ALL SCHOOL CONCERT THIS THURSDAY

BIRCHWOOD: Music students from the fourth grade level through 12th grade will be performing at Chugiak High School this Thursday, May 21st, in the gymnasium.

This concert will feature an elementary school band, made up of students in grades 4, 5 and 6, from the Birchwood, Chugiak and Eagle River Elementary schools, the Junior and Senior High School beginning band, which consists of students in grades 7 through 10; the Junion/Senior High Intermediate Band, grades 8 through 10, and the High School Symphonic Band, grades 8 through 12.

The latter group will perform five or six "Popular" selections, such as the theme from Hawaii 5-O, Stars and Stripes Trio, Barefootin', and two Herb Alpert numbers.

This program is free to the public, and all interested parents and other local residents are urged to come and both see and hear the wide extend of instrumental education available through the local school system.

All of the 150 young musicians who will be performing are the students of Mr. Darrel Daley, Band Director at Chugiak High School.

CHAMBER BOARD ENDORSES NORTH ROAD

OLD CHUGIAK: The Board of Directors of the local Chamber of Commerce held a luncheon meeting last Friday at Spring Creek Lodge in Old Chugiak.

The Chamber still has at the head of it's list of projects, a street naming program for the area, and improved highway safety.

The seven board members who were present at this meeting also voted unanimously to endorse the building of the North Slope Road, providing that the State would be re-imburshed within a reasonable period of time.

Til Wallace, Chamber President, stated that he wished to correct a misstatement which was published in the Monday issue of the Anchorage Times which quoted the local Chamber as representing the 2,000 voters of this area in the endorsement of the North Road.

Wallace said he made no statement to the Times, and to his knowledge neither did any

CHUGIAK MAN TO SEEK GOVERNORSHIP

CHUGIAK: A Chugiak area resident is presently seeking candidacy for the office of Governor of Alaska.

Ralph M. Anderson, of Old Chugiak, is the candidate for the American Independent Party of Alaska.

Running mate for Anderson for the office of Secretary of State, is William H. Merrill Junior, of Anchorage.

Anderson came to Alaska in 1953, from Racine Wisconsin. He has been a resident of the Chugiak area all of that time, and operates Chugiak Texaco Service at Mile 18.

He is married and the father of 7 children. At present he is Vice-President of Our Redeemer Lutheran Church in Chugiak, and a member of the Board of Directors of the local Chamber of Commerce.

He ran unsuccessfully for the State House of Representatives in 1966 and 1968 on the Republican ticket.

CHUGIAK: The school building program in the Greater Chugiak Area has been washed out for this year, according to Bill Klingler, of the GAAB School District Administration.

The inability of the Borough to sell the bonds in time to accept bids for this current construction season is the reason for the setback. The bonds could not be sold because of snit which had been brought against the Borough by Will Key Jefferson.

Klingler stated that the low bid for the addition to Chugiak High School has been withdrawn. He said that it had been hoped that the contractor would hold the bid open until a bond sale could be arranged, however the contractor did not elect to do this. The contract must now be rebid, and by the time this is done, it will be too late for this year.

Also down the dralu for this year is the replacement for the Chugiak Elementary School, and the addition to Eagle River Elementary School.

The Eagle River school addition was the most critically needed as some of the classes will have to go on double shifts until additional classrooms can be built.

Klingler said that the school administration has asked for a two week extension on accepting bids on the elementary school in hopes that the legislature will vote to purchase the bonds and make the funds available, however with three weeks of the construction season already gone, he has grave doubts that anything could be completed in time to be used this year.

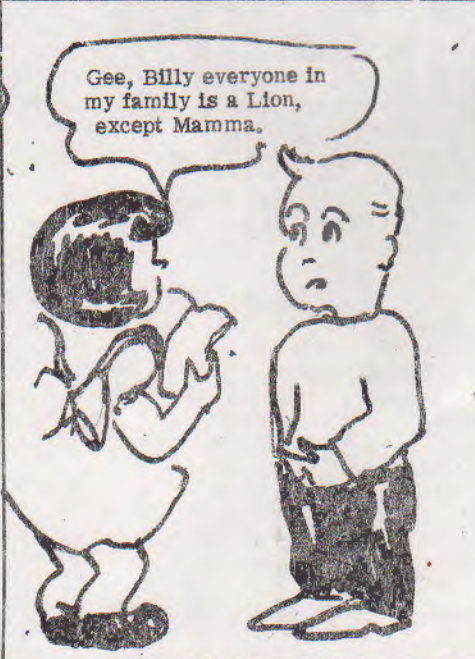

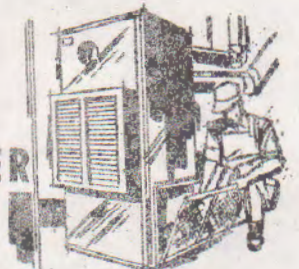

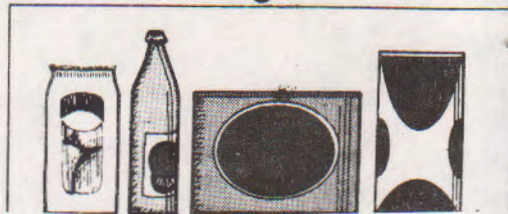
