NATURAL GAS SERVICE ASSURED FOR CHUGIAK

FOUR LOCAL YOUTHS JAILED AFTER CRIME SPREE

EAGLE RIVER: Four youths from the Eagle River area are in McLaughlin Youth Center following a crime spree which ranged from joy riding to assault with a deadly weapon.

The four left Eagle River on September 16th in a stolen car, which they subsequently abandoned near Anchorage off the Highway.

They then stole a second car which they shortly afterward crashed into a gas pump at Toppers Service near Muldoon Road.

Two of the youth ran off, while two (aged 13 and 15) were detained by the service station

SIX HURT IN WRECK

EKLUTNA: Six persons were injured in a three car accident which took place at mile 27, on the Glenn Highway last Sunday afternoon.

The accident took place when a southbound car in the stream of traffic which was bumper to bumper toward Anchorage pulled out and attempted to pass a pick-up camper in front of it.

When the driver discovered oncoming traffic in the opposite lane, he tried to pull back colliding with the Camper.

The impact threw the car across the highway and caus-



CHUGIAK: Natural Gas service has been assured for the residents of the Greater Chugiak Area with the approval by the Alaska Public Utilities Commission of a request by Alaska Public Service Corporation to extend the service here.

The Board of the Alaska Public Service Corporation at their September 13th meeting voted to extend the transmission line from Ft. Richardson to the National Guard Camp Carroll by the end of 1971.

Then, during the winter months, off-duty crews would weld transmission line above ground to be ready to tie into distribution system in the developed area in the Eagle River Shopping district by next spring.

Plans call to extend the lines along the Old Glenn Highway as far as Lower Fire Lake, and then over to the new Glenn

tained. The attendant called the Alaska State Troopers and the owner of the Station.

The owner of the station arrived, and while awaiting the arrival of the Troopers were joined by a member of the Loomis Security Patrol who stopped to investigate the accident.

The 15 year old youth who had been waiting inside the station suddenly attempted to escape and ran behind the station. The attendant, owner and Security guard followed him. He then drew a 375 Magnum pistol and fired a shot at the attendant, which missed. The men managed to subdue him and remove the weapon. Then the 13 year old who had been waiting across the street, came at the man, threatening them with a knife. He was also disarmed.

At that time, the State Troopers arrived and took the boys into custody. They were reported to be consistently belligerent all the time.

While this was going on the two other youths who had escaped, were attempting to steal a third car. They were trying to "hot wire" the vehicle, when the owner discovered them. He held the two (both age 14) until the State Troopers arrived to make the arrest.

The Troopers indicated that two of the boys (the 13 and the 15 year old) were brothers.

Both ambulance of the Chugiak Volunteer Fire Company were summoned and the injured were transported to hospitals.

Taken to Anchorage Community Hospital was Marie Vujovich, age 54 of Anchorage. Taken to Providence Hospital, were Florence Pointer and Cathy Vulelich.

The remaining injured were taken to the 5040th Air Force Hospital. Their immediate condition is not known, but it was believed that two suffered serious injuries.

Citations are pending further investigation by the Alaska State Troopers.

LOCAL MAN RUNS FOR SCHOOL BD.

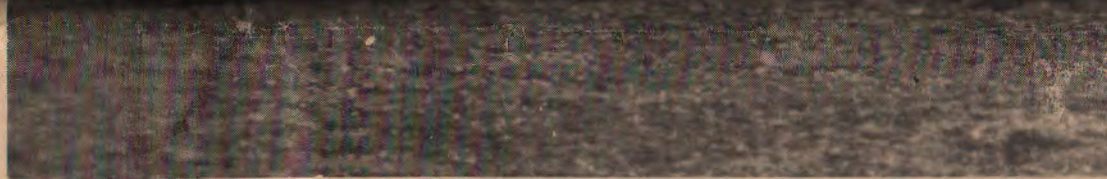
EAGLE RIVER: Kenneth Bell of Borealis Street in Eagle River, is a candidate for a seat on the School Board at the October 5th Borough Election.

BORO TAKES ANIMAL CENSUS

ANCHORAGE: The Greater Anchorage Area Borough is in the process of conducting a census of all domestic animals which are owned by residents of borough.

Two borough employees have started at Eklutna and are presently interviewing all residents and listing the animals they own.

They are taking count of cats, dogs and farm animals. Poultry and exotic pets are not included in the census.

They are also noting which dogs are licensed and which are not.

They estimate that it will take them from a year and a half to two years to complete this census.

FIREFIGHTING COURSE IS OFFERED

ANCHORAGE: Ernest Dean, a borough fireman, has been named to teach a pilot program for firefighters at Anchorage Community College.

A fire engineer, Dean has worked in the borough fire department for the past two years. He holds an associate of science degree in fire science from the University of Oklahoma.

The pilot fire training program will begin October 4th at Community College and will continue for eight and a half months. It is designed to train 25 disadvantaged or unemployed men as firemen.

Students for the pilot program have been selected from across the state.

Dean, 25, will be on leave from the borough fire department during the time he is working in this pilot program.

The Alaska Public Service Commission has a contract with the Greater Anchorage Area Borough School District to supply natural gas service to all Borough Schools where available.

Target date for making this service available to potential local customers is August of 1972.


During the winter months, a representative of the Alaska Public Service Corporation will be contacting residents of the area where service will be offered to give details of the conversion from existing fuel, comparative costs, etc.

Present criteria for offering service calls for a minimum of one customer for every 100 feet of transmission line.

As the area builds up, the service will be offered to a more and more neighborhoods, with eventual plans to extend the line as far as Eklutna.

Rates to be offered to the residents of the Greater Chugiak Area will be the same as those now paid by users in the Anchorage area.

Week.

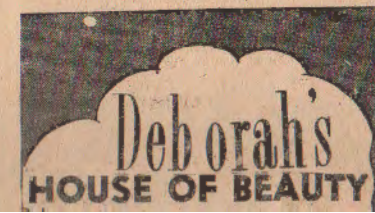
Students will have been cel-
