ROAD SERVICE FOR EAGLE RIVER DEFEATED

BIDS OPENED FOR EAGLE RIVER JAIL

ANCHORAGE: Bids were opened last week on the new medium security prison which is to be contructed near Eagle River.

The apparent low bidder is Bachner Northwest of Anchorage, whose basic bid was \$3,889,000.00.

The bids are presently under advisement with the Division of Buildings.

It is expected that land clearing for the project will betin immediately upon the awarding of contract.

The project is scheduled for completion in 1973,

The facility is to be located just south of the Eagle River bridge adjacent to the Eagle River Campground,

CHUGIAK: The hotly contested Road Service proposition was soundly defeated yester-

day by a total vote of 317 No, to 135 Yes.

This was the only controversial item in an otherwise "Ho-hum" election in the precincts of the Greater Chugiak Area.

The lack of interest was reflected in the light turnout in all precincts as contrasted with the heavy vote in last August's Charter election.

The number of votes by precinct was as follows: Precinct No. 147, (Eagle River Valley) 261 (388 voted in the Charter election). Precinct No. 148 (Eagle River), 233 (402 voted in the charter election.)

Precinct No. 149 (Chuglak) the vote was 107 (281 voted in the Charter election). Precinct 150 (Birchwood) 145 (335 voted in the Charter election. Precinct 151, (Peters Creek) 101 (177 voted in the Charter Election.)
