OLD CHUGIAK: The Borough Planning Commission has called a Public Hearing to be held on Tuesday, May 9th to discuss the proposed swap of the present site of the Chugiak Elementary School for equal acreage at the Chugiak Carnival Grounds.

The meeting will be held at the Chugiak Elementary School, if available, starting at 7:30pm.

This hearing was called as as result of a motion at the Borough Assembly meeting last Monday night when that group was called to act upon a recommendation by the school board that the land exchange be approved.

The school board at their April 25th meeting had voted to accept the offer to exchange land based on an engineering study which showed that the cost of removing the hill behind the present school would be excessive.

When the recommediation was brought before the Assembly, it was brought out



When the season begins, the Chugiak team will play in Anchorage against the teams in that area.




