BURGLARY ATTEMPTED AT HALFWAY HOUSE

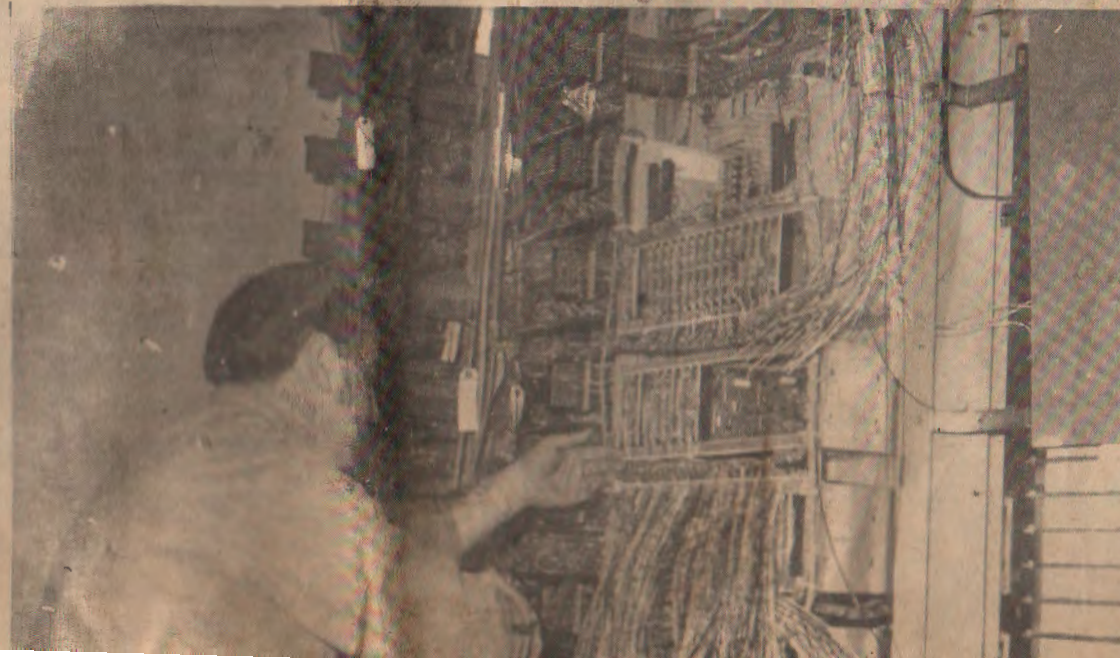

EAGLE RIVER: Four persons were injured following a two car accident which took place last Thursday, January 13th at Eagle River Loop and Old Glenn Highway.

MTA TO USE UNIVERSAL INFO. CENTER

PALMER: Matanuska Telephone Association consumers will on February 6th, 1972 be able to use a universal information center by dialing 555-1212 for telephone numbers in Alaska and by dialing the appropriate area code and 555-1212.

Outside Alaska this service will allow all MTA subscribers to dial without charge information for telephone numbers anywhere in the United States.

The new subscriber service has been made possible by the implementation of Direct Distance Dialing in Alaska.

The 555-1212 information number is presently in use throughout the Continental United States. It's usage by MTA subscribers will help cut down on operator assistant time resulting in more efficient use of toll personnel and facilities.

MTA MEMBERS TO RECEIVE INSTRUCTIONS

PALMER: Instructions were mailed out this week in preparation for Matanuska Telephone Association's cut-over to Direct Distance Dialing, method whereby subscriber dial their own long distance calls.

Included in this first of two mail-outs were a cover letter explaining that Direct Distance Dialing would be instituted on February 6 and in initial dialing instructions.

Of special note is the fact that not all MTA exchange will use the same "access code", a two or three number code to be dialed to access the Direct Distance Dialing equipment. Therefore subscribers were asked to ignore all but the dialing instructions for their particular exchange. All other instructions for Direct Distance Dialing will not allow them to place their own long distance calls.

General Manager Max Clements noted that all exchanges except Healy will cut over to Direct Distance Dialing on February 6, 1972. He said that some subscribers were under the false impression that only exchanges receiving Automatic Number Identification (A.N.I.) equipment would be cut over to Direct Distance Dialing.

Mr. Clements further explained that two methods, A.N.I. and O.N.I. (Operator Number Identification), will

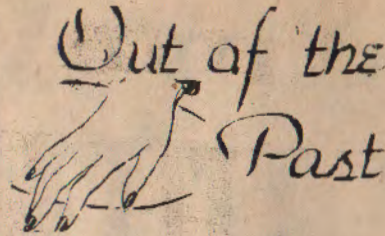

er's number and to assist in
completing the call.

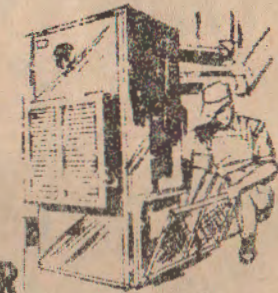

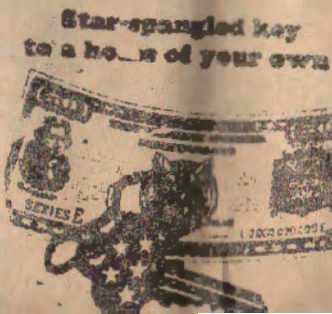

WOMAN HAS FACIAL INJURIES

EAGLE RIVER: A Fire Lake woman sustained minor facial lacerations in a two car accident which took place at the intersection of Eagle River Road and the Old Glenn Highway at 8:50pm last Thursday January 13th.

According to the Alaska State Troopers, Elsie Kuentzel of Lower Fire Lake was Northbound on the Old Glenn, when she was struck by a 1970 GMC pickup, driven by Charles Polak of Eagle River.

According to the Troopers, Polak had attempted to stop as he approached the Old Glenn on Eagle River Road, but because of the icy conditions of the pavement, skidded into the intersection.

Damage to Mrs. Kuentzel's 1970 Volkswagon was estimated at \$600. The Polak vehicle sustained an estimated \$200 damage.

EAGLE RIVER: The Board of Directors of the local Chamber of Commerce, voted to champion a number of projects at their Monday night meeting.

Among the items were the investigation of a possible location of an area suitable for industrial development. A committee was appointed to investigate the Birchwood area, in the vicinity of the Alaska Railroad for this purpose.

The Chamber also voted to contact the Department of Highways and try to get them to place Milepost markers on all State Maintained roads in the area, particularly the Birchwood Loop Road and the Eagle River Road.

A guest at the meeting was Mr. David Sagerser, of Anchorage, who is looking into the advantages of opening a new business in the area. He plans a music store which would feature records, tapes, instrument and TV repair.

He also stated that he would like to operate a weekly dance for the teen aged youth of the community. Mr. Sagerser explained that these dances would be strictly controlled to keep undesirable persons away and would be supervised by members of the Chugiak Security Patrol.

The Board also discussed the establishing of a Tourist information Center, perhaps in conjunction with an existing place of business.

The subject of annexation of the military bases by the City of Anchorage was brought up, and the Board voted to send a letter to Governor Egan in opposition to such annexation and to the method by which the Boundary Commission arrived at their decision.

The PTA also is attempting to get a consensus of public opinion as to whether the new should be built at the same site or moved to an more suitable location.

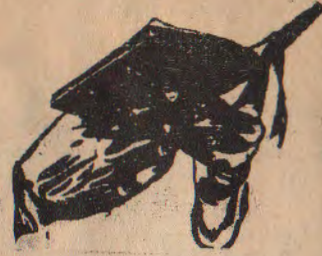

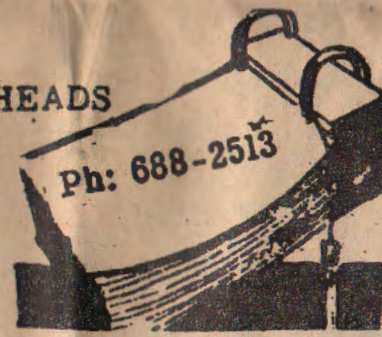

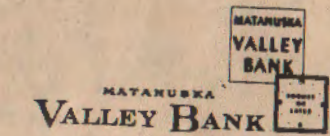
