## ROAD SERVICE FOR EAGLE RIVER DEFEATED

### BIDS OPENED FOR EAGLE RIVER JAIL

ANCHORAGE: Bids were opened last week on the new medium security prison which is to be constructed near Eagle River.

The apparent low bidder is Bachner Northwest of Anchorage, whose basic bid was \$3,889,000.00.

The bids are presently under advisement with the Division of Buildings.

It is expected that land clearing for the project will begin immediately upon the awarding of contract.

The project is scheduled for completion in 1973.

The facility is to be located just south of the Eagle River bridge adjacent to the Eagle River Campground.

EAGLE RIVER: The local Chamber of Commerce will discuss the spearheading of a 25th Anniversary Celebration for the Community of Chugiak at their next regular meeting.

It was pointed out at the last meeting that in 1972 the community will observe 25 years since it was organized in 1947.

CHUGIAK: The hotly contested Road Service proposition was soundly defeated yesterday by a total vote of 317 No, to 135 Yes.

This was the only controversial item in an otherwise "Ho-hum" election in the precincts of the Greater Chugiak Area.

The lack of interest was reflected in the light turnout in all precincts as contrasted with the heavy vote in last August's Charter election.

The number of votes by precinct was as follows: Precinct No. 147, (Eagle River Valley) 261 (388 voted in the Charter election), Precinct No. 148 (Eagle River), 233 (402 voted in the Charter election.)

Precinct No. 149 (Chugiak) the vote was 107 (281 voted in the Charter election), Precinct 150 (Birchwood) 145 (335 voted in the Charter election, Precinct 151, (Peters Creek) 101 (177 voted in the Charter Election.)

## SNOW CAUSES WIDESPREAD OUTAGE

CHUGLIAK: Heavy wet snow, falling on branches and on the MEA power lines caused a widespread outage which effected all of Eagle River, Old Chuglak and parts of Birchwood, Peters Creek and extended as far as Palmer.

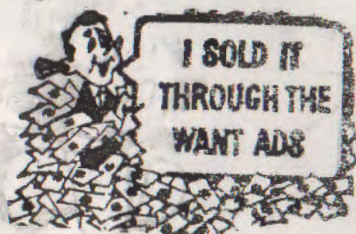
The outage occurred at about 6pm on Monday and it was 3am Tuesday morning before all service was restored.

The problem was further complicated by failure of equipment to function during switching.

MEA crews worked all night energizing one section of lines at a time until all service was restored.

A second outage occurred on Tuesday at 1:20am which lasted for one hour. The same problem was blamed for this outage.

A spokesman for the Matanuska Electric Association stated that MEA hopes to eliminate this kind of problem with the completion of the 5,000 KVA sub-station to be built in Birchwood with funds obtained from a REA loan.

## LOCAL MAN DIES IN WRECK

EAGLE RIVER: A 29 year old Eagle River man was killed last Friday evening when the pick-up truck in which he was riding left the road and overturned.

The accident took place at 11:15pm at Mile 2 on Hiland Road.

The victim was Roger R. Knosalla, of Mile 8 1/2 South Fork Road.

Injured in the accident was Donna Knosalla, the victim's wife and driver of the vehicle and a passenger Gilbert Hoehne. They were taken to Providence Hospital by the Eagle River ambulance where they were treated for shock and minor injuries and released.

Prayer services were held for Knosalla at Forest Lawn Memorial Chapel on Tuesday October 5th, at 10am.

Father Joseph Shirey of St. Andrew's Catholic Church conducted the services.

Knosalla was born on August 13, 1942, at Fargo N.D. He came to Alaska in 1966 and was employed by McGuire Dental Lab as a dental technician.

He is survived by his wife Donna, of Eagle River, his parents Mr. and Mrs. Ray-

mond Knosalla of Fargo, a sister Sharon Knosalla also of Fargo and a sister Mrs. Judy Westfall of Minnesota.

Investigation of the accident is still pending according to the Alaska State Troopers.

## TWO MOOSE CAR WRECKS THIS WEEK

FT. RICHARDSON: The Alaska State Troopers reported two car moose accidents this week.

One occurred on September 28th at 8:20pm at Mile 11 on the Glenn Highway.

David A. Dodeward of Palmer sustained an estimated \$500 damage to his 1967 Plymouth when he struck a moose which darted in front of him.

On October 3rd, at 12:45am, at Mile 12, Walter Lee Elliott of Anchorage also struck a moose, causing an estimated \$350 damage to his 1968 Oldsmobile.

In both instances the moose were killed. No citations were given to either driver.

This is because of the computerized count, whereby all ballots were taken to a central point in Anchorage and counted by computer.

The boroughwide vote on issues showed the sewer bonds defeated with a vote of 4260 No to 4133 Yes. The Roads and Drainage bonds passed with a vote of 5198 Yes to 4917 No. Parks and Recreation also passed 5487 Yes to 4616 No.

The only other bond issue to be defeated was the "Open Space" bonds 5610 No to 5054 Yes. School bonds passed with 6376 Yes to 4297 No.


Re-elected to the School Bd. was Tay Thomas, with a vote of 5,705. Dr. Aron Wolf displaced incumbent Rev. Gay with a 4,307 vote to Gay's 3,380. Latimore tallied 1,968 Bell, 1211, Carmicheal 1,035 and Johnson 818.

There was no report on the results of the write-in for the Chuglak Fire Supervisor, however, since incumbent Paul Swanson was the only one who had indicated that he would serve if elected on a write-in campaign, there is little doubt on the outcome of that issue.

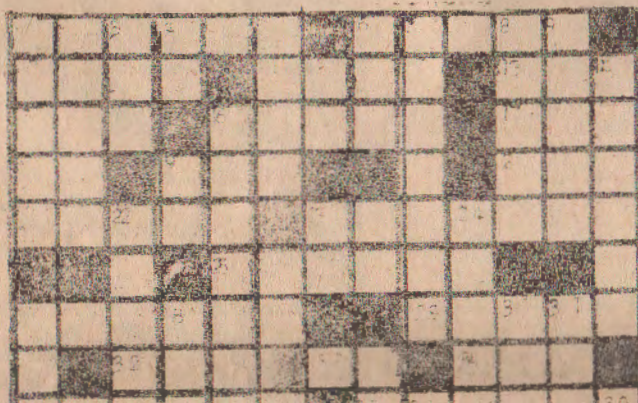

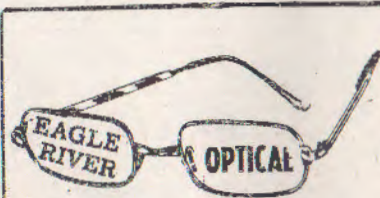
