People who have lived alone for many years develop some strong personal habits which might not fit into an arrangement such as you plan.


I do think the idea is worth trying, however, have an understanding that it is only on a trial basis, and may be terminated by either party after a specified length of time ifit doesn't work out.



LEAVE YOING ANIMALS ALONE

JUNEAU: The public was warned by the Department of Fish and Game today against picking up "lost" baby animals.

Frank Jones, acting director of the department's game division, said that although young wild animals sometimes appear to be lost, the mother is usually close by.

"It is a rare occasion when a young animal is lost or orphaned", Jones said.

Wild animals rarely make good pets," he added, "and the attempted domestication is almost always a failure for both the animal and the wellmeaning but poorly informed person who picks it up.

"Besides," he said, "the practice is unlawful without a permit,"
