## EAGLE RIVER MAY BE PRISON SITE

**EAGLE RIVER:** The Eagle River area may be the location of a State Penitentiary, according to Dave Webb, Supervisor for the State Department of Correction, Anchorage office.

Eagle River is one of two locations being considered in the immediate Anchorage area, Webb said.

The survey to determine the best location is being made under a Federal Planning grant. Funds for the construction of the institution were made available by the last legislature.

The local site under consideration is a 216 acre tract, on the South side of the Eagle River bridge, adjacent to the Eagle River Campground.

When completed, the institution will be a medium security prison for housing sentenced prisoners. Total capacity will be 120 inmates.

Webb said the survey should be completed in about two months, with construction to start in June of 1971.

The other site under consideration is located in Anchorage near the Alaska Psychiatric Institute.

Webb said that the Eagle River site appears to be the more desirable of the two.

### CHARGES AGAINST WINDOW BREAKERS DROPPED

**EAGLE RIVER:** Charges against two teen-agers accused of smashing the plate glass window at the public library have been dropped upon the promise that the damage would be paid for.

The breakage took place last Thursday evening under the eyes of a member of the Chugiak Security Patrol, who was attempting to settle an argument between the two.

One of the juveniles, a girl, reportedly smashed her fist through the glass, and then the other youth, a boy, reportedly kicked the rest of the glass out.

The pair were arrested by the Security Patrolman, and held for the Alaska State Troopers.

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### ANCHORAGE FOES OF CHARTER TO SPEAK TO CFPSCB

**OLD CHUGIAK:** Several well-known Anchorage City officials who have voiced their opposition to the proposed Charter, have been invited to speak at the next meeting of the Committee for the Preservation of the Second Class Borough, according to Bill Lowe Committee Chairman.

This meeting will be held on Thursday, September 17th, at 8:00pm at the United Methodist Church of Chugiak at mile 18 Old Glenn Highway.

Lowe stated that a number of signs have been prepared, and will be placed in the rural areas throughout the Borough as well as in the Greater Chugiak Area.

### LOCAL SCHOOL ENROLLMENT TOPS 2,000

**CHUGIAK:** Enrollment at all three local elementary schools, and at Chugiak High School is at an all time high, a fact which surprises almost no one.

Total enrollment for all of the schools, including kindergarten, is 2,315 students. This figure is as of the third day of school, with late enrollments expected to boost the figures even higher.

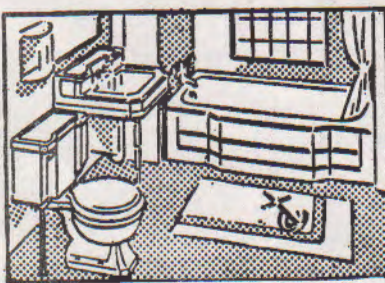

**AUTO COURSE IS OFFERED**

A new course in automotive technology now offered at Anchorage Community College prepares trainees to enter the automotive industry as journeyman mechanics in 18 months.

The course, Auto 20, is held from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Monday through Friday in Building F at the campus, located at 2533 Providence Ave.

Cost of the course is \$1,200 or \$400 for each 24-week semester.

According to Earl M. Bennett, coordinator of the automotive department at the college, the course is the only one in Alaska which prepares a journeyman in 18 months.

Although official registration at the college ended Thursday, late registration is permitted. Instruction begins Sept. 14.

The college offers several other automotive courses including one in tune-ups and engine repair for light planes, pumps, outboard motors, chain saws and other small engines.

The automotive courses are fully approved by the Veterans Administration.

**CHARTER COMMISSION TO MAIL BROCHURE**

The Charter Commission Wednesday approved publication of an informational brochure to acquaint voters in the Anchorage area with the charter.

Mrs. Margaret Schmidt, commission executive secretary, said some 30,000 informational brochures would be printed and distributed through the mail to residents.

Some of the brochures would also be made available to the recently formed Congress of Organizations for Unification, she said.

The brochures will outline major points in the charter, which has undergone extensive redrafting since the second round of public hearings in July.

A similar effort to make information available on the charter was undertaken by the commission prior to the second round of public hearings.

Additionally, some 2,500 copies of the charter will be printed in booklet form for free distribution to the public. These booklet copies of the charter will be available at the Charter Commission office located above the Book Cache on Fifth Ave.

The brochures and pamphlets are distributed solely for the purpose of information and do not represent an attempt to campaign for adoption of the charter, Mrs. Schmidt said.

The charter proposed to unify city and borough governments into a single municipal corporation is set for a vote Oct. 6. The 11-member charter commission, which drafted the document, formally

completed its work and presented the charter to the borough this August.

**HIGH SCHOOL BUS STUDENTS MUST LET DRIVER KNOW BY 15th**

**BIRCHWOOD:** Eldon King, Chuglak High School Principal stated today, that an exact list of all students who plan to be using the school buses for transportation must be known in order to establish permanent schedules.

King said a number of students who later plan to ride the buses are presently either driving their own cars, or are riding with friends.

King said that the bus contractor must know no later than September 15th, just how many students will be needing school bus transportation this winter.

State law provides that 30 days must pass following the certification of the August 25 election before the constitutional amendment for the 18-year old vote becomes effective.

Certification of the state election will be September 10. Wye 30day requirement means that 18-year olds will not be eligible to vote until October 10, Mrs. Nettleton said.

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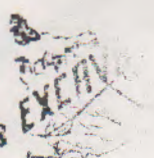

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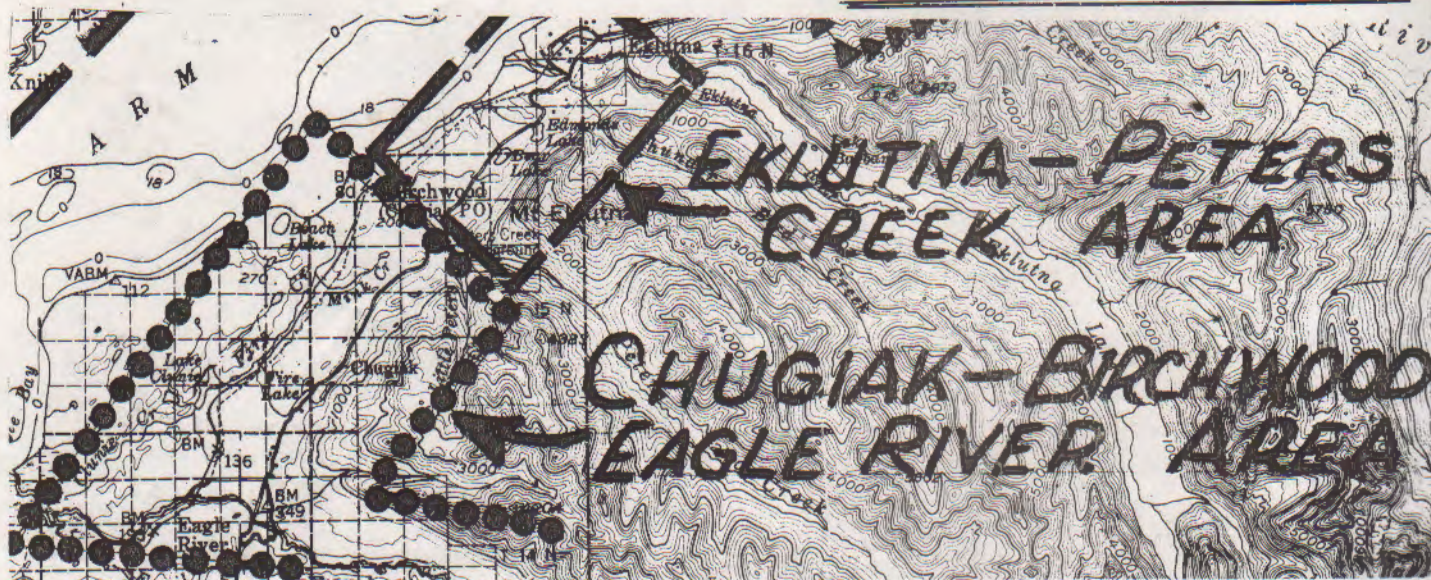

**LOCAL AREA TO BE EFFECTED BY OUTAGES**

**MEA PLANS SERIES OF OUTAGES**

Two three-hour power outages will occur on the MEA system on a Sunday yet to be selected but probably in mid-September, Willard Johnson, general manager, has announced.

On that day, the main 5,000 KVA transformer at the Palmer station is to be replaced with a new 10,000 KVA transformer.

At 10 a.m. on the chosen Sunday, the entire MEA system will be off momentarily. Then service will be restored to the Wasilla-Knik-Big Lake-Willow and the Eagle River-Birchwood-Chugiak areas until 1 p.m.

Power in the Greater Palmer and Eklutna to Peters Creek areas will remain off during this time.

At 1 p.m. the entire MEA system will again go off the line. Then electric service will be restored to the Greater Palmer and the Eklutna to Peters Creek areas until 4 p.m. The Wasilla-Knik-Big Lake - Willow and Eagle River-Birchwood-Chugiak areas will remain off.

At 4 p.m., the entire system will again be off momentarily. Following that, service will be restored to all areas as the crews go through a rapid switching sequence to put the load on the new transformer at Palmer Substation and at Reed Substation at Old Eklutna.

Radio announcements and newspapers will inform the MEA members of the exact date for the outages. Other additional short outages will be necessary, but when the work is completed MEA will have a much better electrical system with two and a half times its present capacity, Johnson said.

On the day of the long outage, members are urged to take several precautions:

Turn off all unnecessary equipment to reduce the system load as much as possible.

Turn off motor-driven equipment as soon as the long outage commences in your area, then turn it on again after power is restored. This will avoid the hazard of damage to motors trying to start under unstable voltage conditions.

Be sure to check your furnaces, either oil or coal fired to make sure they restart satisfactorily when the power comes back on.

Freezers and refrigerators will stay in good condition if you refrain from opening them.

Keep an emergency supply of water available.

Remember to reset clocks.

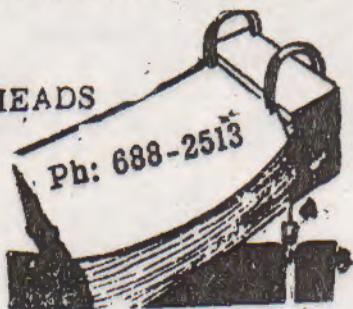

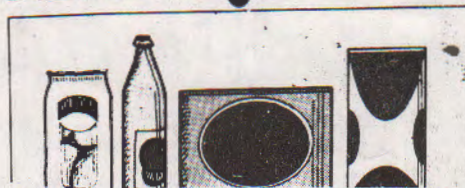
