PETITION ASKS 4th CLASS BORO INFORMATION

CARR'S STORE HELD UP AT GUNPOINT

EAGLE RIVER: An armed robbery took place at Carr's Eagle River Store last Saturwhen two maked men day night after the store had closed for business. At approximately 10:15pm,

as Tom Cloonan, the night manager was putting the day's receipts in the store safe, two men appeared from somewhere in the rear of the store.

Both were wearing snow-mobilers masks, and one was dressed in a snowsuit and the other in blue denim trousers and Jacket,

One of the men was armed with what appeared to be a 38 caliber pistol, He ordered Cloonan into the back office of the store and ordered him to stay there. Cloonanobeyed, and watched the men through a small window which enables anyone in the office to see the interior of the store. When he saw the men leave through the front door of the store he left the office. He discovered that they had taken all the cash f om the safe. A number of checks which were also in the safe had not been taken.

Cloonan summoned the Alaska State Troopers and also called Boyd Burleson, the store manager.

Burleson stated that he feels that the two men must have entered the store unobserved during business hours and remained hidden until the last box boy had left and Cloonan was alone. He said that he had questioned the store employees and that none had seen any strange cars in the parking lot when they left. He believes that the pair must have had an accomplice who was waiting for them with get-away t ansportation. The amount of cash which was stolen was not disclosed, but was a large amount.

Cloonan described the men as both being heavyset Caucasians. He said that they ap peared to be adults and not juveniles. None of the em-ployees remembered seeing anyone resembling either of the men in the store earlier in the day.

for in the petition is received he said, they are planning to call a community meeting and let the people of this area decide what they want to do.





Bud Saylors, administrative assistant to the Borough Chairman explains that all property in the borough was re-appraised this past year, and was assessed on the basis of what the ppraisor considered fair market value.

He stated that there had not

been an apprisal in over five years, and most of the property, particularly undeveloped real estate was appraised much too low.

He stated, however that any-one who is disatisfied with the appraisal of his property may come in to the borough office and talk with one of the appraisors.

No appointment is necessary, and the office is open 5 days a week from 8:00am until 5:00pm.

Saylors admitted that the appraisors are not infallable and it is is possible that in some instance they may have made an error.
