INFANT SURVIVES RACE WITH STORK

BIRCHWOOD: Tiny three pound, one ounce Sparkle Jones survives in an incubator at Anchorage Community Hospital following a very close race with the stork who decided to arrive three months early.

The child's mother, Mrs. Skip Jones of Birch Drive in Birchwood, began to hemorrhage on Christmas eve. Mrs. Jones was six months pregnant, and her husband lost no time in helping her into the car and heading for the hospital in Anchorage.

When he reached the Glenn Highway, he spotted an Alas-State Trooper. He flagged the trooper down, and explained the predicament. The trooper radioed ahead for the Anchorage rescue medical team who met the Jones with the Ambulance, and transported Mrs. Jones to the Anchorage Community Hospital, where their little daughter was delivered early on Christmas morning.

Charges Droppec Against Snow Machine Driver

EAGLE RIVER: Charges of operating a show machine on a highway were dropped against Eric Johnson of Aurora Street in Eagle River by the State District Attorney last week.

Johnson had been charged following a collision between an automobile and a snowmachine on Skyline Drive in Eagle River December 5th.

Although the State Law is not exact in it's definiation of 'Highway' in the snowmachine regulation, a member of the District Attorney's Staff believes that it is covered in a section of the law which states that a snow vehicle may not be operated on the Roadway ofa City or Borough Street except as may be specifically provided by an ordinance enacted under provisions of AS 05,030,070.

City Street is defined as a highway or part thereof located within the limits of a city or village br. hes not include an alley.

There is no diffination of Borough Street.

Johnson still is charged with operating an unregistered snow machine.

Other aspects of the accident are still being investigated by the Alaska State Troopers.


Troopers & Fire Co. Both Get False Alarms

Anch. Driver Cited In Collision


BIRCHWOOD: An Anchorage driver was cited for running a stop sign at Birchwood Loop and the Glenn Highway.





½ tablespoon instant mixed parsley

¼ teaspoon instant sauterd onion

1 teaspoon liquid gravy sea soning salt and pepper to taste

1 pkg. refrigerator ready to bake parkerhouse rolls (12)

Cook beef in hot butter or margarine, breaking up with a fork as it cooks.

Stir in parsley, onion and liquid gravy seasoning. Season further with salt and pepper. Let cool to room temperature. Unfold biscuit rolls and press out each half—do not separate halves.
