CHUGIAK MAN ON DOWNED NAT. GUARD

PLANE

GULKANA: Herbert Alex, of Birchwood, was on board the Army National Guard aircraft which crashed on Mt. Sanford last week.

The downed plane was spotted at 9:00am by a HC 130, of the 71st Aero Space Rescue and Recovery from Elmendorf.

The plane was at the 14,800 foot level of Mt. Sanford, and appeared to be intact. No sign of life was noted, however.

At present high winds at the crash level are preventing the stripped down army helicopters from approaching the plane.

The helicopters are presently standing by at Gulkana and will at the earliest opportunity land an Army Ranger rescue team above the crash site, so they may work down to the plane.

An attempt to land the team was planned for 6:30am this morning, weather permitting.

Alex, who is a full time employee of the National Guard is the son of Mike Alex, chief of the Eklutna Village. He and his family reside on Birchwood Loop Road.

The pilot who spotted the wreckage stated that the reason the plane was found so quickly was that the wing tips and nose had been painted bright orange. "We would never have spotted it otherwise", he stated.

The proposed changes include resurfacing and realignment, and the construction of a two lane road parallel to the existing one, making it a four lane divided highway. The plans also call for the construction of a second bridge ac-

The events will begin at 10am and continue until 3pm.

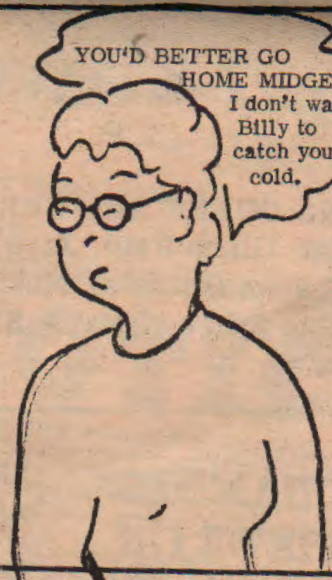

mediately drove off.

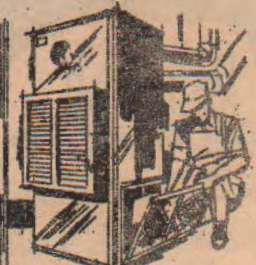

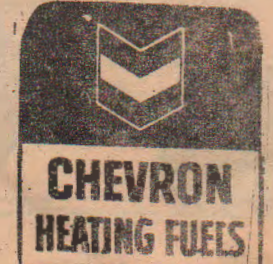

Thompson was cited for failure to yield after stopping.

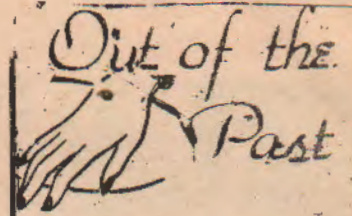
