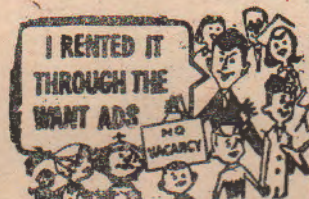

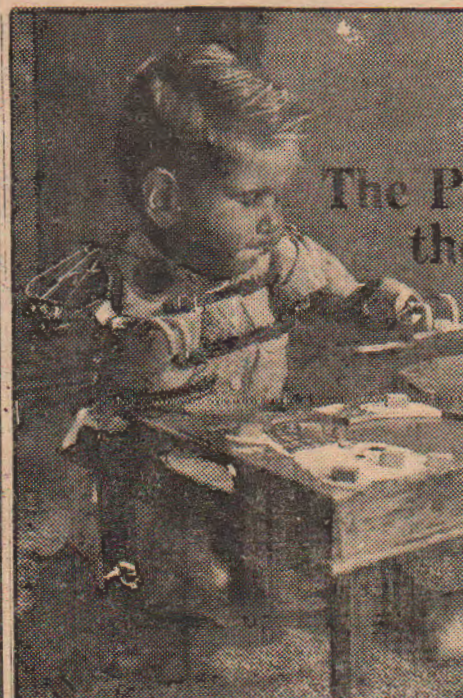

Damage to Mrs. Huling's car was estimated at \$500. Each of the two other cars were damaged an estimated \$1,000.

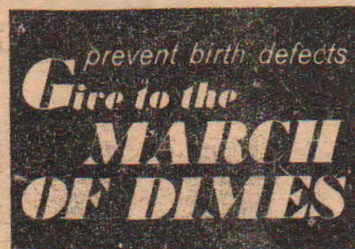
The Alaska State Troopers cited Mrs. Huling for drifting left of the center line.

The VFW Auxiliary will meet on Thursday, January 8th at 8:00pm.

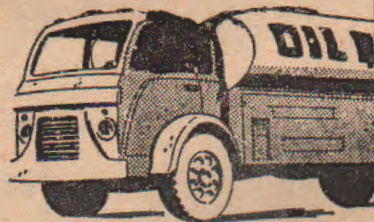
