SECURITY PATROLMAN NABS BURGLARY SUSPECT

EAGLE RIVER: A piece of de-termined dective work by the Chugiak Security Patrol resulted in the arrest of a man suspected of burglarizing the traller home of an Eagle River resident, and the recovery of all the items stolen.

EAGLE RIVER POST OFFICE VANDALIZED

EAGLE RIVER: Vandals entered the lobby of the Eagle River Post office and broke the glass in ten or twelve of the mailboxes and removed the mail from them.

They then apparently took the same rock which they had used to smash the boxes and hurled it through the plate glass window in the front of the post office lobby.

The break-in took place at approximately 4:00am in the morning. A witness report-ed having seen two boys aged 15 to 17 fleeing the vicinity of the Post Office at that time, carrying what appeared to be pieces of mail.

CHUGIAK: Nominations are now open for the Board of Sup-ervisors for the Chugiak Fire Service Area.


All three seats are open, but this time candidates wil run separately for respectively, a one year term, a two year term and a three year term. With "staggering" estab-





PARCEL POST RATES TO GO UP

EAGLE RIVER: An increase in postage on parcel post wil. go into effect November 14, Officer in Charge, James Jensen, at the Eagle River Post Office said today.

The increase of 15.4 percent was authorized by the Interstate Commerce Commission July 16, but is being delayed by the Post Office Department as an encouragement for the early mailing of holiday gifts.


Officer in Charge Jensen said Postmaster General Wilton M. Blunt "hopes to provice an incentive for families and for friends with servicemen overseas to use the low-cost military mail service so their gifts will arrive before December 25."

To ensure delivery by surface mail of parcels to servicemen overseas, the parcels should be mailed by November 7. The rate increwse effective November 14 will apply to all parcels.

Also effective the same date will be a 6 percent increase in the postage rate on catalogs. The two increases are expected to yeild about \$123 million in additional revenue, enough to have these fourthclass mail services gay their full costs as required by law.


