CHANGES TOLD IN FOOD STAMPS

JUNEAU: Commissioner Fred McGinnis, of the State Department of Health and Social Services announced today that several major changes in the Food Stamp Program will become effective May 1, 1972.

They include the introduction of variable purchase options new identification cards and authorization to purchase cards, and a program allowing a client to have his food stamp purchase price withheld from his public assistance grant.

"These changes enable the Food Stamp Program to respond to the needs of eligible clients in an increasingly dignified, efficient and business-like manner," Commissioner McGinnis said. "The improved and streamlined delivery system is geared to the realities of food stamp client's lives and allows the State to administer the program with greater effectiveness."

The variable purchase program provides for families

A proposition to change the by-laws to delete the issuing of membership certificates was passed by unanimous ballot.

who cannot afford to purchase a full month's food coupons by making a range of options available under which clients can use a new authorization to purchase card and purchase one quarter, one-half, three-quarter, or the full amount of the total monthly allotment.

The new streamlined Food Stamp Program employs an identification card for clients which is now valid for the full period of eligibility. Through public assistance withholding, the new system takes account of the needs of ill or disabled clients and clients in the unorganized boroughs who, under the former system, had to travel long distances, time trips according to sales hours of local food coupon outlets and wait in line on arrival.

Public assistance withholding allows a client to have his food stamp purchase price automatically deducted from his public assistance grant.

CHUGIAK IS TWENTY FIVE

CHAPTER VIII

While the Community of Chugiak is twenty five, the Chugiak Elementary School is completing it's 20th year of operation.

Just a little more than two years after Chugiak was founded, the residents realized that school would very soon become a major problem.

The Chugiak Community Club began a vigorous campaign to obtain school facilities for the children. They organized a school committee and invited all those who lived in Chugiak to participate in the school effort.

The Territorial Department of Education seemed reluctant to consider school facilities at the start. They felt that as long as parents were willing to transport children to Anchorage, no school was needed.

After a great deal of correspondence with the Community Club, the Department offered to transport the child-

ren, but the residents felt that this was an unsatisfactory solution.

Many plans were proposed to obtain a school building of some sort. Among these were the purchase of one or more Quonset huts, the use of the old school building at Eklutna, and even the purchase of a large chicken house that was offered for sale.

Finally the Territory agreed to build a school based on the data supplied by the Chugiak Community Club. It would be necessary for the Community to provide the property to locate the school.

The school committee selected the present site as the most centrally located. The Chugiak Community Club applied for and obtained a special use permit from the Land Office since the land was public Domain. The use permit was paid for by the Community Club until the land was turned over to the Territory.

The first school building was part of the present frame structure and contained two class-rooms and a teacher's

apartment. It was built to accommodate 32 students, but opened the first year with more than 40. This has continued to be the pattern.

The Community Club appointed Paul Swanson as School Agent.

When school started, the PTA formed with Henning Johnson as it's first President and Marie McDowell as Secretary.

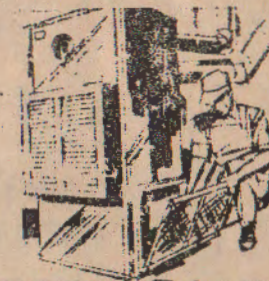

The Health Clinic is located at the GOAL Center in the Slanker Building on Artillery Road in Eagle River.

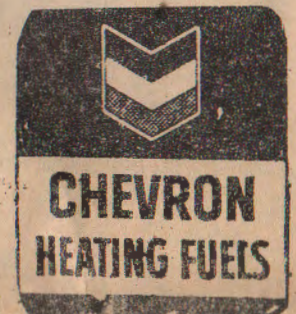

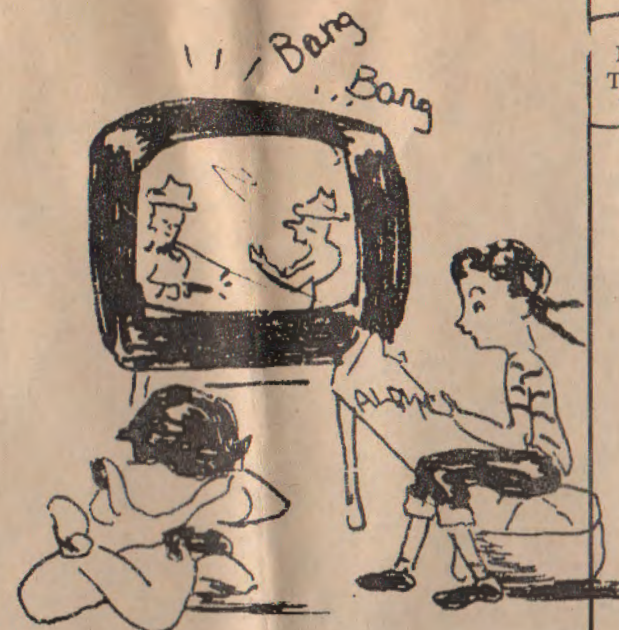

Live music will start at 9pm.

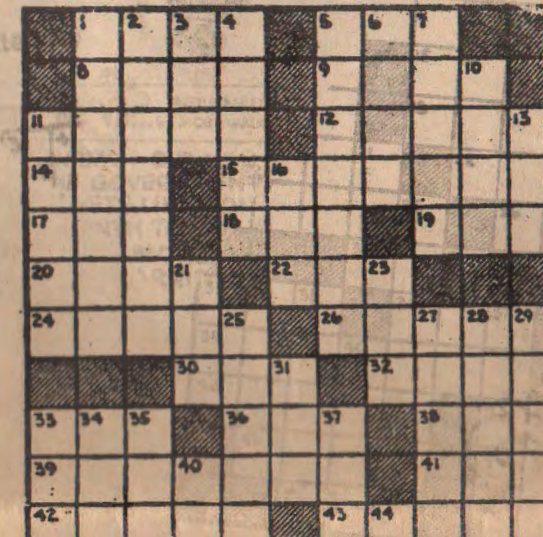

Well, you can guess what happened. She never gave me the half. I am sure she has only forgotten, but I can't for the life of me bring myself to ask her for it.

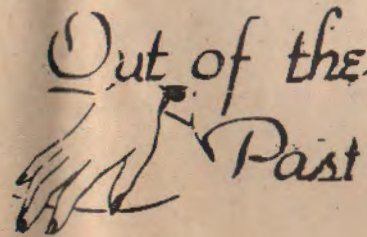
I have tried hinting, by mentioning the gift we brought our friend and how pleased she seemed to be with it, but this didn't seem to remind her that she hadn't paid for her half.
