EAGLE RIVER: Two Chugiak Area residents, both former World Champions, took first and second place in the first Annual Eagle River Sled Dog Classic, held last Saturday and Sunday.

First place, with a total time of 86.22 was Joe Redington of Birchwood. Finishing second, with a total time of 87.18, was Shirley Gavin of Peters Creek.

The race, which sponsored by the Chugiak Dog Mushers Association with prize money in the amount of \$450 contributed by Eagle River Inn, Pol-Ski Sausage and Firestone Tire and Rubber Co.

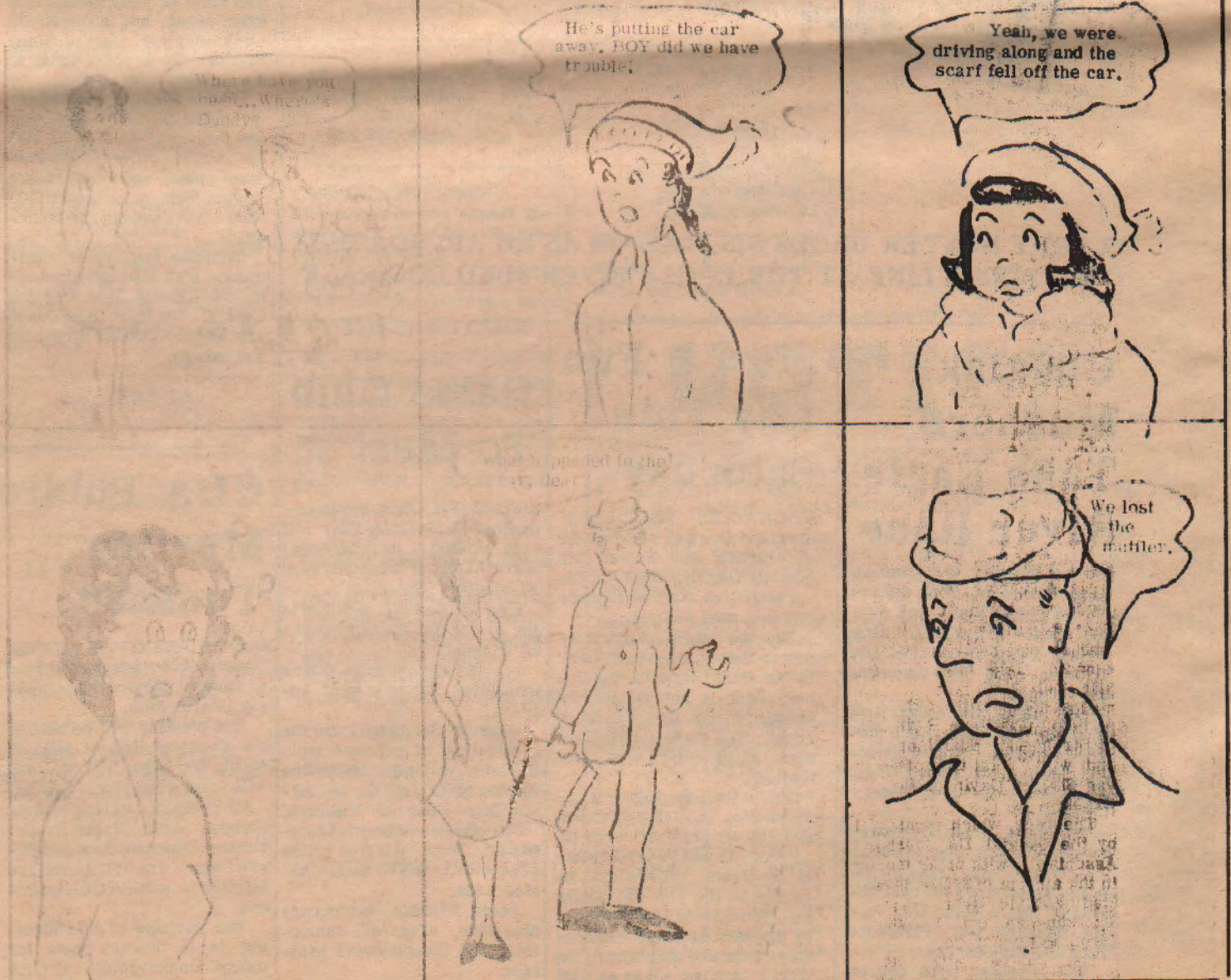

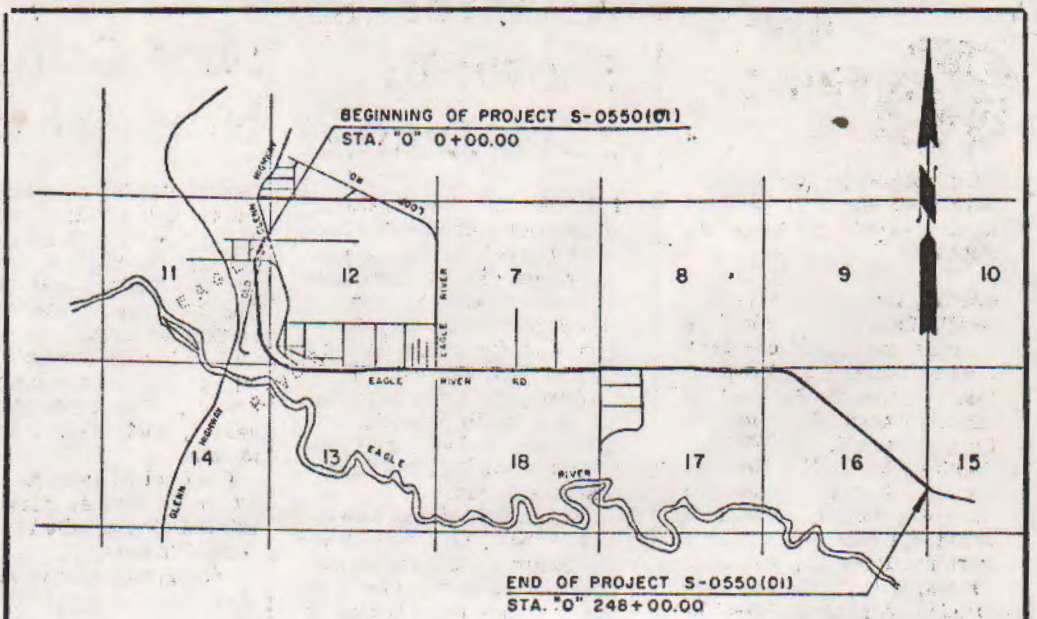
Lori McBride, Cheryl Bowers and Cheryl Curtis all received their World Pins.

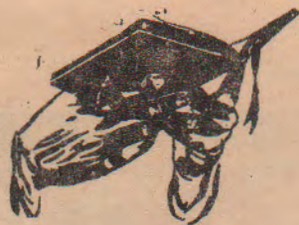

Results Of Hearing Pending

A final decision may be rendered later this week, Johnson stated.

The Pharmacy made the first step last week, when it moved in to the area formerly occupied by the Lions Den.

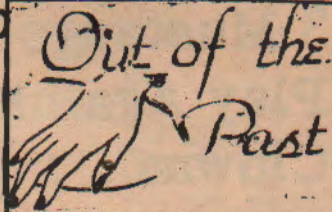
Ruth boasts all new modern equipment in her shop, and two operators to help her serve the public.

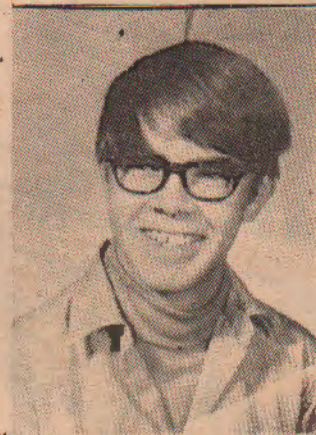
The 450 voice Choir is made up of students from Alaska, Washington, Oregon, Idaho and Montana.
