FIRE LEAVES FAMILY OF 8 HOMELESS

PETERS CREEK: 1968 ended in tragedy for the Elgie G. Bedford family when fire completely destroyed their log home at Mile 23 on December 31st.

The fire broke out at approximately 11:30am. No one was at home at this time, Mr. Bedford being at work and Mrs. Bedford having taken the children to visit a friend in the area.

The fire was reported by a neighbor, and the Chugiak Volunteer Fire Company responded, with Eagle River Fire Company coming along under the mutual aid agreement.

The log building was completely gutted, but the firemen were able to keep the fire from spreading to a partially completed frame building which Bedford was constructing nearby.

The Bedfords and their six children are presently staying with the Clarence Halverson family in Peters Creek. They are planning to move into

LOCAL RADIO OPERATORS JOIN "REACT"

CHUGIAK: A group of citizen band radio operators from the Greater Chugiak Area have joined forces with the C.B. radio operators from Anchorage, and are looking forward to bringing in the operators from Palmer to form a radio network which will extend from the Matanuska Valley to Anchorage.

The aim of this organization is to be in a position to render aid to the public experiencing highway trouble, or in any emergency, such as a flood or earthquake when telephone service may not be available.

The local organization is known as "Chugiak REACT" which is affiliated with the national organization which takes this name from Radio Emergency Assistant Citizens Team. This organization is active in Canada also.

Chugiak REACT will be monitor Channels 9 and 11 on a 24 hours a day basis.

The Anchorage area suffered much damage, but locally the damage was confined to blown down stove pipes, frozen water, and huge drifts of snow blocking driveways and back roads.

STATE TROOPER GIVES CITATION

EAGLE RIVER: A citation for failing to keep a safe distance was given by the Alaska State Troopers to one of the drivers involved in a two car collision at mile 15 on December 31st.

The accident, which took place at 1:30pm, occurred when Eugene O. Ammann, of the Eagle River Trailer Court slowed his 1963 GMC pick-up truck to make a left turn. ANCHORAGE: On December 24th, several of the Head Start students from the Greater Chugiak Area joined the Anchorage children on a visit to Santa Claus.

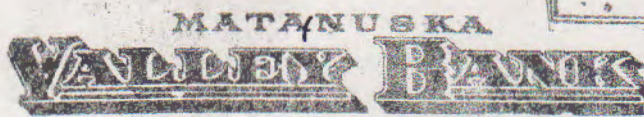
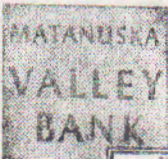
Santa was located in the R.C.A. building in Anchorage, and gave each child a new pair of shoes, new boots, knee socks, stocking caps, tights and candy.

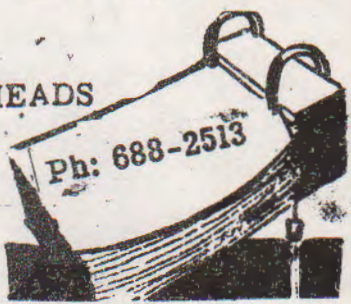

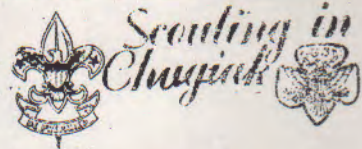

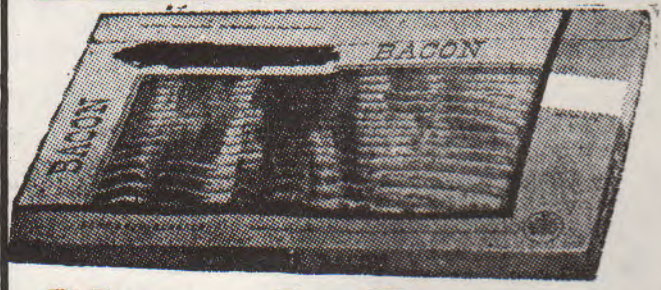
