## 12 MONTH SCHOOL YEAR TO BE PROPOSED

### EAGLE RIVER MAN FOUND DEAD

**EAGLE RIVER:** Curtis Miller, of Eagle River was found dead upon the arrival of the Eagle River ambulance at his home at Mile 14 on the Old Glenn Highway, the victim of an apparent heart attack.

Miller passed away on Thursday, April 6th, at approximately 11:59pm.

A 16 year resident of Alaska, Miller was born on February 23, 1914 in Ft. Worth Texas. At the time of his death he was employed as a pressor at Quality Cleaners in Eagle River, a position he had held for three years.

His only known survivor is a brother, Bertie Miller.

Among the problems which REFOCUS is attempting to get public opinion on are, school programs and curriculum, new ways to utilize the school buildings (of which the 12 month school year is only one) and utilization of school facilities by the community.

## ONE CITED IN THREE CAR CRACKUP

EAGLE RIVER: One driver was cited following a three car accident at the North entrance to Eagle River last Sunday, April 9th, according to the Alaska State Troopers.

A car had started to slow down to make the turn and a second car had to hit the brakes to avoid striking the rear of the vehicle. A third car was also forced to hit the brakes while the fourth in the line was unable to apply his brakes in time and struck the third car causing it to crash into the rear of car number 2.

Cited for following too close was car number 4, a 1964 Pontiac Station Wagon driven by Dwight Johnson, of Chugiak. Damage to the car he was driving was estimated at \$200.

The other two cars involved in the collision, a 1968 Mercury, driven by L.W. Lefler of Anchorage, and a 1970 Mercury, driven by Gerald Fountain, also of Anchorage each sustained an estimated \$300 damage.

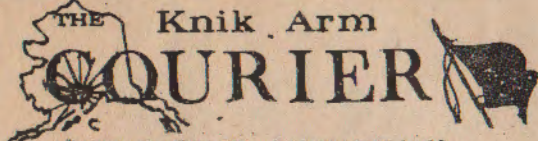
## CHAMBER TO MEET MONDAY

## CHUGIAK IS TWENTY FIVE

(Commemorating the founding of Chugiak in 1947.)

CHAPTER VI: The first business places in Chugiak were Moose Horn (then a general store) and Parks at the present location of Wallace Construction Co.

Moosehorn started early in 1947 as a small general store and service station. Marie MacDowell operated the store, while Jim operated the service station and towing service.

The original building was a large frame structure, which was added onto by both frame construction and a quonset hut.

It had all the appearance of a frontier store, typical of the early growth of Alaska. Here too, somewhat later, the first Post Office was to be established. Marie McDowell was the first Postmistress of Chugiak.

Parks started with a lunchroom in the log building they

This became a regular stop for the Palmer bus that ran(?) FROM Anchorage to Palmer daily (?). They too, added a service station.

Cloyce was an independent gasoline dealer, and with his son, began hauling both fuel oil and gasoline in his own tanker.
