THE COMMUNITY QUESTION BOX

QUESTION: Can the Alaska State Troopers enforce traffic regulations on roads that are not public highways?

ANSWER: At one time the answer to this would have been no. However, several years ago a spacial ruling by the State District Attorney allows the State Trooprs to enforce all state laws on roads that are open to public use, including streets in trailer courts and parking lots.

This means that unificensed drivers and vehicles are liable to citation even when driving on the unmaintained backroads in the community.

This ruling also applies to snow-machines. According to State law, they are prohibited from driving on the traveled portion of any road which is open to public use. They must except when rossing a road, keep at least three feet off of the traveled portion of any road.

Major Ed Dankworth, of the Alaska State Troopers, has supplied the above answer to your question.


