JUNEAU: A Birchwood man and a teacher from the Birchwood Elementary School were among the 111 victims on the Alaska Airlines plane which crashed near Juneau last Saturday, killing all aboard.

The local resident was John W. Boyles, of Birchwood Loop Road, who was enroute to Sitka where he planned to join his son on a hunting trip.

The teacher was Mary Rogers, who lived in Anchorage and had just begun her first year as a member of the staff of 'hree Special Education teachers at Birchwood Elementary School.

Mrs. Rogers was also enroute to Sitka where she was planning to spend the weekend with her husband who was working in that area.

Boyles, who was a 12 year resident of the Chugiak Area was employed by the FAA at Merrill Field.

He is survived by his wife, Mattie, of Birchwood, a son John E. Boyles, of Sitka, a daughter, Mary Sanders of Birchwood and eight grand-

He is a commercial fisherman, currently ownand operating his own fishing boat and has been active in the Alaska Fisherman's Union.

He has served on the Alaska Fisheries Board, the Alaska Commission of Fish and Game, served on the Alaska Advisory Committee to the U.S. Section of North Pacific Fisheries Commission, also on the Anchorage Game Board Advisory Committee and on the Evaluation Panel of the Salmon Research Conference.

He is presently Chairman of the Board of Supervisors for the Chuglal Volunteer Fire Company Service District, is a member of the Chugiak Lions Club and the Sportsman's Game Preservation Association.

He is married and the father of five children, all born in Alaska and two still attending Chugiak High School,

ESCAPEE SOUGHT FOR PICNIC TABLES ZIMMERMAN HAIR KILLING

- GAIN ONE

CHUGIAK: In addition to the damage sustained in the Greater Chugiak Area as the result of heavy flooding, the State campgrounds were subject to deliberate acts of vandalism in recent weeks.

Park officials report that four picnic tables and one fireplace were torn up and thrown into the creek at the Peters Creek Campground,

According to authorities, replacement costs for the facilities will run over \$500.

As an iteresting side note, it is reported that a picnic table was recently spotted by Park Rangers in Eklutna River at the bridge on the Glenn Highway.

All facilities at Thunderbird

Falls Picnic Area upriver are in place and accounted for, so park officers can only sumise this table was thrown into the ricer by vandals some years past and had lodged in an inconspictous location until picked up by the flooding river and carried downstream to the bridge.

Attempts to retrieve the table are underway.

ANCHORAGE: The charge is now murder in the deaths of Lorance Zimmerman of Anchorage, and eleven year old Paul Hair of Birchwood,

Named as suspect in the case and being sought by the Alaska State Troopers is a 21 year old escapee from the Adult Prison Camp near Palmer.

The cause of the death of the pair was changed from accidental death to murder upon the location of the Toyota Land Cruiser which they had been riding in. The vehicle was found intact and abandoned in the parking lot of Fairview Manor in Fairbanks over 300 miles from the spot where their bodies had been found.

The Fairbanks Police Department received a call at 5pm on Friday, September 3rd, reporting the abandoned vehicle. Investigation led to the finding of a witness who had seen the man get out of the car and from this description a composite drawing was made up.

The man in the drawing fitted the description of Willis Mayo, age 21, who had escaped from the Adult Prison Camp near Palmer on August 14th, the day the Zimmerman and Hair had disappeared.

Mayo is described as bein 6 feet tall, weighing 185 pounds with brown short cropped hair and blue eyes. At the time of escape he was wearing blue shirt and pants.

The warrents for his arrest are for two counts of first degree murder with bail set at \$100,000 for each count and for one count of jgy-riding.

May had been arrested at Valdez on June 17th on the charge of possession of halucinegente drugs. he was transferred to the Adult Camp at Palmer on August 4th.

Anyone seeing a man answering to this description is asked to notify the Alaska State Troopers. He is considered dangerous and may be armed.



Issues Ok'd For Ballot

Resolutions putting service area annexation measures on the October ballot were approved by the Borough Assembly at .. special meeting Thursday night.

Public hearings on ordinances enlarging the service areas were set for Sept.

The assembly also approved a resolution which would allow Eagle River voters to decide on their service district assuming road and drainage powers. The public hearing on this also will be Sept. 27.

To be added, if approved by voters, to the Spenard Service area are Campbell Heights. Murray, Dowling, Aurora and Hollowbrook subdivisions. Crestbook subdivision would be annexed to the Sand Lake service area.


If the measures are approved. property owners will be subject to increased taxes to pay for the services which the service areas provide. Only residents of the affected areas will be allowed to vote on the measures.

Roads and drainage services to Eagle River would cost residents of that service area 25 mills for the remainder of the fiscal year.

Many Alaskan **Booklets Out**

Wild Rose Hips, The Fishernan Returns, Wild Plants of In Borough System Alaska - if any or all of those itles cover something you'd ike to know more about, stop by the Extension Service office in Palmer.

The service publishes many officially convened last bulletins on the above subjects and more. Some are free, and others are available for a nominal charge.

One of the most comprehensive of the booklets is the "Wild Edible and Poisonous Plants of Alaska" publication. It is illustrated with sketches and color photographs, and describes approximately 200 plants. Cooking instructions are included in the case of edible plants, and the poisonous plants are treated in a warning section by themselves. The publication is an invaluable pocket reference to the state's plants for the resident and the visitor alike.

As for the rose hip bulletin, one of the things you might not know without it; six to eight rose hips contain the daily minimum Vtamn C requrement for an adult. And 2000 tons of rose hips were gathered in England to replace scarce oranges in the last world war.

"The Fisherman Returns" and other bulletins like it are concerned with the preparation and the preservation of Alaskan fish and meat.

Many more publications are available, in categories ranging from landscaping, agriculture, sewing, child care and community development. Although a high proportion of the bulletins are of interest mainly to the

School Enrollment On The Increase

The roll calls in the Anchorage Borough School District have increased steadily since the school year Tuesday, according to district publication director Robert Jamison.

The first day enrollment was 30,461, while 31,077 youngsters signed in on Wednesday, 31,568 on Thursday and 31,768 on Friday. The anticipated total enrollment of 34,044 students will not be reached until mid-October, Jamison said.

"This is traditional, that if school starts much before Labor Day, the attendance is low for the first week or so," he said. "Families are still on vacation or the kids are at camp or parents have gone hunting. They'll start drifting in this week."




