## TWO LOCAL MEN FOR MEA BOARD

### DISCIPLINE IN LOCAL SCHOOLS TO BE SUBJECT OF MEETING

**BIRCHWOOD:** A group which calls itself "The Steering Committee for better classroom atmosphere" has sent letters to all families in the Greater Chugiak Area, inviting them to attend a public meeting at the Birchwood Elementary School on Thursday, April 17th at 7:00pm.

According to the letter the purpose of the meeting is to discuss behavior patterns of the students at the local schools and on the school buses and to determine the responsibility of the parents and the teachers on matters of discipline.

Upon questioning school officials, it was learned that a meeting had been scheduled for that night, but for a different reason than that outlined in the letter.

According to Mr. Jack McCarl, acting Principal at Birchwood Elementary School there was an orientation meeting scheduled for parents of students who will be entering the seventh grade next year to acquaint them with the Chugiak Junior High program. He said that he had not been aware that the steering committee had sent the letters calling a public meeting until a copy was brought to his attention by a parent who had received one in the mail.

The existence of a communication gap becomes evident upon interviewing Mrs. J. Duane Williams, a member of the "Steering Committee" who claimed that she had talked with school officials about the meeting prior to sending out the letters, and had received their approval of the meeting.

Mrs. Williams said that she and the other members of the committee were concerned with the lack of interest some teachers appear in maintaining discipline in the schools; and while she admitted that the opening statement of the letter that teachers had been told to carry side-arms to protect them from the students referred to an item she had heard about a school in the Chicago area and not local schools,

### OPAG TO LEASE COMMUNITY HALL

**OLD CHUGIAK:** Plans to lease the old Chugiak Community Club meeting hall were announced today by Mrs. Pat Sherman, spokesman for the local branch of OPAG Older Persons Action Group.

According to Mrs. Sherman, OPAG is negotiating a ten year lease with the Chugiak Benefit Association for the building which is located at Mile 20 1/2 Glenn Highway.

In return for the use of the hall, OPAG will make certain specified repairs to the building and improvements to the grounds.

Mrs. Sherman said that the building will serve as an office for the OPAG Community Aides, and also as a meeting hall, lounge and recreation center for OPAG.

She mentioned plans to drill a well, and to clear a picnic area on the grounds.

The building, which was originally built as a meeting house for the Chugiak Community Club back in the 1940's has been used in recent years by other organizations such as the VFW, the Chugiak Volunteer Fire Company and the Chugiak Obedience Training Club.

Our slogan from now on is, "Watch us Grow!"

We will move into the old Chugiak Community Hall at Mile 20 1/2 as soon as possible. For the present, the building will be furnished as a combined office, and lounge for the elderly.

Great plans are underway to improve and provide facilities for future use. We hope to clear a part of the grounds to provide space for picnic

area, a meeting place, hobby and craft shop. We realize that these plans will take time to materialize, but we are thinking positive, and planning for your future.

One of our desires is to have a building where older persons may make and sell articles in order to supplement their small pensions.

The Center is for all persons who are fifty-five or older and live in the area from Eagle River to Eklutna.

We have been able to grow because this is a "We" program. The people in the community have been cooperative each time we had to ask for help. We feel that this is a great beginning for everyone.

Each person in the Greater Chugiak Area will some day reach the magic age of fifty five, and be eligible to take advantage of the benefits provided by this program. Some day this will be your center, so we say -- "Congratulations to everyone!"

Now, back down to earth. An important meeting will be held April 28th at 7:30pm in the Salvation Army building at 8th and Barrow.

The purpose of the meeting is to elect all of the officers to serve the Federal Community Credit Union.

Frank Eaton, our hard working boss, headed up this very necessary union which has been sponsored all the way by the Older Persons Action Group.

Mr. Eaton deserves bouquets for his untiring efforts in investigating or pushing bills that are beneficial to all elderly persons in Alaska.

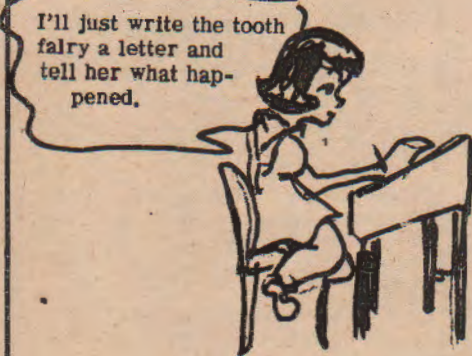

Each of the twelve women's clubs that make up the Federation nominates a candidate and the winner is selected from one of these.

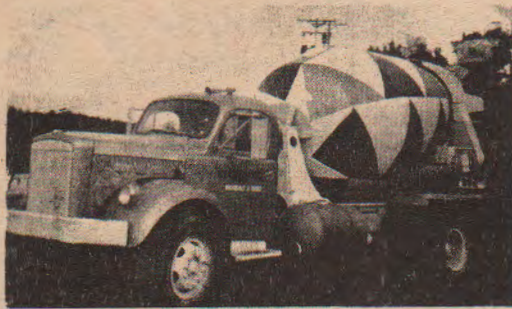
