek Shopping Center on Glenn H'way to Spring Creek Lodge. First pick-up at 7:35am.

EAGLE RIVER ELEMENTARY: (School starts 8:15am) Route 40-North Glenn H'way First pick-up at 7:40am at Lower Fire Lake and continue on Glenn H'way to school. ROUTE 42-Eagle River

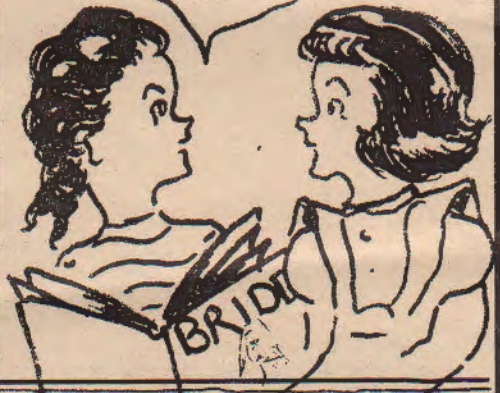

BACK-TO-SCHOOL CLINIC CALLED

located on the Ski Road in Peters Creek adjoining the L.D.S. Chapel site.

The park is to be for recreational and relaxation purposes, and development is projected for the spring of 1969.

This park has been in the planning and plotting stages for almost 3 years and has just recently been accepted by the Borough Planning and Zoning Commission.

Four trustees will hold permanent terms.

The founding Relief Society Presidency, Dolores E. Whaley President, Margaret M. Halverson, 1st Counselor, Dorothy M. Johnson 2nd Counselor and Sterling E. Whaley Presiding Trustee Commissioner.

The administration of the park, its funds and management will be under the direction of the Chugiak Branch Relief Society Presidency.

Individuals will be able to own a share of the park through a plan under which the park site has been divided into 55,880 plots one foot square. Deeds to each plot will be sold for \$2.00 each. A handsome certificate will be given to each purchaser of a plot. The funds raised by the sale of these plots will be used to build the Chugiak LDS Chapel on the site donated by the Whaleys to the Church nearly five years ago.

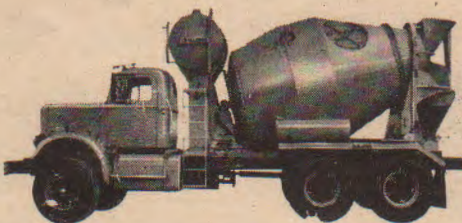

KITTY LOWE TO BE CAPPED

PORTLAND ORE: Catherine J. (Kitty) Lowe, daughter of Mr. O.W. (Bill) Lowe of Peters Creek, will be one of 26 students in the University of Portland School of Nursing to participate in capping ceremonies Sunday, September 8th at 2pm in St. Mary's Chapel.

Miss Lowe is a graduate of the Chugiak Elementary School and of East Anchorage High School.

A reception will be given by the faculty of the School of Nursing in the Terrace Room of the University Commons immediately following the ceremony for the students, their parents and friends.

Miss Lowe will be in the first class to begin a major in nursing as a junior in the newly developed School of Nursing curriculum, which will integrate psychiatric, medical, surgical,

maternal-child and community health nursing. Funds for the new curriculum development will be provided by a five yr. grant of \$215,000 to the U.S. Public Health Service.

BIDS TO BE ASKED FOR LOCAL ROAD

JUNEAU: Commissioner of Highways, C.E. Steen, announced today that the Department of Highways will begin advertising for construction of 8.3 miles of Glenn Highway between Eagle River and Peters Creek and 0.7 miles of the Birchwood Loop Road.

Construction along the Glenn Highway will consist of grading drainage, hot bituminous pavement and construction of a composite steel and concrete bridge 168 feet long.

The Birchwood Loop construction will consist of only grading and drainage.

Advertising will begin August 23, with bids to be opened in the commissioner's office in Douglas on September 19, 1968.

RELOCATABLES MOVE ON

BIRCHWOOD: The highly controversial relocatable classrooms at Chugiak High School have been removed and relocated elsewhere in school district it was learned today.

One of the buildings has been moved to Wendler Jr. High, and one to Birchwood Elementary to house the seventh grade classes there. It was not learned where the two remaining classrooms were taken.

The classrooms had been constructed at Chugiak High in 1967 to house the seventh graders there. Chugiak seventh graders now attend Birchwood Elementary, but are still carried as part of the Chugiak Jr.-Sr. High complex.

BACK TO SCHOOL AT CHS

BIRCHWOOD: Chugiak High School opens on September 3rd, 1968, with all 8-12 grade students reporting to Chugiak High School for classes, beginning at 8:00am. All seventh grade students report to Birchwood Elementary School for classes beginning at 8:05am.

All students in grades 7-12 will ride the high school buses which will run approximately twenty (20) minutes earlier than last year. Bus routes will be basically the same.

Any boy or girl interested in athletics, GAA or cheerleading will need a physical exam and accident insurance coverage. Tenth, eleventh and twelfth grade students should check their eligibility prior to purchasing equipment for athletics.



AIR FORCE RESCUES LOCAL MAN

EAGLE RIVER: Customers at the Eagle River Shopping Center can now know who the mystery man was who was let out of an Air Force Helicopter in the field across the road two weeks ago today.

The man was Douglas Ballard, of Eagle River who had just been rescued from a situation which might be compared as being "between the Devil and the Deep Blue Sea".

Ballard and two companions, had been sheep hunting up Eagle River canyon. The hunt had been successful, and the two other men had started on foot packing out the meat, leaving Ballard to guard the camp and the remaining meat until they could return.

Some time after they had left, Ballard noticed that bears were gathering around the camp. He decided that this was no place for him, and started to hike out, only to find a brush fire was blocking his exit from the canyon. When he heard an aircraft overhead, he grabbed a yellow poncho and began waving it.

The plane happened to belong to the Department of Fish and Game who were on routine patrol. They in turn radioed Rescue and Coordination Center at Elmendorf. A H21 helicopter piloted by Capt. Page G. Brake Jr. of the 21st Operation Squadron was dispatched and Ballard was picked up and airlifted to Eagle River.

It is not known whether the hunters were able to return to the canyon and rescue their meat before the bears made off with it.
