BROADWATER INDUSTRIES MOVES TO PALMER

SEWERS AND PARKS BOTH PASS

ANCHORAGE: Sewers and Parks and Recreation both passed with a healthy margin following an election turn out which was described as light throughout the Greater Anchorage Area Borough.

Boroughwide, Proposition A (sewers) passed with a vote of 5,292 Yes, to 4,474, No. Proposition B, (Parks) 5,045 Yes, to 3,766 No.

Voters in the five precincts in the Greater Chugiak Area set an all time record for indifference with a total vote of 561 in all precincts.

The fact that they (local voters) had nothing to gain or lose by the outcome of the election, as they would not benefit from the bonds nor would it cost them anything, coupled by the poor weather provided many with the excuse to stay away from the polls.

AMBULANCE PUT INTO SERVICE

CHUGIAK: The Chugiak Volunteer Fire Company has put into service the new ambulance which was delivered last month.

The vehicle is a 1972 Chevrolet, which was modified by the Cascade Specialty Car Co. of Portland Oregon, who specializing in converting vehicles into ambulances.

The new ambulance is equipped with a complete oxygen system, including a demand valve resuscitator.

It has one wheeled stretcher and three folding litters, and can transport four stretcher patients at one time two on the floor and two suspended from the roof of the



PALMER: Broadwater Industries, a plastic manufacturing plant which burned out in Eagle River last fall will relocate in Palmer, it was learned last week.

The firm has leased a warehouse from KLH Inc, located near Matanuska Mall.

Equipment is being installed and full operation is scheduled to begin around the 15th of April.

The management says that there is little danger from fire, such as gutting the plant in Eagle River. A system for bleeding off the pentane gas (which had ignited in the Eagle River plant) has been designed and will be incorporated at the new location. Pentane is the expanding agent used in transforming styrene beads into the foam which is used to manufacture the foam products.

In addition to the red warn-
ing lights, it has adjustable
floodlights which can be used
to illuminate the scene of an
accident.

The interior of the ambul-
ance has ample storage com-
partments for first aid equip-
ment, which includes a full
length backboard for spinal
injuries.

At present it is equipped
with a two way FM radio on
the Borough Fire Department
frequency. The Chugiak Fire
Company plans to also install
a Citizen Band radio for their
own dispatcher.

The ambulance came equip-
ped with five mounted studded
snow tires and five highway
tires also mounted.

This ambulance was purch-
ased by the borough out of the
General Fund at a cost of
\$13,225.

It will be used by the Chugiak
Volunteer Fire Company under
contract to the Borough.

CHUGIAK IS TWENTY FIVE

CHAPTER V: Park's lunch room became the community center, since it was the largest available place to meet.

Besides, almost everyone stopped there for one reason or another, perhaps only for a cup of coffee.

The coffee shop was a large log building, built against the cut-oyt bank. The interior was peeled and oiled logs, with slabs carrying out the rustic appearance in the counter.

There was a large single spruce log that ran the length of the building for a ridge-pole. Visitors would examine this pole with calculating eyes and finally ask how such a large pole got there.

Cloyce would answer, "That pole came from a big spruce that grew on the bank back of the coffee shop. When we were ready for it, we just cut it down and it FELL in place!"

Parks owned three famous dogs. One, Yutu, was cover

dog on a magazine one time. Another, Metu, was an old-time freight sled dog. The third "Wolf", was alleged to be part wolf. Wolf was "shot" by hundreds of camera fans.

The area was somewhat wild in 1947. Perhaps the story of Dottie Fetrow and her first experience with a bear might be related here. The Fetrow family lived in a cabin at Parks while their house was being built. There was no inside plumbing, just the outside castles. Dottie was occupying the castle one afternoon when it began to shake and rock.

Not knowing what the commotion was, she opened the door, scooped up their pet black cat, Satan, and hauled him inside to await the abatement of the storm.

When things subsided, she hurried to the Parks cabin and asked Justine if there had been an earthquake. Receiving a negative reply they decided to investigate. Justine went well-armed with a pistol not much larger than a deringer. They discovered at

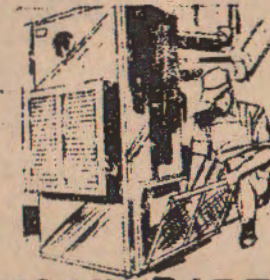

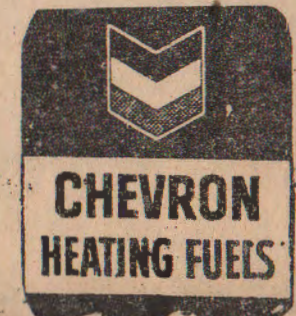

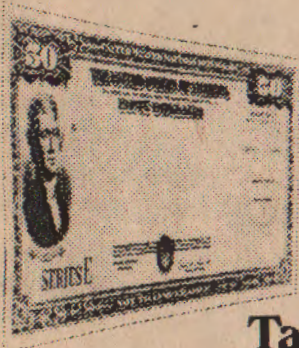

The next regular meeting of the club will take place on Thursday, April 13th, at the home of Linda O'Brien in Birchwood.

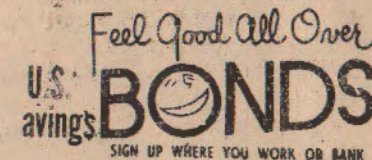


VFW TO SERVE BEEF DINNER

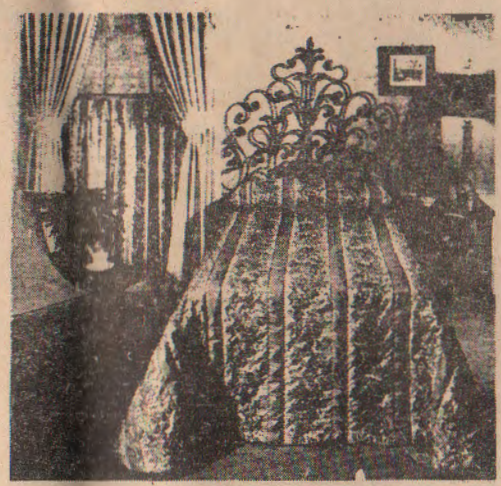

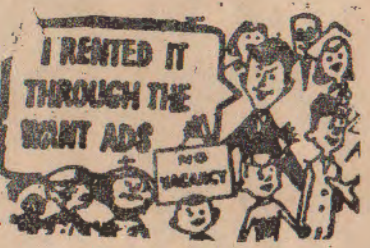

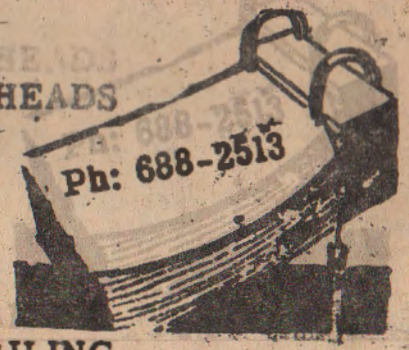
