The hearing concerns an ordinance amending Ordinance No. 53-70, creating Sanitary Sewer Improvement District No. 50 establishing new time payment provisions within that ordinance.

EAGLE RIVER: A program whereby Chugiak High School students may get "On the job training" while working at local businesses will be explained to the Board of Directors of the local Chamber of Commerce at their next regular meeting.

CHUGIAK: A contingent of seven State Troopers has been assigned to cover the Greater Chugiak Area, according to Major Dankworth, of the Anchorage office.

The group consists of one Corporal, six troopers and four vehicles.

They will be assigned to cover the area between Gate 1, at Fort Richardson to the Knik Bridge exclusively on a 24 hour basis.

Major Dankworth stated that on this basis there will never be less than one, and at times as many as three troopers on patrol in the Greater Chugiak Area.

Dankworth said that all of the Troopers are being encouraged to make their homes in the area and three have already done so.

He stated, however, that any calls for a State Trooper are to be routed through the Anchorage office, and not to the Troopers homes.

Anyone wishing to contact a State Trooper is asked to call 272 1561, and one of the local Troopers on duty will be dispatched by radio.

CHS BAND CONCERT THIS SATURDAY

BIRCHWOOD: The Chugiak High School Fall Band Concert will be somewhat different this year according to Mr. Darrel Daley, Band Director.

This year bands from Palmer, Wasilla and other small high school have been invited to Chugiak for a day of clinics and rehearsal sessions.

der the Alaska State Statute 11.60.250, which states that the curfew of any city or village may be extended to include the area within a 20 mile radius of the limits of that city or village.

Section 15-4 of the code of ordinance for the City of Anchorage which concerns the curfew states that any juveniles under age 16, must be off the streets, public roads, vacant lots etc. by 9:30pm Sunday through Thursday and 10:00pm Friday and Saturday until 5:00am on any day. Unless accompanied by a parent or other responsible adult, in case of an emergency, or on a specific errand for their parents.

The curfew is enforced by City police within the City limits and by the Alaska State Troopers outside of the city.

State Troopers from the Chugiak Area patrol have been picking up juveniles who are in violation of the curfew within recent weeks.

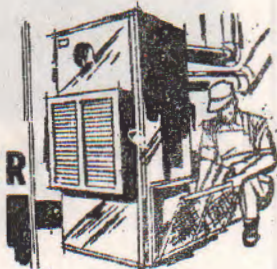

BIRCHWOOD: Last Thursday, students from Mr. Kirk's Social Studies Class at Chugiak High School conducted an information survey to see how the area felt beyond the defeat of the Charter on Tuesday.

A total of 313 students made their choices after studying the alternatives. Also surveyed, were 266 adults.

The survey asked eight questions:

1. "I would like to completely sever connections with the Borough and set up a completely independent political area.
2. "I would like to completely sever connections with the Borough and merge with the Mat Su borough.
3. I would like to keep our existing Borough government as is.
4. I believe in eventual unification in a evolutionary manner but not in the revolutionary manner of a new Charter.
5. I would like the Charter Commission to come up with a new charter that does not have a "Strong Mayor".
6. I would like the Charter Commission to come up with a new charter that does not have at large representation.
7. I would like a charter with neither a strong mayor or at large representation.
8. I hope the Charter Commission keeps the same charter, and concentrates on educating the public as to its values.

A comparison of the answers of the two groups shows very little significant difference other than more adults seemed in

favor of the separation than the students.

The answers were as follows: Question No. 1, Adults 86, students 74, Total 160.

No. 2: Adults 18, Students 10, total 28.

Question No. 3, Adults 79, Students 103, total 182.

No. 4: Adults 43, Students 55, Total, 98.

No. 5: Adults 13, Students 20, total 33.

No. 6: Adults 8, Students 16, total 24.

No. 7: Adults 2, students 14, total 16.

Question No. 8, Adults 12, students 10, total 22.

The high school social studies students and teachers are interested in an education program about these alternatives in local government and are looking for speakers on the subject.

It is felt this could be worked in conjunction with the local PTA's.

The PTA will conduct a Skate Swap at this meeting. Skates to be swapped should be labeled with size, price and name of the owner.

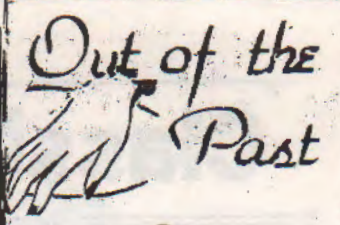

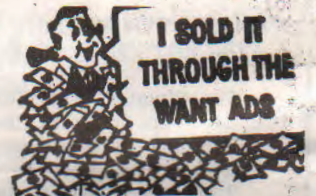
