

CHAMBER TO OPPOSE ANNEXATION

ED WILLIS AND LADIES CLUB GET AWARDS

EAGLE RIVER: The winners of the first annual "Bearfoot" awards for outstanding public service, were announced at the annual meeting of the local Chamber of Commerce last Monday night in the Lions Den of the Eagle River Shopping Center.

The Citizen's Award, for outstanding public service by an individual, went to Edward C. Willis, of Eagle River.

Willis, who is the Borough Assemblyman for this area was recognized for his long record of community service both in and out of public office.

The Organizational Award, went to the Chugiak Ladies Club. That organization was selected on the basis of the many programs of community betterment which they have sponsored, particularly in the fields of recreation and education.

A certificate and a ceramic plaque was presented to each winner. The plaques, which were imprinted with the pawprint of a grizzly bear, give the informal name of "Bearfoot" award to the trophies.

Other candidates for the awards were all presented certificates of recognition.

The reasons to be given for the objection is the fact that the City could not conceivably be able to provide municipal services to that area if it should be needed.

The Chamber also voted to go on record as opposing any annexation of an area without the vote of the areas residents. Copies of this letter is to be sent to all members of the Alaska State Legislature.

LOCAL MAN SAYS ANNEXATION IS UNCONSTITUTIONAL

ANCHORAGE: Jesse D. Nichols, of Eagle River, was one of many who presented written briefs against the proposed annexation by the City of Anchorage at the recent public hearings of the Boundary Commission.

Nichols, who is a 20 year resident of Alaska gave as his reasons for objection that the annexation of a given area without offering the residents an opportunity to vote on it, was contrary to the United States Constitution.

He quoted sections of the constitution which he interpreted to make such an act of annexation as unconstitutional, and compared the actions of the City of Anchorage, to Communism, Hitlerism and gangsterism.

He also indicated that he felt the upcoming Alaska State Constitutional Convention would take away the power of the Boundary Commission to permit annexation of citizens and property without a vote of the people concerned.

TIPS FOR MILADY

How To Wrap Round Package

To wrap a round package, place the package on the paper and cut so that there is an inch overlap on the side. Fix neatly with tape. Leave enough paper at both ends to fold over and meet in the center of the cylinder. Pleat these ends neatly toward the center making firm creases. Cut two circles of paper to fit the ends of the cylinder and paste them over the pleats.

A round package or object can also be wrapped in several layers of tissue paper with overlap fixed with tape, and two or three inches of paper at each end. Tie the end overlaps firmly with ribbon or yarn. Cut rosette like ends that result in thin strips to resemble a party "snapper". Decorate each end with a bow.

Accepting Santa for the symbol of commercialization and then including him in the religious scene will help the church get its message across that man's whole life is permeated with religion.

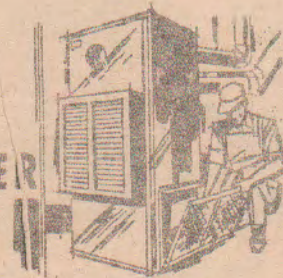
