## LOCAL PEOPLE FAVOR THE BALANCED COMMUNITY

**CHUGIAK:** Local residents that they favored the balanced community plan, rather than the residential concept as presented by the Borough Planning Department at a series of two public meetings held here within the past week.

The first meeting was held last Wednesday at the Eagle River Elementary School, and the second last night at Chugiak High School. Approximately 45 people attended each meeting.

At each of the two meetings the Borough Planning Department presented both plans, supported with data on the community and charts. A question and answer period

One item brought out at both meetings was the feeling that not enough area had been set aside for businesses even in the balanced community plan. There was also some question of the advantages of zoning an area strictly for business and allowing no residential development in that area at all.

Damage to the Weitzel car was estimated at \$500. The 1966 Cadillac Cline was driving sustained an estimated \$400 damage.

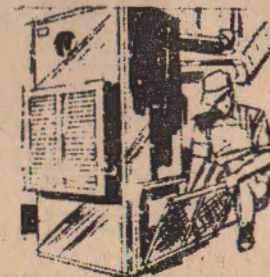
Cline was cited for failure to yield by the Alaska State Troopers.

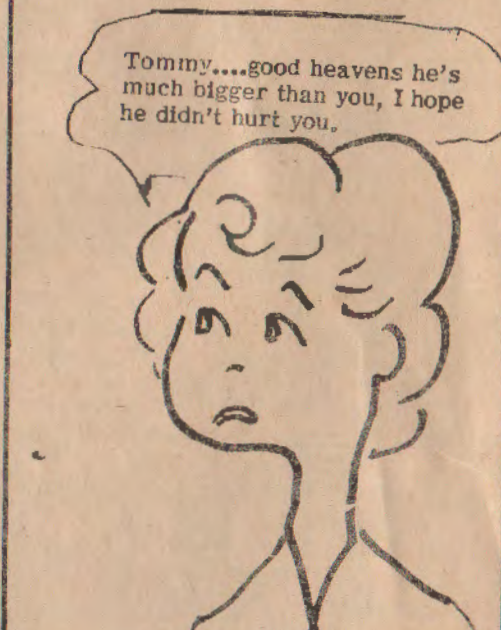

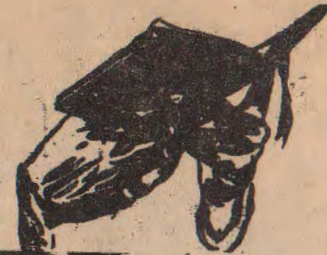

## Alaska Highway Travel Down

Travel into Alaska via the Alaska Highway was down slightly in January over a year ago.

According to Jack L. Jobe, district director of the U. S. Immigration and Naturalization Service, a total of 2,322 persons arrived in 946 vehicles.

For January 1971, the totals were 2,393 passengers in 953 vehicles. During December, 1,819 persons arrived in 831 vehicles.

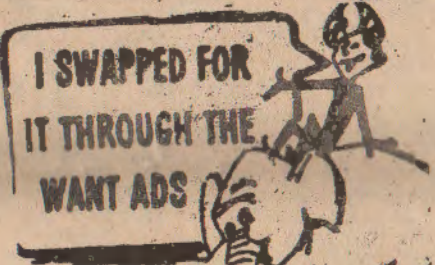
