
The loss suffered by the fire including the building, machinery, inventory and outstanding contracts was estimated 3' at jund \$700,000 by Broadwater.

The nominations should include a brief but detailed resuma telling why this individual or organization was nam-


ed. The awards are made on the basis of outstanding service to this community. The service may have been rendered during the past year, but is not limited to it.
