HOSPITALS COOPERATE IN PREGNANCY CARE STUDY

SEATTLE: Alaska s 28 hospitals, including all community, public and military hospitals, the Alaska State Department of Health, the Alaska Medical Association, the March of Dimes and the U.S. Public Health Service are cooperating in a unique effort to determine how prenatal care affects the outcome of pregnancy in the State of Alaska.

Also to be dtermined is the extent to which women utilize prenatal care and services and facilities available to them.

Beginning on January 1st through June 30th, in all hospitals throughout the State, women who have given birth will be asked to fill out a voluntary questionaire about the prenatal care they have received during their pregnancy.

At the request of the Alaska State Department of Health and Social Services the survey questionnaire was approved by the Alaska Medical Association and the Alaska Hospital Association,

Where needed and requested by hospital administrators, the March of Dimes chapters in Alaska will help provide volunteers to assist with questionnaires.

Public Health Nurses in each community have also volunteered to help where needed to avoid placing an undue burden on busy hospital staffs. It is estimated that approximately 3,5000 questionnaires will be completed during the survey.

The March of Dimes, through it's medical department in New York will also provide technical assistance in evaluating the results of the questionnaire forms and make the information available to the narticipating






