## MIRROR LAKE RE-OPENED TO WATER SKIERS

### BRIDGE COLLAPSES - CHUGIAK MAN KILLED

**CORDOVA:** A Chugiak man was killed in the collapse of a bridge 27 miles from Cordova last Wednesday.

Bernard Uher, of Mile 18 Old Glenn Highway, who was a crane operator on a bridge construction site was driving the crane across an old railroad bridge across the Copper river, when the pier between span 1 and 2 collapsed dropping number 2 span completely out of sight, with one end pulled down into the river.

Uher was driving the 140,000 pound crane, while William Lee Burdett, of Anchorage, oiler on the rig was riding on the outside of the cab when the accident occurred.

The order restricting the size of boat motors to six h.p. or less has been modified according to a spokesman for the Division of Parks and Recreation.

Divers have been sent down to investigate the accident, but due to the strong current have been unable to locate the bodies of the men or the crane.

The bridge crossed the main stream of the river at which point the water was 35 to 40 feet deep.

Also surviving are his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Laddie Uher, of Dodge Nebraska, three brothers, Gerald of Fremont Nebraska, and John and Gene, both of Norfolk Neb, two sisters, Claretta Ortmeier, of West Point Nebraska, Linda Pfeiffer of Fremont Nebraska and a grandmother, Mrs. Clara Feichtinger, of Dodge Nebraska.

## FORCES READY TO FIGHT UNIFICATION

CHUGIAK: A move to fight the ratification of the Charter will be getting underway soon according to Ed Willis, local assemblyman and long time opponent of unification.

Willis said that he will be meeting tonight with anti unification factions elsewhere in the borough in an effort to coordinate their efforts.

"The pro-unification forces will be moving in all their big guns", he stated, "and we better be prepared to fight it every way that we can".

The Board re-affirmed their stand on favoring the continuation of the second class borough, and pledged \$100 to the fund of the local group which will be campaigning for the defeat of unification.

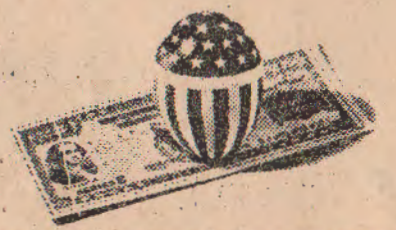
Willis said that he plans to call a public meeting in the Greater Chugiak area to work out a campaign to defeat the Charter. The time and place of this meeting will be announced.
