The interior of the ambulance has ample storage compartments for first aid equipment, which includes a full length backboard for spinal injuries.

At present it is equipped with a two way FM radio on the Borough Fire Department frequency. The Chuglak Fire Company plans to also install a Citizen Band radio for their own dispatcher.

The ambulance came equipped with five mounted studded snow tires and five highway tires also mounted.

This ambulance was purchased bit he borough out of the General Fund at a cost of \$13,225.

It will be used by the Chugiak Volunteer Fire Company under contract to the Borough.


