**MEDICARE RATE
GOES UP**

Beginning Jan. 1, Medicare hospital patients will pay the first \$60 of their hospital bill if they entered the hospital after 1970.

The present \$52 hospital deductible will apply for hospital stays which began in 1970 and carried over into 1971.

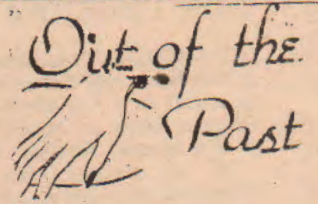
Frank M. Di Paul, manager of the Anchorage Social Security office, explained the increase was necessary because of the long-term rise in hospital costs.

The \$60 deductible applies to the first 60 days as a bed patient in a hospital.

Also, beginning Jan. 1 Medicare patients hospitalized over 60 days and up to 90 days must pay \$15 a day instead of the present \$13 per day.

Medicare patients needing hospitalization beyond the 90 days can draw upon a "lifetime reserve" of an additional 60 days. If this becomes necessary he will need to pay \$30 for each day used instead of the present \$26 per day.

For the first 20 days in an extended care facility the Medicare patient pays nothing. However, beginning Jan. 1, stay in extended care facility more than 20 days through the 100 will cost \$7.50 per day instead of the present \$6.50 per day.

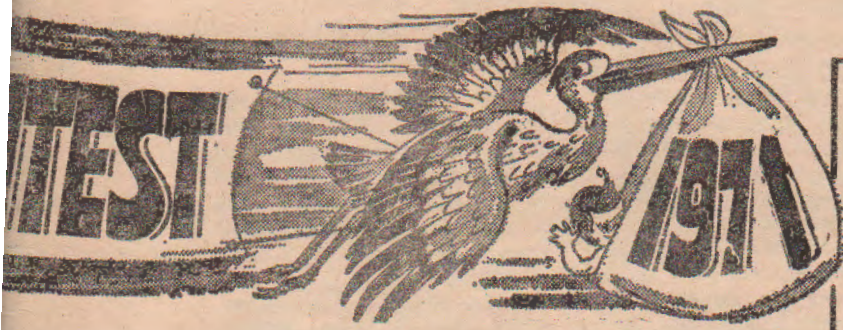

**INVITATIONS TO
INAUGURATION
ARE SENT**

JUNEAU — Invitation: to the formal inauguration of Gov. William A. Egan and Lt. Gov. H.A. "Red" Boucher are going into the mails, the inauguration committee reported Monday.

A committee spokesman said between 54,000 and 55,000 invitations are being mailed for the activities Jan. 8-9.

The Alaska Ferry Wickersham will be docked at Juneau during the activities to provide housing for some of the guests, and the inauguration committee reports that the ferry Taku also may be held over for that purpose.

The festivities begin at 4:30 p.m. Jan. 8 with public open house at the governor's mansion followed by an inaugural dinner at 7 p.m. at the Baranof Hotel, the Elks lodge, the Breakwater Inn and Mike's Place in Douglas. Admission is by ticket.

On Saturday, Jan. 9, an inaugural parade is scheduled for 10 a.m., followed by inaugural pageants at the high school auditorium at noon and 3 p.m. The inaugural ceremony will be at 2 p.m. in the high school gymnasium, with admission by invitation only.

**DON'T BURN
THAT TREE!**

Now that the novelty and pre-holiday charm of your Christmas tree is beginning to wear thin and its needles have started to crumble off at a touch and sprinkle the floor, it is probably time to consider disposing of it.

According to Ed Alger, public nuisance control supervisor for the Anchorage Borough Health Department, it is currently permissible either to take your used Christmas trees to the dump or leave them with your regular trash to be picked up by the city. But no one is allowed to burn trees, Alger stressed.

Several cities across the nation have made provisions to recycle old Christmas trees so that they will continue to be useful, such as collecting them for landfill or shredding them to use for mulch to control erosion.

Alger speculates that Anchorage will follow suit in the future, but no such plans have been made this year.

RCA Alaska Communications, Inc., has filed a request with the Federal Communications Commission for authority to establish and operate a ground station that would make Alaska the first state to utilize satellites for nitrastate communications.

Howard R. Hawkins, resident of RCA Alascom, said the satellite earth station would be located at Lena Point, near Juneau. He said the facility to be built at an estimated cost of \$1.5 million would provide additional circuits for telephone service, two-way television transmission and expanded voice-record services.

The stations would make possible the first live television between the Juneau-Sitka area and other parts of Alaska and O side points.

FT. RICHARDSON: No citation was given to a Chuglak driver following a collision with a moose at Mile 9, Glenn Highway on December 21st.

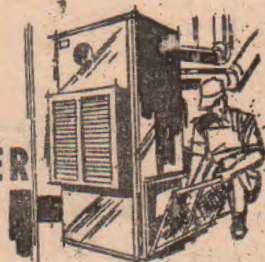
Viola R. Armstead, of Old Chuglak, sustained an estimated \$350 damage to her 1968 Ford sedan in the accident.

I can understand a working wife hiring someone to help out with the housework, but you are "copping out" completely.

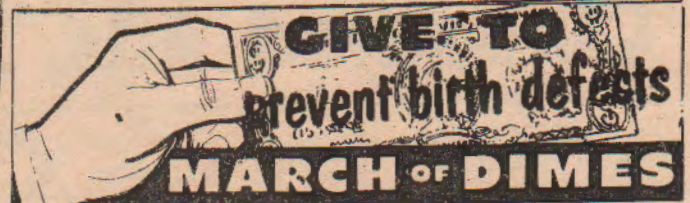
Your darling little Senior Citizen may not be available forever, then what will you do?

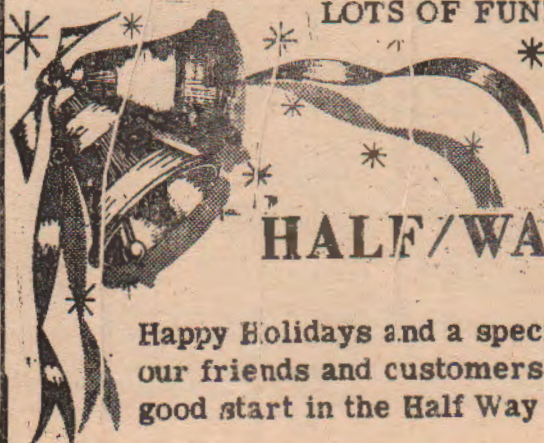
