Mr. Zaborac will be able to answer any questions on the new correctional institution, and to give a detailed report on the project.

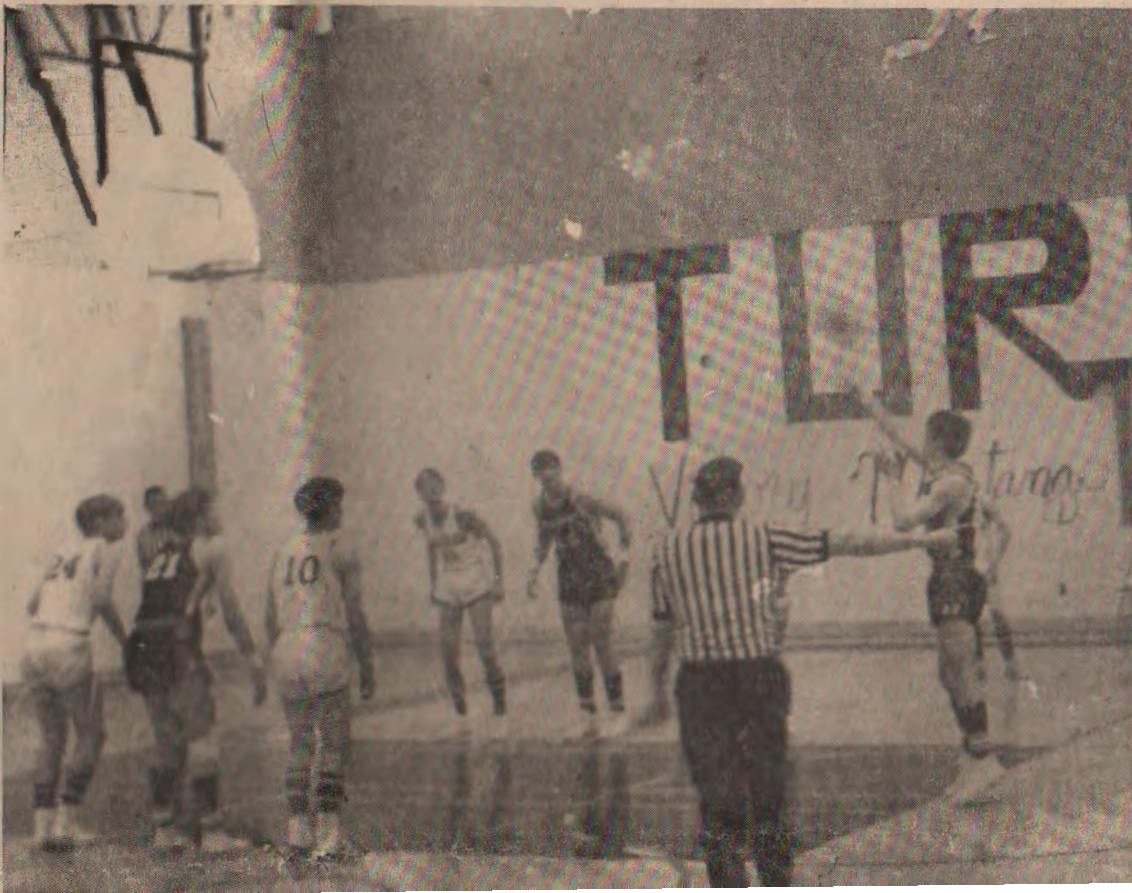

# MAN CRITICALLY HURT IN KNIFING AT TIPS BAR

**EAGLE RIVER:** An argument which was believed to have started over a game of pool, ended with a man being taken to the 5040th Air Force Hospital in critical condition from knife wounds.

The stabbing took place last night (Tuesday, November 30th) at around 5:12pm, at Tips Bar in Eagle River.

The Eagle River Ambulance was summoned and found Sgt. 1st Class Gary W. Peterson, age 35 of Company "O", 57th Infantry at Ft. Richardson bleeding from multiple knife wounds.

Peterson was rushed to the Hospital by the ambulance.

His assailant, who was not immediately identified, was taken into custody by the Alaska State Troopers. He was also a member of the military and was described by a bystander as Peterson's buddy.

Peterson's wounds were extensive, it was reported. He had been cut in the stomach, neck and back.

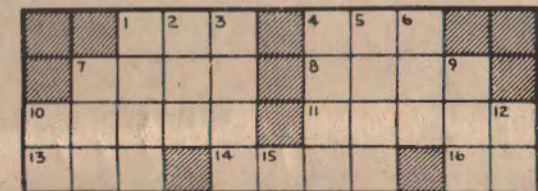

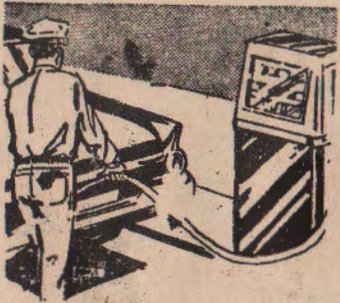

## MEA Gets Approval For Loan

**PALMER:** The Matanuska Electric Association has been approved for a \$2.5 million in loans to be used for planned improvements during the next construction season, according to word received by Willard Johnson, MEA general manager.

The \$2.5 million is to come from two sources. The first Rural Electrification Administration, will supply \$2.25 million and the remaining \$250,000 is to come from the National Rural Utilities Corporate Finance Cooperation, Johnson said.

Listed among planned uses for the money are connections to 350 new consumers.

Major new consumer extensions will include tying in the area around Montana Creek, presently not served by electricity. The line will connect with Talkeetna, which is now being served with a generator plant in that area.

Extensions will also go to the new Matanuska-Susitna Community College at Four Corners, the Southcentral Correctional Institute in Eagle River, and the proposed Sun- shine Area high school Johnson said.

Other items covered by the loan are 110 miles of distribution line, 21 miles of transmission line, a new substation at Big Lake and general system improvement.

The MEA original loan request was for \$4.9 million, and would have covered a two

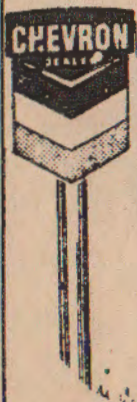

## Unique Snow Clearin Project Told

COLLEGE: A contract for what must be a unique snow clearing job has been awarded to a Fairbanks aviation firm by the University of Alaska.

Under terms of the contract, Merric Incorporated agrees to press one of its helicopters into service to blast snow from the University's "Beluga Building", when the accumulation reaches three inches or more.

If the snow is not removed from this particular building something unusual happens, it falls down.

The "Beluga", so named because it is white and thought to generally resemble a whale is an inflated fabric building which encloses tennis courts in the summer, and an ice chockey rink in the winter.

At one time in the past, workmen attempted to crawl atop the billowy building to remove the snow, and it collapsed.

After that, the university settled on the use of a helicopter. The downward blast of air from a hovering helicopter of particular horsepower, effectively did the job.

One of the specification in the snow-removal contract: the helicopter used must be equipped with float, balloon, or protected type landing gear so that if it becomes necessary to prod the building a bit to break crusted snow loose the building wouldn't be damaged.

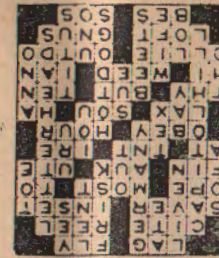

## CHRISTMAS MAIL ADVICE GIVEN HERE

For out-of-town packages, the guideline is Dec. 1; local packages and out-of-town cards should be in by Dec. 10; and local cards should be mailed by Dec. 15, she said.

For Armed Forces mailing, weight limit on Space Available Mail is five pounds, and Parcel Air Lift packages are limited to 30 pounds. Both types are limited to 60 inches combined length and width.

On space available, the customer pays regular parcel post rates, but the package will be sent air mail if space allows. On the second category, parcel post rates will be paid plus \$1 for the air lift service.
