### MISSING YOUTHS AGAIN REPORTED IN FAIRBANKS

FAIRBANKS: Alaska State Troopers are checking out another report that missing John Stockhausen and Scott Bowerman have been seen in the Fairbanks area.

According to Investigator Roger Benson, of the Alaska State Troopers, the report came from a former Chugiak resident who is now living in Fairbanks.

Benson said that Mike Smith, who at one time lived at Mile 20 Old Glenn Highway had called a friend in Chugiak and told her that Stockhausen and Bowerman were "being held" in Fairbanks. The friend informed the youth's parents of the phone call, and they in turn contacted the Troopers.

The Troopers in Fairbanks have been questioning Smith on the matter, and an invest-

EAGLE RIVER: The new sewer system in Eagle River will be put into operation on November 15th, according to a spokesman for the Greater Anchorage Area Borough.

Barring any unforeseen difficulties, area residents who have turned in their sewage connection permits can expect hook-up to begin on November 10th, with actual sewage treatment to start on the 15th.

Residents of Eagle River living within the area served by the Eagle River Sewage Treatment lagoon may obtain sewer connection permits in the Eagle River area during the next two weeks, according to Calvin West, Borough Public Works Department Official.

Gary Cooper of the Public Works Department will be stationed at the GOAL Center on Artillery Road from November 3 through November 17, to assist persons wishing to apply for permits to connect to the sewer system West said.

Cost of the permit is \$7.00, the property owner will be responsible for placing the necessary sewer line from his building to the nearest lateral line. All persons within sewer lateral districts will be informed by letter of the pending service available to them according to Dennis Gardner, Borough Customer Service Supervisor. Persons who decide to tie into the sewer system will be billed an estimated monthly sewer service charge of \$6.00 per dwelling unit for individual or duplex residences or \$5.00 per dwelling unit for multiple residences containing three or more apartments that are billed on a single bill. Sewer service charges to commercial users will be based on individual water consumption. These charges will pay for the continuing operation and maintenance of the system according to West. The sewer service charge will become effective next January 1, West said. The proposed charges will be submitted to the Public Utility Commission for review. In addition, a person who obtains sewer service will be assessed on the basis of lot size to repay the cost of constructing the sewer treatment lagoon, the collector lines, which will serve the lagoon.

## BID ACCEPTED FOR CHUGIAK FIRE TRUCK

ANCHORAGE: The GAAB Borough Assembly, at their Monday night meeting voted to accept the bid of the Northwest Fire Control Co., of Washington for supplying a new fire truck for the Chugiak Volunteer Fire Company.

The truck will feature American LaFrance equipment on a Ford chassis, and will be equipped with a 1,000 gallon tank with the capacity of pumping 1,000 per minute. Robert Kallenberg, Chairman of the Chugiak Fire District Board of Supervisors, stated that this truck will be paid for out of tax funds and State shared revenue.

He said that there will be no need to increase the mill rate for the fire district to cover the cost of this equipment. In fact, he said that in his opinion he foresees the construction of a two stall fire hall in the Peters Creek area within the next two years without any need to increase the taxes for the district.

# CHAMBER TO RECOMMEND HOW COMMUNITY SHOULD BE ZONED

EAGLE RIVER: Residents of the Greater Chugiak Area will be given an opportunity to state their desires on how they wish the area in which they live to be zoned next Monday night.

The local Chamber of Commerce has been working on a series of maps of the area which indicate suggested zoning of all areas of the community.

These maps are to be displayed at a public meeting on Monday, November 8th, at which time, residents of these areas may examine the maps and indicate if the proposed zoning meets with their approval. Following the meeting these maps will be submitted to the Planning and Zoning Commission.

The Chamber has emphasized that they are not trying to push their opinions off on the residents of the community, and urge those with reasons for wanting a particular type of zoning in their neighborhood to attend the meeting and help revise the maps to reflect their wishes.

It was pointed out that this will be the only opportunity the property owners will have to make any changes in these maps before they are submitted to the Planning and Zoning Commission.

The meeting will be held on Monday, November 8th at the Sportsman's Game Preservation Hall at Mile 15 on the Old Glenn Highway, starting at 8:00pm.

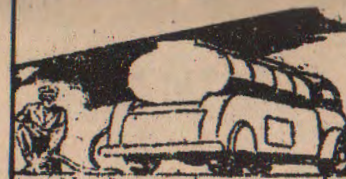

Kirby Co. of Alaska is located in the store formerly occupied by Indian Head Arts and Crafts, next to the Eagle River Pharmacy.

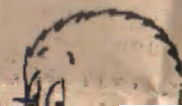
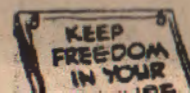
Head of Kirby Co. of Alaska is Mr. "Mack" McKee, who managed Kirby Co. of Alaska in Anchorage.

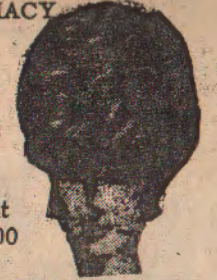

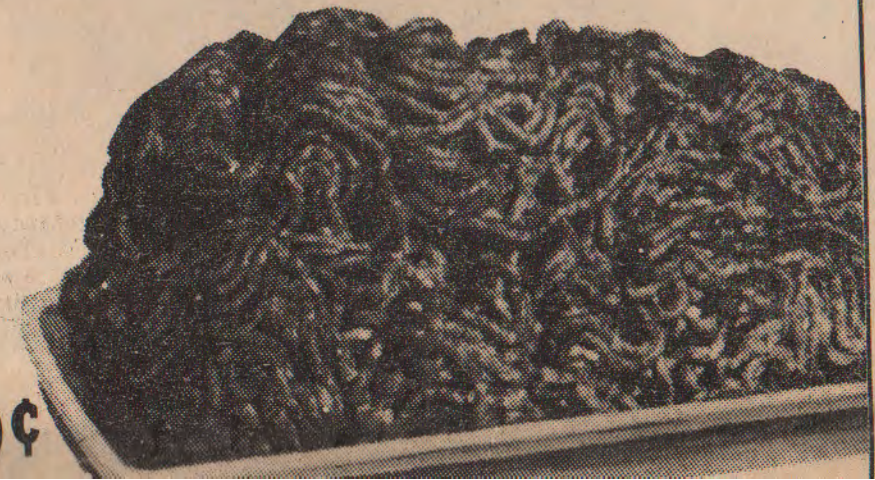

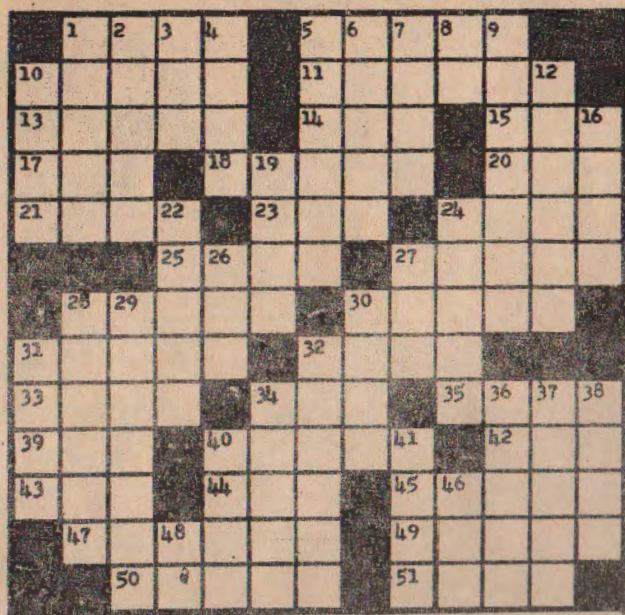
