MIRROR LAKE RE-OPENED TO WATER SKIERS

BRIDGE COLLAPSES-CHUGIAK MAN KILLED

CORDOVA: A Chugiak man was killed in the collaps of a bridge 27 miles from Cordova last Wednesday.

Bernard Uher, of Mile 18 Old Glenn Highway, who was a crane operator on a bridge construction site was driving the crane across an old railroad bridge across the Copper river, when the pier between spand 1 and 2 collapsed dropping number 2 span completely out of sight, with one end pulled down into the river.

The order restricting the size of boat motors to sixh.p. or less has been modified according to a spokes man for the Division of Parks and Recreation.
