Linda Anne Lloyd, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. William D. Lloyd of Eagle River Valley, spent 7 days of her 14 day leave with her parents who are renting in Wasilla during the winter months when they are unable to stay at their mountain homestead.

EAGLE RIVER: The first annual Alaska State Women's Championship Snow-mobile Race will be held here on Saturday, January 10th, and Sunday, January 11th.

The two day event will start at Pippel's field in Eagle River, and end the first lap at the Royal Alaskan Lodge, at Big Lake. The race will follow the Talkeetna Trail.

On Sunday, the racer will leave Big Lake and return to Eagle River.

This event was the inspiration of Mary Whitman, who with her husband Harry, operates Harry's Auto Parts in Eagle River. The Whitmans are the dealers for Skiroule snow machines, and Mary not only dreamed up the idea of an all woman race, but was instrumental in organizing the race committee.

The race is open to all women aged 16 or older, with those between 16 and 19 years of age having to have parental permission to participate. The racers may compete in any of 4 classes. Powderpuff 1, is for machine of 250cc's; Powderpuff No. 2 for 251cc to 295cc; Powderpuff 3, 296cc to 345cc; and Powderpuff 4, 346cc to 400cc.

The race will be conducted under USSA rules, which prohibit women from racing machines over 400cc or those which have been modified. The race has been sanctioned by the Anchorage Motor Musers.

Registration fee for the race is \$35.00 which includes two tickets to the awards banquet which will be held on Sunday January 11th at 8:00pm at the Red Barn in Eagle River.

Anyone wishing to register may do so at Harry's Auto Parts at Mile 14 1/2 Old Glenn Highway, or at B&B Tool, on Seward Highway in Anchorage. Registration closes on midnight, January 7th.

past year and one half.

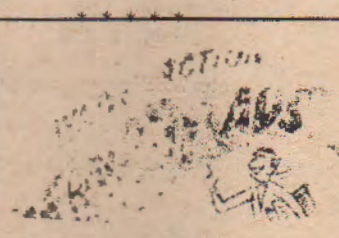
DOCTOR TO PRACTICE FULL

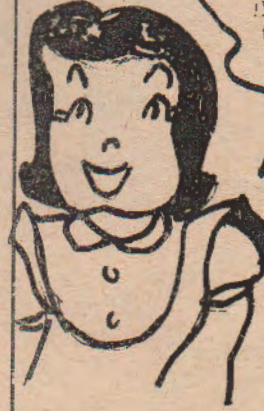

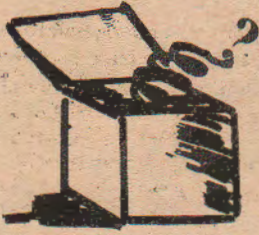

All committee members are asked to be there promptly at 7:30pm, and the club historian is asked to bring all her materials.

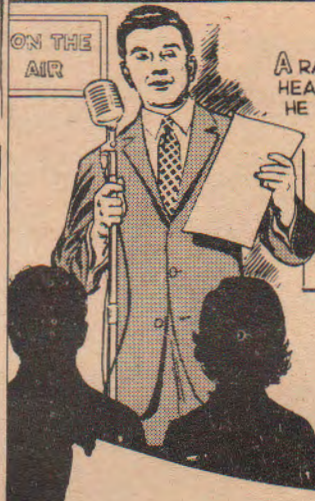
The next regular meeting of the Ladies Club will be on Thursday, January 8th., at the home of Dee Steeby in Birchwood.

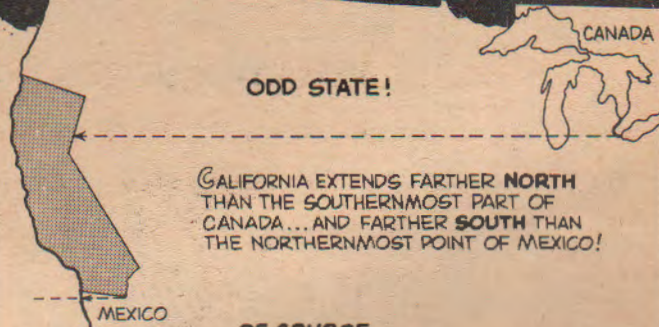

### VETS MUST RE-ENROLL

Approximately 400 veterans in Alaska, who are now attending college under the Veteran's G.I. Bill, are reminded by M.W. McDonough, manager U.S. Veterans Administration for Alaska, that many enrollments have been for one semester only.

Veterans enrolled for only one semester must be re-enrolled for the following semester before training allowance payments for that period can commence.

Also, those enrolled for only the first semester must furnish a Certificate of Attendance for

the first semester before payment can commence for the second semester. Certificates of Attendance have been automatically furnished to most veterans enrolled for only the first semester, McDonough stated.

Veterans are also reminded that if their enrollment in college was for an entire school year, they must notify the Veterans Administration immediately if they do not enroll for the second semester. Failure to notify the Veterans Administration of nonenrollment for the second semester may result in overpayments which must be recovered.

## GUN LAW IS EASED

It no longer is necessary for dealers to keep records of certain ammunition sales, the Internal Revenue Service said recently.

Newly enacted legislation eliminates the need for dealers to keep record on sales of shotgun ammunition, ammunition suitable only for use in rifles, and component parts of these types of ammunition. Purchases of ammunition interchangeable between rifles and handguns, such as .22 caliber rimfire ammunition, continue to be subject to the record keeping requirements. Previously, the Gun Control Act of 1968 required records for all ammunition sales.

IRS stressed, however, that no other aspect of the Act, which is administered by the Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms Division of the IRS, was changed by the legislation.

Persons engaged in selling ammunition still are required to be licensed under the act.

Anyone under twenty - one years of age cannot purchase handgun ammunition. However, individuals at least eighteen can buy rifle and shotgun ammunition. Dealers must still require purchasers to identify themselves if there is doubt about their age.

Felons, persons under indictment for a felony, fugitives from justice, unlawful users of drugs, mental incompetents, and persons under eighteen continue to be prohibited from purchasing ammunition of any type.

The change in the law affects only shotgun and rifle ammunition, and their component parts. Dealers still are required to keep records on the sales of other ammunition, specifying the type and quantity of ammunition and identifying the buyer. IRS said.

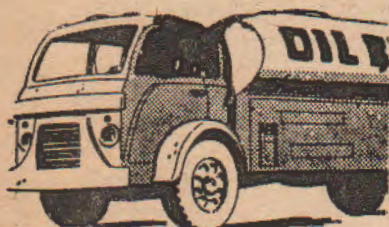

Lines, Hilton International Hotels, and the Swiss National Railways.

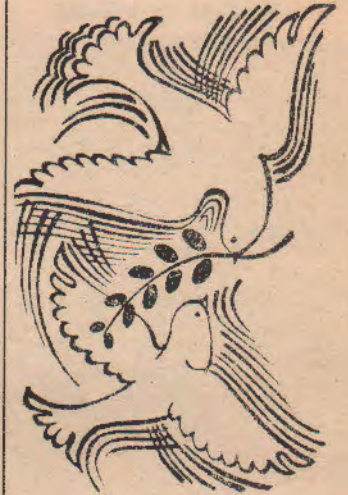

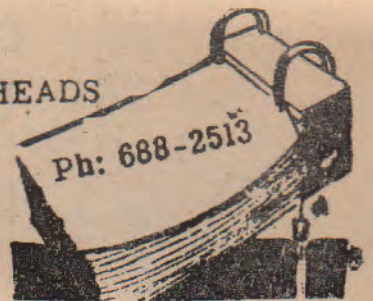

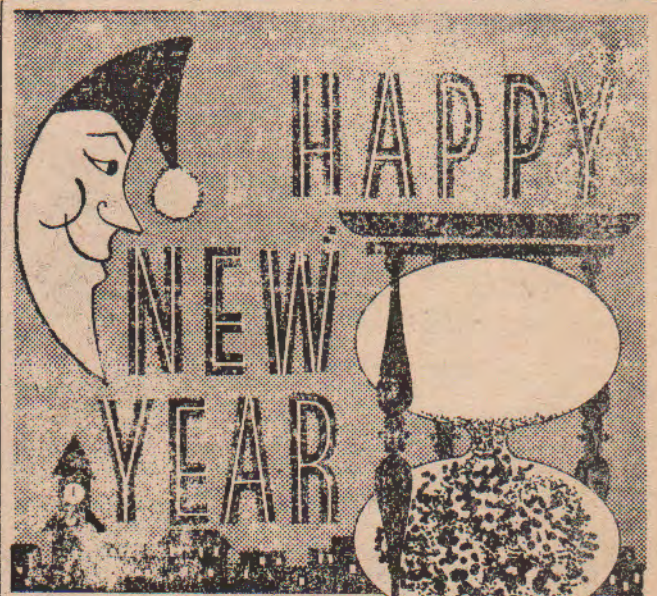
