ANCHORAGE: The office of the State District Attorney in Anchorage could give no clear interpretation to the State Statute concerning the operation of snow machines on roads outside incorporated cities in the State.

The State Regulation Title P of the Alaska Administrative Code 02,455 (C) reads that snowmachines may not operate on a State Highway''.

A spokesman for the Dist-

She was employed at the Cattlemen's Hotel in Anchorage as a domestic worker.

The definition of a "highway, in Regulation Title 13, Section 10,155 states "The en tire width between property lines of every way or place of whatever nature where all or part is open to the public as a matter of right for purpose of vehicular traffic. This includes, but is not limited to a dedicated or public subdivision street, regardless of whether or not it is in the Highway system and a roadside rest area,"

Since the local of ice was not clear whether the term "State Highway", as writ ten in the snowmachine regulation limited it to roads within the State Highway sys tem, or to the broadest interpretation of the word "Highway", the District At torney in Juneau has been written to for his interpretation.

It was pointed out that in an instance where the matter might 'e brought to court, the opinion of the judge would he final.

A recent incident in the Eagle River area concerning a col lision between a car and a snow machine has ar oused much interest among loal snow machine operators as to the letter of the law.

Porough ordinances concerning the operation of snow machines do not apply anywhere in the Porough other that the Spenard Area or on school property.





The skating rink is located at the Wayside's summer swimming area.


The skating facility is a cooperative venture between the Alaska State Parks and the Chugiak Volunteer Fire Com-





Thus the symbolism is acted out within the sanctuary becomes the message to all Christians to spread the light to all the world that all might see.






