THREE YOUTHS HURT IN

EAGLE RIVER: Three Eagle River youths were seriously injured when the car in which they were riding left the pavement and struck a pile of recently. downed timber, according to the Alaska State Troopers.

The youngsters were riding in a 1966 Plymouth Station Wagon, driven by Charles D. Fillmore, age 15, of Aurora Street in Eagle River

Also injured was Cynthia A. Also injured was Cynthia A. Spurlock, age 16, of Mile 131/2 Old Glenn Highway and her brother, Joseph Suprlock age 5. Chythia suffered facial lacerations and a fractured neck. Her brother also sustained facial lacerations and a broken hand.

A fourth passenger in the car, James Broach, age 15 was uninjured, according to the Alaska State Troopers.

The injured youngsters were taken to the 5040th Air Force Hospital for treatment.

Citations are pending further investigation by the Alaska State Troopers.



ANCHORAGE: The Game Division of the Alaska Depart-ment of Fish and Game will hold a public meeting at 9am, November 28, at the Pioneers Hall, 612 F Street in Anchorage for the for the purpose of explaining their moose management program.

Ronald J. Somerville, Regional Game Supervisor, said, "Many of the statements made by the public at the recent Fish and Game Board hearing were based on hearsay, misinformation and misunderstand-ings. It is our intention to presant facutal information which will clarify our position." "The staff will present date

on primarily Game Manage-ment Units 13, 14 and 15 and then an open question and an-swer period will be held," Somerville added.

Public testimony will also be encouraged following the presentation by the staff. Som-erville said, "I urge all per-sons interested in our wildlife resources to attend. This meeting may have consider-able bearing on our present and future management programs of moose, particulary cow moose, in Alaska. It is time that Alaskans decided whether or not we are going to manage our moose populations for all the people of the state based upon the most progressive and scientific methods av-allable."

State Department of Education Announces New Adult Courses

Dr. Cliff R. Hartman announced that the Correspondence Study Branch of the Depart-ment of Education is offering this year, for the first time, State correspondence study courses for adults. Three types of programs are currently available.


Adults desiring to earn high school equivalency degrees by examination through the General Educational Development (GED) program may request materials specifically to pre-pare them for the GED examinations. Under the GED program, applicants take a series of two-hour tests covering basic subjects in the Alaska high school curriculum. Upon successful completion, a high school equivalency degree is granted by the State.



High school credit is given for correspondence study courses When the adult has completed the courses and earned the cre dits he needs, he will receive a high school diploma from the State of Alaska.

Correspondence study courses are also available to adults who wish to develop a specific skill. Many Alaskans had no school to attend when they were children and now wish to learn basic reading, speaking, and writing skills. Correspondence study courses are available in various subject areas.
