PETERS CREEK: Two Peters Creek homes were broken into and burglarized last Monday, and both cases are under investigation by the Alaska State Troopers.

Sometime during the day on Monday, Mrs. Kenneth Huling of Foothill Drive returned from shopping to discover that someone had entered her house and had ransacked every room.

Mrs. Huling said that she heard a noise in one of the back rooms when she entered, but at that time thought it might be the cat. She then said that she noticed that the house had been messed up with drawers and closets open and the contents strewn about.

Among the items taken were a cash box containing a large sum of money in old coins and unusual bills. Also missing was a large quantity of 22-caliber ammunition, and several pieces of jewelry.

Mrs. Huling thinks she may have surprised the burglars when she returned, but did not see anyone. She thought they might have been on foot, as she had not seen any vehicle on the road as she returned, and there were no tracks in the yard.

The State Troopers dusted for fingerprints and are investigating possible suspects.

Later that same evening Mrs. Orville Dinwiddie returned to her home at Mile 22 and also discovered the house ransacked. Entry in this case had apparently been gained by removing the screen and climbing through the bathroom window.

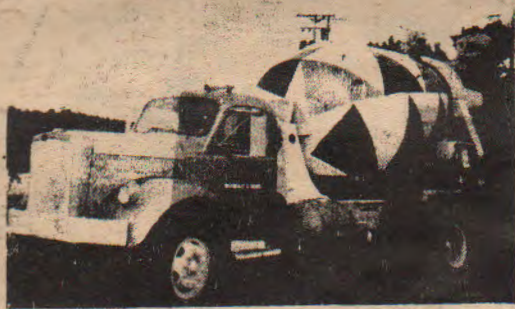

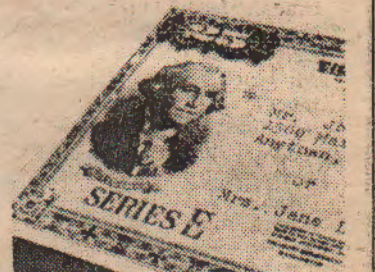

**ARMY WARNS OF HOAX LETTERS**

The U. S. Army has become concerned in recent weeks with a rash of hoax calls throughout the United States to relatives of personnel serving in Vietnam.

The malicious calls relate primarily to reports of death, missing, absence without leave, desertion and so on, and have caused considerable anguish to next of kin who are unaware of Department of the Army notification procedures, an Army spokesman said.

The Army does not use the telephone to make notification of such instances, it was emphasized. Notification is made by a personally delivered message by Army representatives, where identity can be immediately verified; or, by a Western Union telegram which can be verified with the Western Union office from which received; or, by correspondence directly from the Department of the Army. The purpose for notifying the next of kin determines the means used.

Regulations and conditions of the hunt are as follows:

2. Applications for permits are available at the Alaska Department of Fish and Game office, Box 669, Cordova, Alaska 99574. Applications must be postmarked or received by the Alaska Department of Fish and Game by 12 p.m. on Aug. 15, 1969, except that if there are more permits available than applications received, the remaining permits will be issued on a first-come, first serve basis at the Cordova office.

3. A public drawing will be held on Aug. 18, 1969, and successful applicants will be notified by mail.

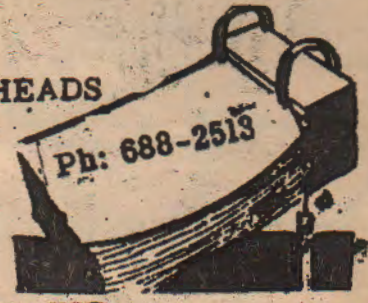

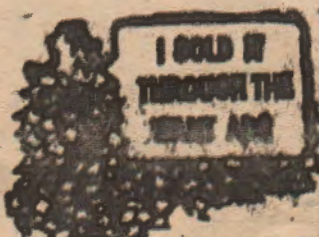
