

HEARING ON GLENN HIGHWAY IMPROVEMENT SET

TWO YOUTHS ARRESTED FOR BURGLARY

CHUGIAK: Two juveniles, age 12 and 15 have been arrested and charged with burglary of a dwelling in the Chuglak area.

The burglary in question took place on May 7th in the J. B. Henson home in Chuglak.

Mr. Henson reported to the Alaska State Troopers that several items including guns, hand tools copper tubing and some cash had been taken. Total value of the loss was estimated at \$800.00.

The two youths have been held in McLaughlin Youth Center pending disposition of their case.

SUMMER SCH. REGISTRATION TO BE HELD

CHUGIAK: Registration for 1971 Summer School will be conducted in the Greater Chuglak Area on Friday May 21st, from 8:30 to 11:30 am at Chuglak High School and from 1:00 to 4:00 pm at the Eagle River Elementary School.

Brochures explaining the offerings for summer school have been distributed to all schools throughout the Anchorage Borough School District.

Registration closes on Friday, June 4th.

Courses offered at Eagle River Elementary School include reading and math for grades 2,3,4,5 and 6; and offered at Chuglak High School Field Biology for grades 8 through 12, and Typing IA for grades 8 through 12. Band



EAGLE RIVER: Local residents will be given the opportunity to express themselves on the proposed Glenn Highway improvement at a Public Meeting to be held on Thursday, May 27th at 7:30 pm at the Eagle River Elementary School.

This is a combined Corridor and Design Public Hearing on Project F 042-1 (38). This proposed project will involve construction of a high type four lane divided Highway. This will consist of two 12-foot driving lanes with 10-foot shoulders on the outside and 4 foot shoulders on the inside. These will be separated by a 36-foot grass median. Grade separations will be provided at Major Intersections and frontage roads will be constructed to serve adjacent property. All intersections will be illuminated. All side slopes, back slopes and the median will be topsoiled and seeded. There will be a steel and concrete structure bridging Eagle River down-

NONE HURT IN THREE CAR SMASH

CHUGIAK: There were no injuries in a three car accident which took place on the Glenn Highway at 4:55pm on Saturday, May 15th.

According to the Alaska State Troopers, Nellie A. Jones of Mile 23 had stopped preparing to turn left, and while the car following her was able to stop in time, a third vehicle did not and crashed into the second car driving it into the rear of Mrs. Jones 1970 Plymouth.

Damage to the second car, a 1971 Mercury, driven by Wanda Lee Conway of Palmer was estimated at \$500.

The 1965 Ford sedan, driven by Jerome Karella, of Anchorage sustained an estimated \$300 damage.

FIRST RODEO OF SEASON THIS WEEKEND

OLD CHUGIAK: The Rodeo season will begin in Chugiak next weekend with a two day event scheduled for Saturday May 22nd, and Sunday May 23rd at the Chugiak Arena at Mile 21.

Events will include Saddle Bronc riding, Bull riding, calf roping, Bareback Bronc riding, Team roping, Women's Barrel racing plus other added attractions.

This will be the first of a series of six shows scheduled for the local arena. Other dates to remember will be June 19th and 20th, and July 3rd, 4th and 5th. July 4th has been set aside as the "Little Britches" Rodeo. August 7th and 8th and another yet to be scheduled rodeo will be held prior to the State Finals on September 25th and 26th. This year for the finals a trophy saddle will be given to the winner of each event. These saddles have been donated by Brewster's Department Store,

Minnie's Rabbit Creek Inn, and Alaska Mill and Feed. This is in addition to the traditional trophy belt buckles and other prizes.

A spokesman for the Alaska State Rodeo Cowboy's Association stated that this year they have added 3 new horses several more cows and calves for the roping and riding events. Judy Lane has been appointed Secretary and can be called at 688-2794 for any additional information.

The ASRCA plans this summer to go to Soldotna, Kodiak, Fairbanks and Whitehorse in the Yukon Territory to participate in rodeos there.

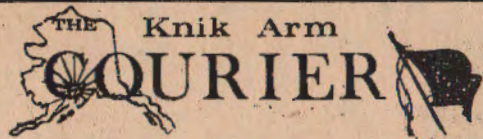
CHS BAND TRAVELS TO VALDEZ

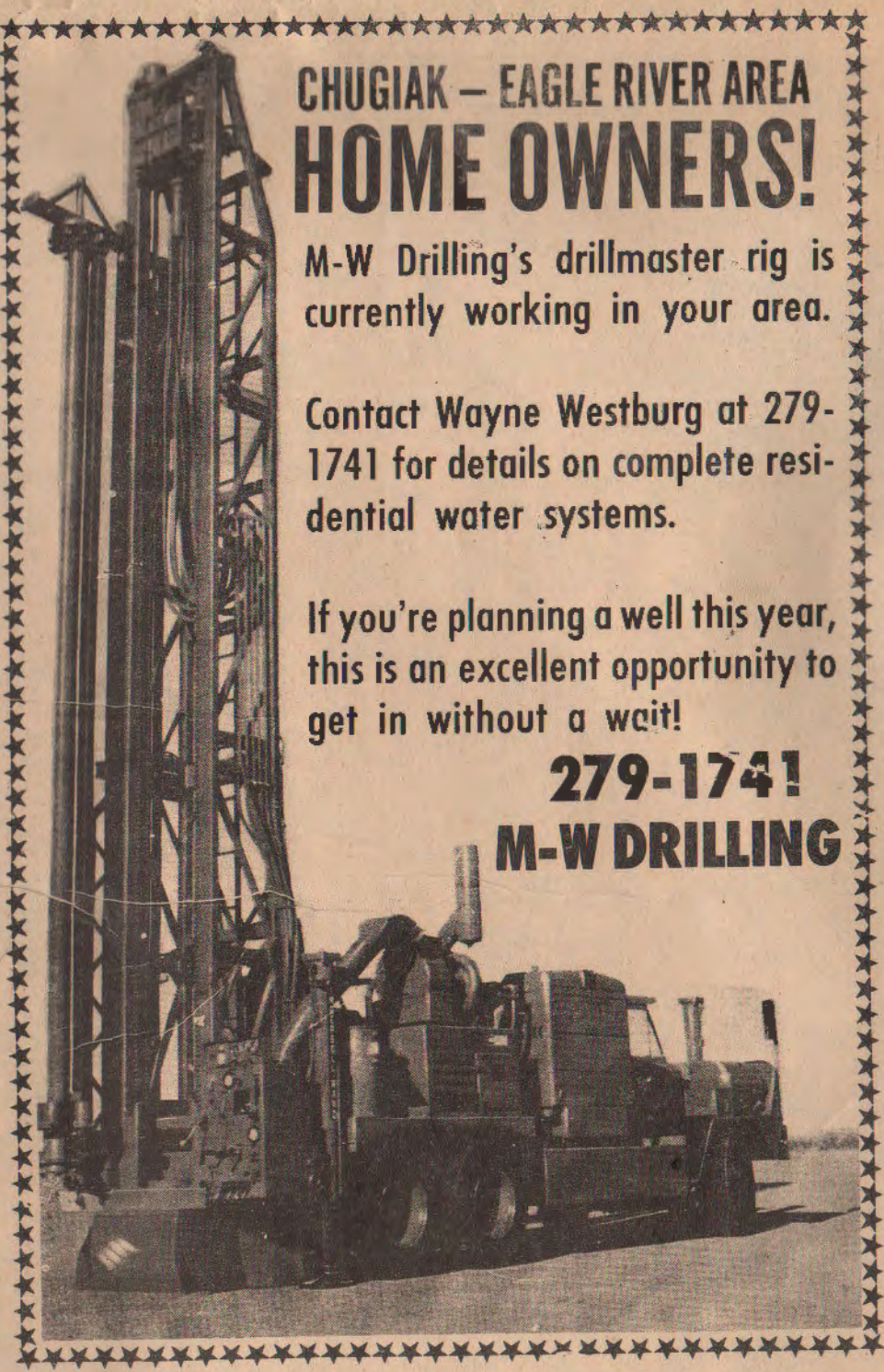

According to a spokesman for the group, a two-hour-a-day use of the satellite primarily for remote bush education on an audio basis is being considered.

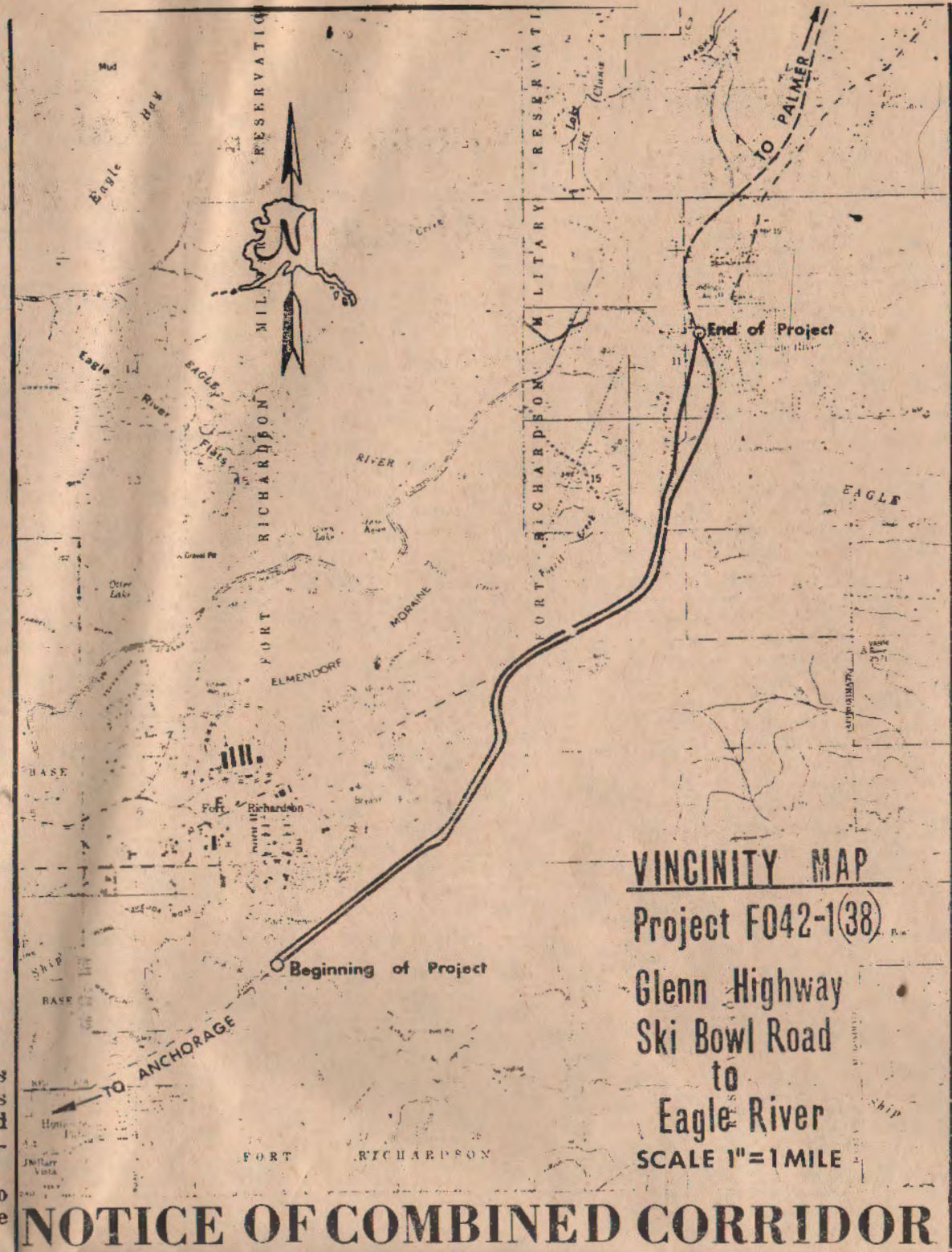
Representatives attended from State Operated Schools, the state Department of

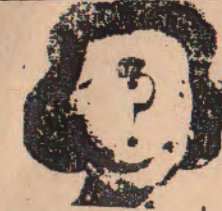

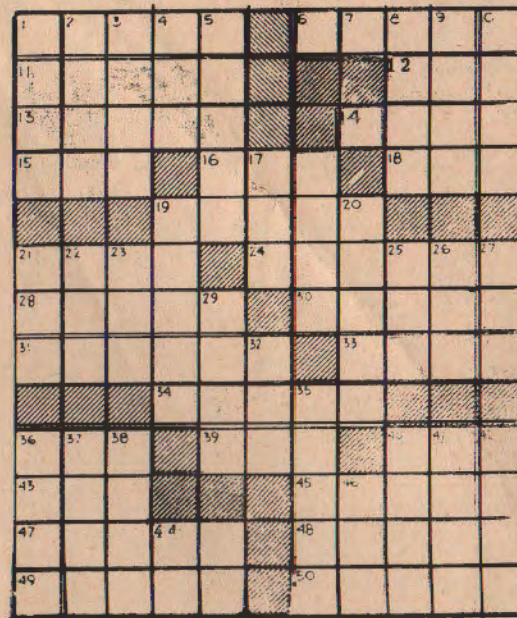
