



HIGHWAY DEPT UNCHANGED ON FENCES

MIRROR LAKE TROOPER QUILTS

PETERS CREEK: Trooper Willard Gove, the Alaska State Trooper who resided at the Mirror Lake Park, has resigned from the force, it was announced this week.

Another member of the Alaska State Troopers will be moving his trailer on to the facilities provided at the lake by the Department of Parks and Recreation.

This will be Trooper William Farber. Trooper Farber is married and the father of twin boys, aged nine months.

As in the case of Trooper Gove, Trooper Farber will be working out of the Anchorage office, and will not be assigned specifically to cover the Greater Chugiak Area.

The Department of Parks and Recreation provides facilities for a State Trooper to live at the park in order to have a resident caretaker on the premises to discourage vandalism.

EAGLE RIVER: Hopes that the Department of Highways might re-consider their stand on opening the fenced ends of the old Glenn Highway died on Monday night.

Charles Matlock, District Engineer for the Department of Highways, who with members of his staff met with the Board of Directors of the local Chamber of Commerce made it very evident that with the exception of improving the lighting at intersections and minor modifications at the Artillery Road turn-off, no changes could be expected.

Board members, along with a number of interested local residents who attended the meeting questioned Matlock on various aspects of the new highway.

Proposed plans for relocation of a portion of the Eagle River Road, and the extension which is proposed from Peters Creek to Eklutna were shown on charts.

It was asked whether the old Glenn Highway, where it had been fenced off at Peters Creek could not be tied into the new highway by making it a ninety degree intersection with a stop sign, just like the intersections of Birchwood

Loop and at Eagle River. It was admitted that this could be done with safety, but that since the new section from Peters Creek to Eklutna was scheduled to go to contract by 1972, it would not pay to make this modification as it would very likely have to be changed at that time.

It was also asked if it would be possible to open a walkway through the fence at the North end of the old Glenn Highway so children on bicycles or on foot could pass from one part of the community to the other without having to walk or ride along the long and dangerous stretch of road from North Birchwood Loop to Peters Creek over the new bridge.

It was explained that since fences were a Federal Regulation on Federal Aid Highways, only the Secretary of Transportation could authorize any breach in the fence.

It was then asked if the Secretary of Transportation had authorized the breach in the fence and double gate which had been put in at approximately mile 20 when a baby moose had become trapped between the fences on the new highway.

Matlock admitted that no authorization had been obtained, but the Highway Department had made the breach at their own discretion, as it appeared that the moose might create a traffic hazard. They were also asked if it

LOCAL FUNDS AGAIN NEEDED FOR LIFEGUARD

CHUGIAK: The Chugiak Ladies Club will this year again be contacting local clubs and service organizations asking for pledges to pay for the services of a lifeguard at Mirror Lake.

The Ladies Club agreed to do this when it was learned from Mr. Ted Smith of the Anchorage office of the Department of Parks and Organizations that their request for an appropriation of funds to hire a full time lifeguard at Mirror Lake had been turned down by the legislature during their recent session.

Last summer local organizations, spearheaded by the Chugiak Ladies Club, raised sufficient funds to pay for a lifeguard for weekends during the month of August. There were sufficient funds available to pay the lifeguard for the Memorial Day weekend, and for the four weekends in June, but as of July 1st, these funds will have been used up, and additional pledges must be forthcoming in order to be able to keep the lifeguard for the remainder of the summer.

TROOPERS KEEP RECORD OF DRIVING HABITS

EAGLE RIVER: A spokesman for the Chugiak Security Patrol reported several incidences of reckless and dangerous driving in the vicinity of the Eagle River Shopping Center.

He stated that several youths have been using the parking lot as a drag strip, and have been pulling out onto the highway at excessive speed, disregarding the right of way of oncoming vehicles and displaying other dangerous driving habits.

He said that the license numbers of these cars have been noted and turned over to the Alaska State Troopers.

The State Troopers maintain a list of the numbers of drivers who habitually practice dangerous driving habits, and if at any time one is involved in an accident which results in a death, they stand in danger of being charged with negligent homicide, according to the Security Patrolman.

The Patrolman also stated that any citizen may report a person who is driving in a manner that they deem dangerous. If they can identify the driver, and record the license number of the car, the State Troopers will put this information on record.

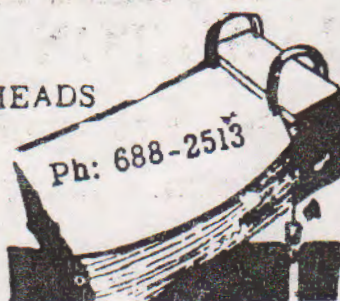

BIG CABBAGE CONTEST STARTS

CHUGIAK: Youngsters aged 7 through 12 in the Greater Chugiak Area are reminded to pick up their free cabbage plants if they plan on entering the Big Cabbage Contest this year.

H&H Nursery Supply of Birchwood and Eagle River is conducting this contest for the second year in a row.

This year prizes will be awarded in two separate age groups. These are 7 to 9 and 10 through 12.

Duplicate prizes will be awarded in each group. Prizes are; 1st place \$5.00 cash, 2nd place \$4.00, 3rd place \$3.00, 4th place \$2.00 and 5th place, \$1.00.

Each participant will be given two OS cabbage plants. These are the variety which grow to fifty pounds and over.

A gardening record must be kept of each plant. Youngsters may receive advice but no help from parents.

Judging will be by 4H standards. The date of the judging will depend on the growing season, but will be soon enough so that youngsters wishing to enter their cabbages in the fair may do so.

Plants may be picked up at the store at Mile 15, Old Glenn Highway, as well as at the Birchwood greenhouses.

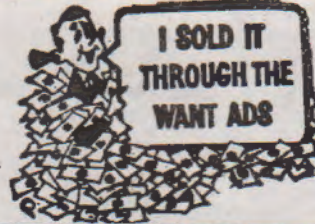

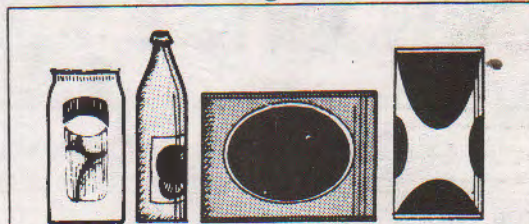

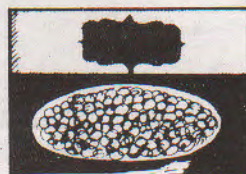
