

## AREA RESIDENTS OPPOSE SNOWMOBILE TRACT

### CHAMBER TO PRESENT AWARDS

**CHUGIAK:** Two awards for outstanding public service will be presented by the local Chamber of Commerce at their annual meeting on December 14th.

These awards, one to an individual and one to an organization are to be an annual presentation, according to Tim Wallace, Chamber President.

A nominating committee of five local residents has been appointed by the Chamber Board to recommend candidates for these awards. In addition to the nominating committee, any resident of the Greater Chugiak Area may submit the name of a person or organization to the Chamber Board.

A panel of three judges to be appointed by the Board will review all nominations and make the final selection.

Deadline for submitting nominations is Monday, November 30th.

Eligibility for either award is based upon an act or acts of public service performed within the Greater Chugiak Area, and benefiting the citizens of that area. These acts may have been performed but are not restricted to the current year.

The award to the individual may be presented to a man, woman or child. The organization may be a club, service group or business.

Anyone wishing to nominate a candidate for either award should accompany their nomination with a letter outlining their reasons for nomination.

All nominations may be mailed to the Chugiak-Eagle River Chamber of Commerce, Box 530, Chugiak, Alaska 99587.

The next regular meeting of the Board will be held on Monday, November 16th, at the Lions Den in the Eagle River Shopping Center.

### BOWLING ALLEY TO OPEN IN DEC.

**EAGLE RIVER:** Mid-December is the current target date for the opening of the Eagle River Bowl, according to Jim King who will be operating the establishment.

King stated that arrangements with the Brunswick Corporation for installation of the equipment are completed, and all that he is waiting for now is approval of the Borough Health Department and the State Alcohol Beverage Control Board for the operation of the restaurant and cocktail lounge.

King explained that he had deleted his original plans to operate a billiard parlor in the area that was originally the "300 Room", at the insistence of the Brunswick Corporation. Brunswick felt, that since the bar facilities were already present, a cocktail lounge should be operated in conjunction with the bowling alley to in-

### MOVIE THEATER TO OPEN HERE

**EAGLE RIVER:** A movie theater with a seating capacity of 300 is scheduled to be opened by January 1st, of 1971, according to Robert Thomas of Eagle River.

Thomas is presently constructing the theater at the corner of Eagle River Road and the Eagle River Loop.

Thomas said that they have overcome the difficulties which forced them to cancel plans to open a theater several years ago, and now are approved to show Walt Disney films as well as movies from several other major studios.

Thomas said that the emphasis will be on family type movies.

Initial plans call for showing movies on Friday nights, Saturday nights and Saturday and Sunday matinees. The Saturday matinee will be a kiddie show, complete with cartoons.

**ANCHORAGE:** Strong opposition by Chugiak Area residents was largely responsible for the defeat of the proposed Snowmobile tract by the GAAB Assembly last Monday evening.

The defeat, may only be a temporary setback for the proposal of the Anchorage Motor Musers, as Assemblyman Wilda Hudson one of the six who voted against the measure, gave notice of reconsideration. Under parliamentary procedures, this means that Mrs. Hudson may ask the issue be brought back for vote at the next regular or special meeting of the Assembly.

Local residents who attended the public hearing last Monday not only cited their one objections to the proposal, but carried petitions from other area residents objecting to it.

Ed Willis, Assemblyman from this area stated that he had received many calls from local residents objecting to the proposal. He stated that it was pointed out to him that the proposal in its present form is too vague, and does not have sufficient detail as to what use the borough land is to be put to. In effect, it would be writing the Motor Musers a blank check.

The land in question, is in the vicinity of and includes Beach Lake. It is in the Birchwood Area, and not in Eagle River as the Anchorage newspapers have been saying.

When and if the matter is again brought before the Assembly, it will not include a public hearing.

Local residents who have been fighting the proposal are now concentrating their fire on Wilda Hudson, who by virtue of her notice of reconsideration is the only member of the Assembly who can again bring the matter up for vote.

A spokesman for a local recreation group who has been opposing the tract urges local residents who also oppose it to personally call Mrs. Hudson and attempt to persuade her to allow the Assembly's vote of Monday night to stand.

The vote was 6 opposed and 4 in favor of the proposal. If Mrs. Hudson changes her vote to "Yes", a tie vote would result.

On November 9, a move to give management of approximately 1400 acres of Birchwood area land to the Anchorage Motor Musher, a snowmobile racing club, was temporarily defeated by a 6 to 4 vote of the Borough Assembly members.

This defeat was the result of the local residents and friends who were concerned enough to let the Assembly know their feelings.

I wish to express my thanks to all of them known and unknown and especially to the petition bearers who collected some 150 signatures in 8 hours time, to the 27 people who called Mr. Willis with their views pro and con, to the letter writers who sent their comments by mail, to the 16 people who actually went and testified on behalf of the neighborhood residents, and special thanks to some of the opposition witnesses for their efforts.

Particularly I wish to express my appreciation to Mr. Willis, area councilman, for his efforts to permit both sides an opportunity to be heard.

However the issue is not dead. A motion was made to reconsider and it will be reopened and refought next Monday.

The only persons permitted to testify will be those who have presented a written declaration to the Head Clerk the Borough by noon, November 11, 1970.
