EAGLE RIVER: As of April 1st, the Chugiak Community Center, which has been located in the basement of the Central Methodist Church is moving into new quarters.

The Center will occupy the space in the Earber Shop Building in Eagle River, formerly the location of the "Tot Stop".

The Public Health Nurse Miss Ardice Alton will also move her office to this location. The Health Office is presently located in the basement of the First Baptist Church of Eagle River.

Kathy Walker, Community Aide for the Chugiak Center stated that she hoped that by moving to these new quarters they will be able to bring many more services to the area.

EKLUTNA LAKE STUDENTS START SCHOOL THURS.

CHUGIAK: Children of families living on Eklutna Lake Road will start receiving school bus service on Thursday, April 3rd, according to Mr. Eldon King, assistant Principal at Chugiak High.

Two of the students will be attending Chugiak Junior High in the 7th and 8th grades, while the remaining seven will be attending Chugiak Elementary.

A four-wheel drive Carry-all will be used to bus the children, with both the high school and elementary students being picked up at the same time.

Pick-up time on Thursday, April 3rd will be 6:45am starting at the top of the hill. This time will be to determine what is necessary to determine if the permanent schedule can be worked out.

This bussing is the result of a petition which had been circulated by the families of that area asking that the State maintain the road on a year round basis.

The school district can only provide bus service to students living on roads that are kept open at all times.

Pictures will be taken, so get your Sunday smiles all shined up.

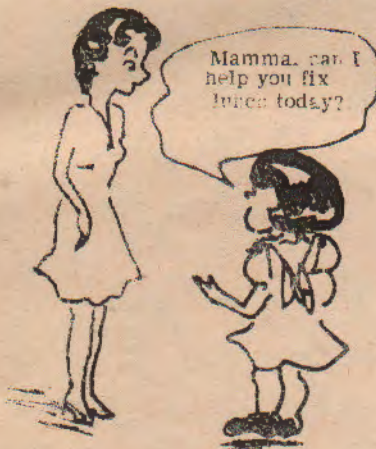

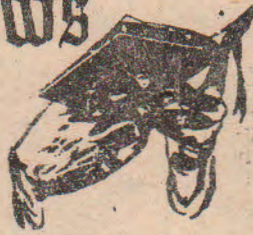
