

BID APPROVED FOR CHS ADDITION

MAN KILLED IN HIGHWAY ACCIDENT

BIRCHWOOD: An Anchorage man died Monday of injuries received in a head-on collision at Mile 20 on the Glenn Highway last Sunday night.

Dead is William Thomas Parker. Parker dies at the 5040th Air Force Hospital on Monday, November 30th.

Injured in the same accident, but in satisfactory condition, are Diff Blair Kimsey, Myrtle J. Kimsey and Michael Kimsey, all of Anchorage.

According to the Alaska State Troopers, the Parker vehicle crossed the center line and hit the Kimsey vehicle straight on.

The first phase calls for an Instructional Materials Center (Library), science labs, and Physical Education facilities.

Construction is scheduled to start in the early spring and to be completed by late summer.

ICY ROADS CAUSE REAR- END SMASHES

CHUGIAK: Icy roads led to a number of rear end collisions, last week according to the Alaska State Troopers.

Mile 12 on the Glenn Highway was the scene of two on the 25th, of November.

In one incident, Dorothy M. Poe, of Eagle River, driving a 1970 Ford Station Wagon was struck in the rear by a 1956 Buick station wagon, driven by Harry H. Hirshik, of Eagle River Road. Damage to the Poe vehicle was estimated at \$75. The Buick was damaged an estimated \$100. Hirshik was cited for basic speed by the Alaska State Troopers.

Also at mile 12 on the 25th, a two car collision between a 1969 Mercury sedan driven by Clarence E. LeDoux Jr., of Eagle River Road, and Franklin D. Hans of Chugiak, driving a 1962 Chevrolet van. The LeDoux vehicle struck the van in the rear. Damage to the van was estimated at \$75, the Mercury, \$100.

LeDoux was cited for basic speed.

On November 27th, at the South Birchwood Loop and new Glenn Highway another two car collision took place.

Wayne Thomas Cronwell, of Peters Creek, driving a 1970 Ford pick-up, was unable to stop on the icy pavement, and slid into the rear of a 1970 Plymouth sedan, driven by Samuel Bough Jr. of Chugiak.

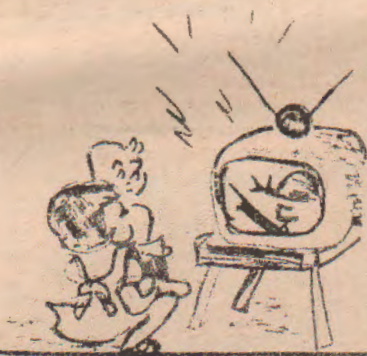

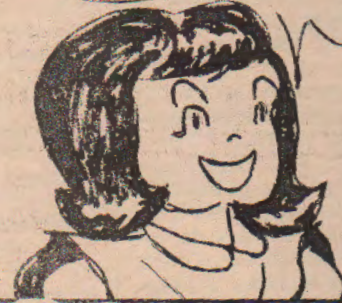

LADIES CLUB TO HOLD MEETING

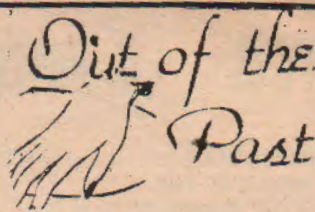

THE COMMUNITY QUESTION BOX

QUESTION: Can the Alaska State Troopers enforce traffic regulations on roads that are not public highways?

ANSWER: At one time the answer to this would have been no. However, several years ago a special ruling by the State District Attorney allows the State Troopers to enforce all state laws on roads that are open to public use, including streets in trailer courts and parking lots.

This means that unlicensed drivers and vehicles are liable to citation even when driving on the unmaintained backroads in the community.

This ruling also applies to snow-machines. According to State law, they are prohibited from driving on the traveled portion of any road which is open to public use. They must except when crossing a road, keep at least three feet off of the traveled portion of any road.

Major Ed Dankworth, of the Alaska State Troopers, has supplied the above answer to your question.
