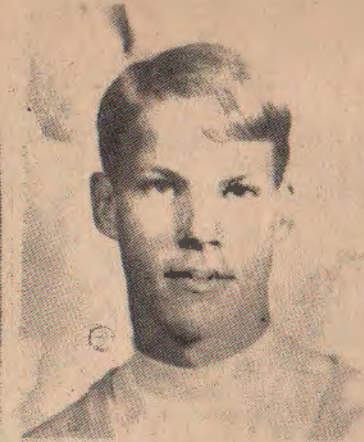

EAGLE RIVER: A brush fire was brought under control by the Eagle River Fire Company and the Bureau of Land Management last Monday night.

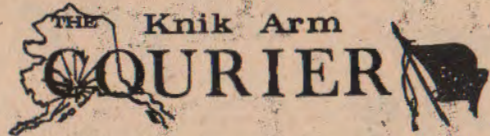
The fire, which broke out on Mt. Ash Drive in the Broadwater subdivision was apparently caused by a land clearing fire which got out of control.

Plans are still tentative, but include to date, demonstrations of equipment, games for the youngsters and a water battle staged by members of the Fire Company.

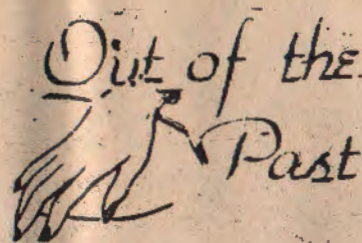

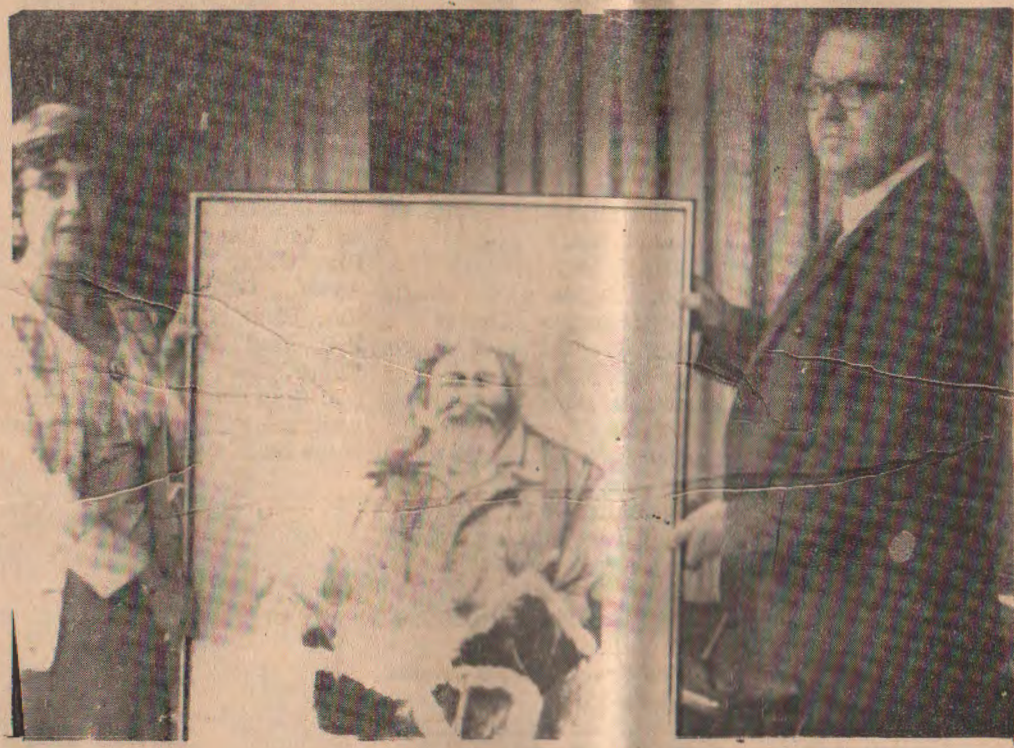
LADIES CLUB GIVES PAINTING TO CHS

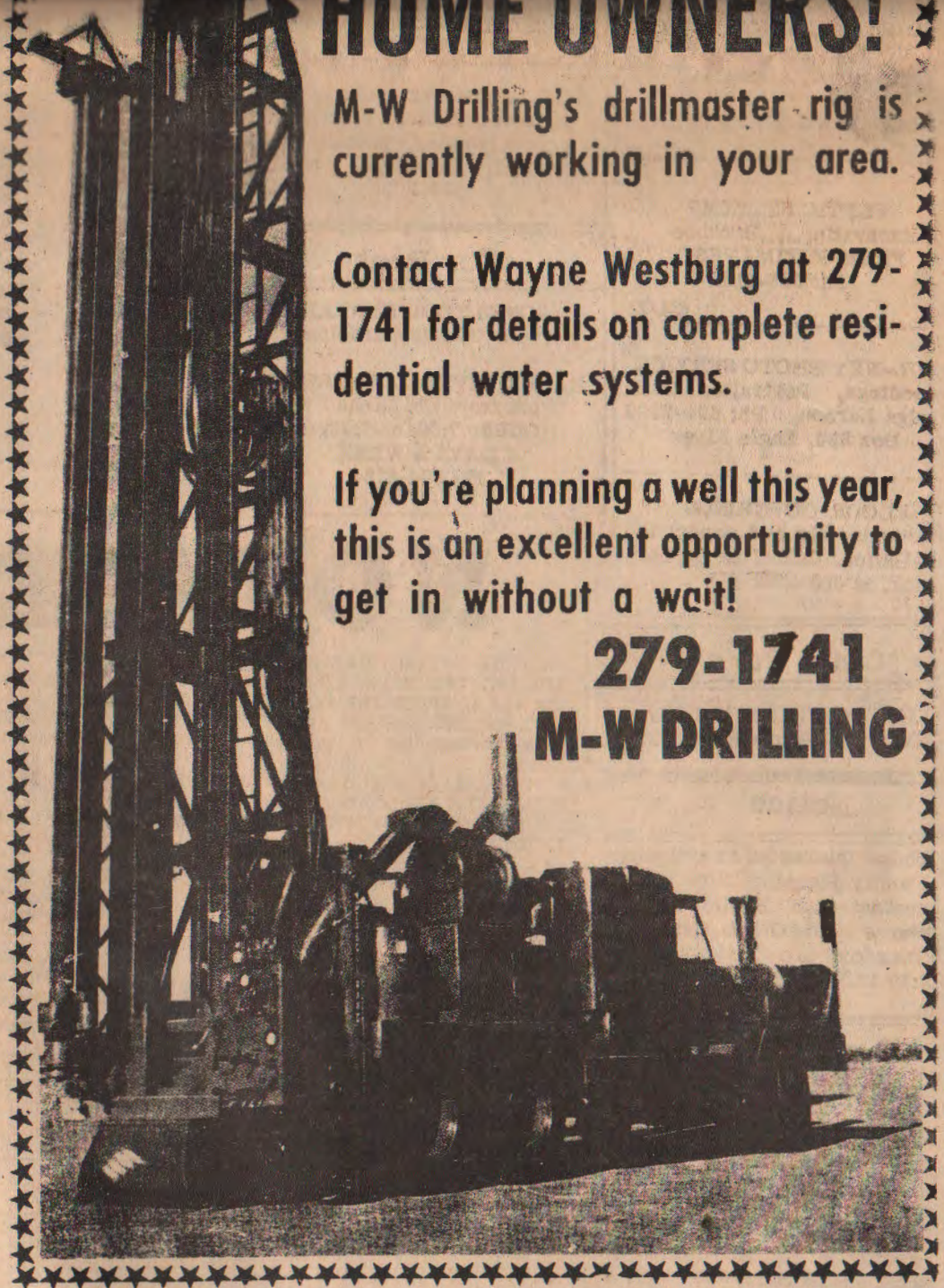
