

# YOUTH HURT IN CYCLE WRECK

## PETERS CREEK HOME DAMAGED BY FIRE

**PETERS CREEK:** The Chugiak Volunteer Fire Company saved a Peters Creek house from destruction by fire last Thursday morning, and limited the damage to two rooms.

A passerby noticed the smoke at around 2:10am, and turned in the call.

Upon responding, the Fire Company found the Ted Eakes residence in Peters Creek on fire. The building was tightly closed and it appeared the fire had been smoldering inside for quite some time.

The fire was brought under control, and while smoke and water damage was throughout the building, only two rooms were gutted.

The owner was not at home at the time, having left the day before to work on one of the oil platforms. It is not known at this time whether or not the building was covered by insurance.

The cause of the fire was suspected to be electrical in origin.

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**EAGLE RIVER:** A FireLake youth was seriously injured when he was thrown from his motorcycle at mile 14 3/4 on the Old Glenn Highway last Friday.

Mark Miller, age 16, was attempting to pass several cars which were proceeding ahead of him. According to the Alaska State Troopers, the fender of his cycle caught on the bumper of a 1965 Dodge which was being towed by another car driven by J.C. Austin, of Eagle River. The Austin vehicle had just started to turn into the Rangeview Service Station at that moment.

The youth was thrown from his cycle and crashed into a delivery van which was parked in the service station lot.

He was taken to Providence Hospital by the Eagle River Volunteer Fire Company Ambulance. The exact nature of his injuries were not revealed at this time, but it was understood that he did not regain consciousness for several days, and underwent surgery Tuesday morning.

According to the Alaska State Troopers, no citations were given.

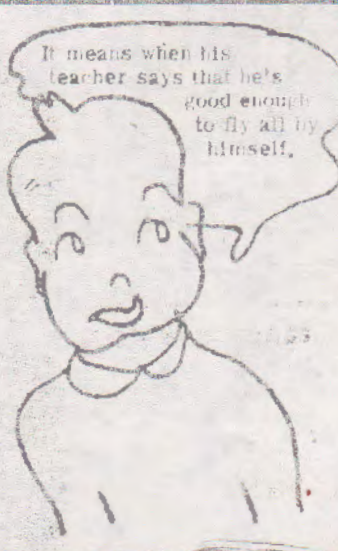

Chilligan told the ambulance attendants that he had sustained a severe blow on the head several days earlier. He had not received any medical attention for that injury.

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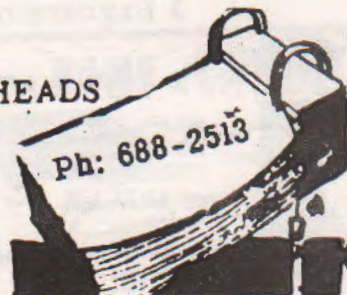

If you wish to vote in the primary election you must be registered on or before August 11th.

Mrs. Hansen, State Election Supervisor, emphasized "The mere fact people have voted here for 20 years doesn't make them registered. They must complete the registration form.

Mrs. Hansen also said registration cards that are mailed to voters after they register are not required when voting, since the names of qualified voters will be on precinct rolls at the polling places.

Some persons have misplaced or thrown away these cards when receiving them in the mail, she said, and are under the mistaken impression they cannot vote without the cards.

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## RCA GRANTED AUTHORITY

RCA Alaska Communications, Inc. has announced that it has been granted Federal Communications Commission authority to own, operate, and maintain the microwave system which links the city of Anchorage and the new Bartlett communications satellite earth station at Talkeetna, Alaska.

The new million dollar microwave system is expected to be operational on June 30 to coincide with the opening of the Bartlett earth station.

Howard R. Hawkins, RCA Alascorp president, said the FCC decision authorizing the Talkeetna microwave system to RCA Alascorp is a major step in RCA's overall program to expand Alaskan telecommunications facilities and improve services.

The new system includes the terminal station in Anchorage, repeater stations at Twelve-Mile and Scotty Lake, and the terminal station at Talkeetna.

Initially, the microwave system will provide three broadband channels in each direction for television, telephone, and control use. The telephone channels (132) will be used for telegraph and data as well as telephone service.

A new VFW Post was recently established in Talkeetna. Henry Katkus of Wasilla, Commander, Department of Alaska, has announced.

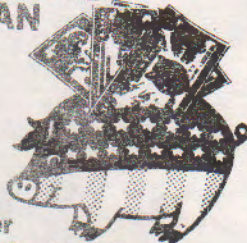

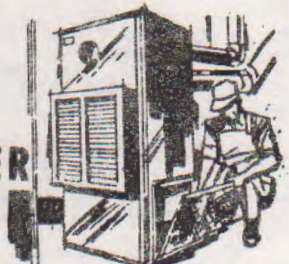

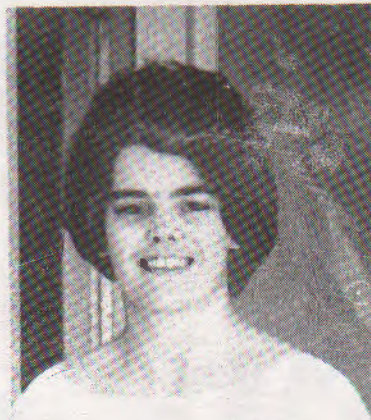

The clinic is located in the Health Center in the former Miss Alaskan building in Eagle River.

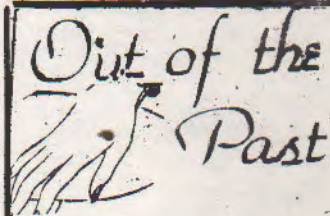
