



# LOCAL ELECTION RETURNS

CHUGIAK: A total of 1594 voters went to the polls and cast their votes in the Greater Chugiak Area.

Total vote in Precinct No. 147, Eagle River Valley, was 331, in precinct No. 148, Eagle River Precinct, the total vote was 459. In the Chugiak Precinct, Precinct No. 149, total vote was 295. In the Birchwood Precinct, No. 150, total vote was 343. In Peters Creek, precinct No. 151, the total vote was 166.

This election, because of the unusually long ballot, the Knik Arm Courier will not be able to follow the customary practice of publishing the exact returns of each local precinct. We will instead show the total number of votes each candidate received from all five of the local precincts. A record of the tally of each precinct will be kept at the Courier office for those who wish to know the individual figures.

## SECURITY PATROLMAN NABS BURGLARY SUSPECT

EAGLE RIVER: A piece of determined detective work by the Chugiak Security Patrol resulted in the arrest of a man suspected of burglarizing the trailer home of an Eagle River resident, and the recovery of all the items stolen.

Entry to the trailer was gained by removing the glass and screen of a back window of the trailer. A number of items, including several guns and a pair of binoculars were taken.

The owner of the trailer was able to describe a man who he had seen earlier in the evening loitering near his home. Armed with this description, and fingerprints which he had found at the scene, the Chugiak Security Patrol alerted the Anchorage City Police,

## EAGLE RIVER POST OFFICE VANDALIZED

EAGLE RIVER: Vandals entered the lobby of the Eagle River Post office and broke the glass in ten or twelve of the mailboxes and removed the mail from them.

They then apparently took the same rock which they had used to smash the boxes and hurled it through the plate glass window in the front of the post office lobby.

The break-in took place at approximately 4:00am in the morning. A witness reported having seen two boys aged 15 to 17 fleeing the vicinity of the Post Office at that time, carrying what appeared to be pieces of mail.

The Postal Inspector has the case under investigation, and fingerprints found at the scene

the Alaska State Troopers, and the Palmer Police.

They subsequently learned that later that evening a man answering to that description had been arrested in an Anchorage bar for being drunk and brandishing a gun. They were told the man had been released on bail, but the gun had been confiscated. It turned out to be one of the weapons which had been taken from the trailer.

The Security Patrolman said he continued his investigation, which in time took him to an Anchorage pawn shop, where he surprised the suspect in the act of trying to pawn the binoculars which had been taken from the trailer. He placed the man under arrest, and under questioning, he led him to his car where the remainder of the stolen items were located.

The suspect, who was turned over to the Alaska State Troopers, is known both as Joseph Brunner and sometimes as Hans Fritzner. He was reportedly at one time a member of the German Luftwaffe, and also served in the Canadian and the U.S. Armed Forces. He at one time or another, has been a citizen of each of these countries.

Dick Smerdon, head of the Chugiak Security Patrol stated that the success of the investigation was due in large part to the cooperation of the Alaska State Troopers and the Anchorage Police Department. He asked that Trooper Petty of the Alaska State Troopers, Officer Casto and Investigator Bob Grey of the Anchorage Police be commended for their assistance.

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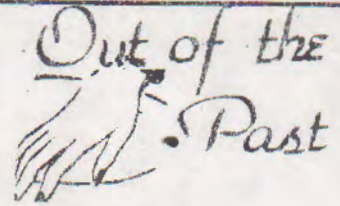
**TWO NYC JOBS OPEN WITH LOCAL HEAD START**

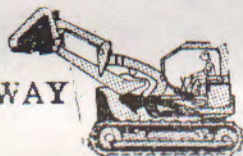

THIS YEAR**

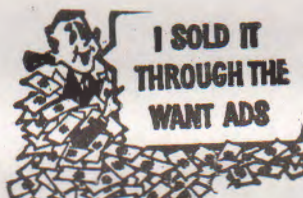

## ANTI-UNIFICATION MOVE IS GROWING HERE

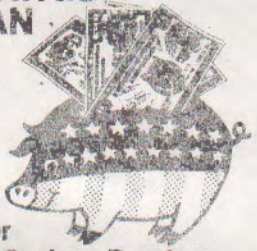

One method of getting these messages across will be by erecting billboards at strategic locations throughout the community.

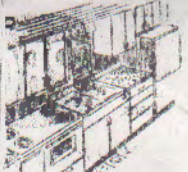

To ensure delivery by surface mail of parcels to servicemen overseas, the parcels should be mailed by November 7. The rate increase effective November 14 will apply to all parcels.

Also effective the same date will be a 6 percent increase in the postage rate on catalogs. The two increases are expected to yield about \$123 million in additional revenue.

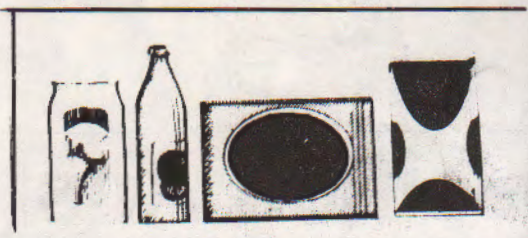
