#### NO INJURIES IN TWO CAR ACCIDENT


EAGLE RIVER: There were no injuries in a two car accident which took place on December 9th, at 5:20pm, at Artillery Road and the Glenn

However, I wouldn't get my hopes up to high. After three girls, the odds that Marmaduke may turn out to be an-other "Marmaduchess".





#### LOCAL MAN SAYS ANNEXATION IS UNCONSTITUTION

ANCHORAGE: Jessa D. Nichois, of Eagle River, was one of many who presented writ-ten briefs against the proposed annexation by the City of Anchorage at the recent public hearings of the Boundary Commission.

Nichols, who is a 20 year resident of Alaska gavesshis reasons for objection that the annexation of a given area without offering the residents an opportunity to vote on it, was contrary to the United States Constitution,

He quoted sections of the constitution which he interpreted to make such an act of annexation as unconstitutional, and compared the actions of the City of Anchorage, to Com-munism, Hitlerism and gangsterism.

He also indicated that he felt the upcoming Alaska State Constitional Convention would take away the power of the Boundary Commission to permit annexation of citizens and property without a vote of the people concerned.
