CBA MEETING TOMORROW NIGHT

OLD CHUGIAK: The Annual Meeting and Election of Officers of the Chugiak Benefit Association will be held this Thursday, (tomorrow) July 13th.

The meeting will take place at the Chugiak Senior Center, Mile 21, Old Glenn Highway, starting at 8:00pm.

Business will include an annual report by officers, the election of six members to the Board of Directors, and a vote on a proposed change in the By-Laws to change the date of the Annual Meeting from summer to fall.

Board members whose terms are expiring are, Elsie Oberg (Secretary), James Carawan, Thomas Blavka, Alex Soto, Roy Starner and Phyllis Smith (Treasurer). All incumbents have announced their intention to run for re-election.

PROCTORS GRAND OPENING TO FEATURE FUN AND FOOD

EAGLE RIVER: Proctor's Eagle River Supermarket will hold their Grand Opening this coming Thursday, July 13th, with a free Weiner Roast to be held in the parking lot.

The market is located in the recently remodeled building which formerly housed the Red Barn Inn, and according to Orville Proctor, owner of the chain is a part of the largest independent owned and operated supermarket in Alaska.

EAGLE RIVER: Few details

The Chugiak Benefit Association (CBA) is an organization whose membership consists of all persons, age 13 or older who have been residents of the Greater Chugiak Area (Eagle River through Eklutna) for thirty days or longer.

CBA is administered by a board of 12 directors, elected by the membership. Their prime duties are to manage the community property, located at Mile 21 on the Old Glenn Highway. This consists of the portion of land known as the Carnival Grounds and the land and building occupied by the Chugiak Senior Center.

In addition to this, the CBA is responsible for operation of the Sanitary Land Fill in Eagle River, which is leased to a private operator.

At present CBA is engaged in negotiating a land exchange with the Greater Anchorage Area Borough which would swap a portion of the community property for the site occupied by the Chugiak Elementary School, including all buildings and improvements.

All members of CBA are urged to attend the meeting on Thursday.

PROCTORS MARKET TO OPEN HERE FRIDAY

WORD ON REAPPORTIONMENT

EAGLE RIVER: Proctor's Grocery in Eagle River will open their doors for business at 9:00am on Friday, July 14th with a number of fantastic bargains for local shoppers according to Orville Proctor, owner of the chain.

Among the many low priced specials are included a number of items priced below cost and available to those who clip out and bring in the coupons printed in Proctors ad which appears on the back page of this issue of the Courier.

Proctor explained that he is able to offer these low prices because he buys direct from the manufacturer, whole sale promotors and anyone who can offer a better price.

Proctor said that they will have over 100 items at low Red Tag prices every day, to make the food dollar go farther.

The new store will feature national brand groceries, USDA Choice meats, prepared to individual special orders and fresh fruits and vegetables, both local and imported.

All specials will be advertised weekly in the Knik Arm Courier to help the local shopper to plan her marketing.

The new store is located at Mile 14 1/2 on the Old Glenn Highway in the building which was occupied by the Red Barn in and which has been extensively re-modeled. The new store occupies 11900 feet of floor space according to Proctor.

Manager of the Eagle River store is Richard Mattson, and Gary Humphry is manager of the meat department. Both men are Eagle River residents.

This is the third store in the Proctor chain. The two others are located at Muldoon Rd. and at Northern Lights Blvd. and C Street.

Proctor said that in addition to offering the same specials as at the two stores in Anchorage, the local market will have a number of in-store specials every week.

JUNEAU: There still is no word on the outcome of the appeal to the U.S. Supreme Court by the office of Governor William A. Egan on the Re apportionment plan which the Alaska Supreme Court had offered.

Lt. Governor Red Boucher, whose office is faced with the problem of conducting the upcoming primary election, has had to plan to conduct that election under one of three possible plans.

This could be either the plan of the Alaska Supreme Court, the plan proposed by Governor Egan, or that under which the last State Election was held.

The word from U.S. Supreme Court Justice Douglas, expected within a week, could let Boucher know which route to follow.

CHAMBER TO MEET WITH MTA MANAGER

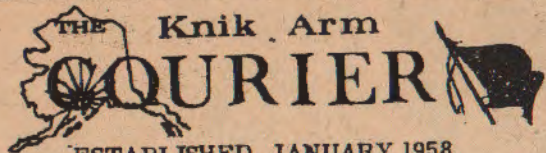
EAGLE RIVER: The next regular meeting of the local Chamber of Commerce will held Monday, July 17th.

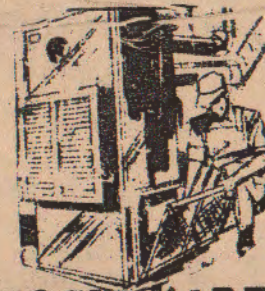

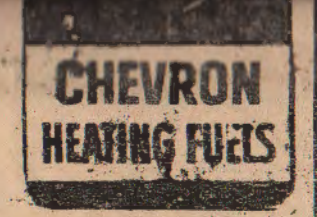

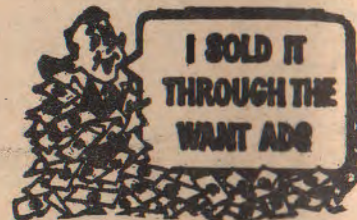

Damage to the Ford was estimated at \$400. The VW was a total loss according to the

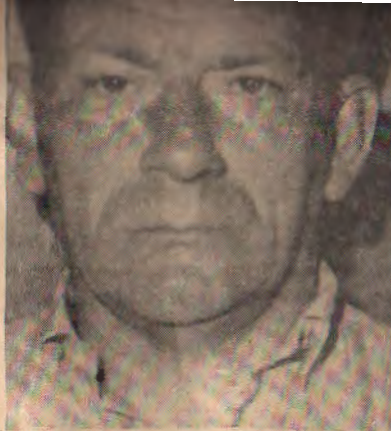

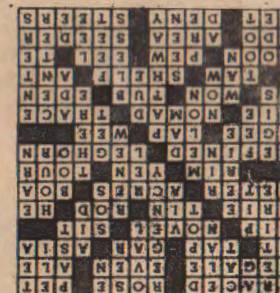

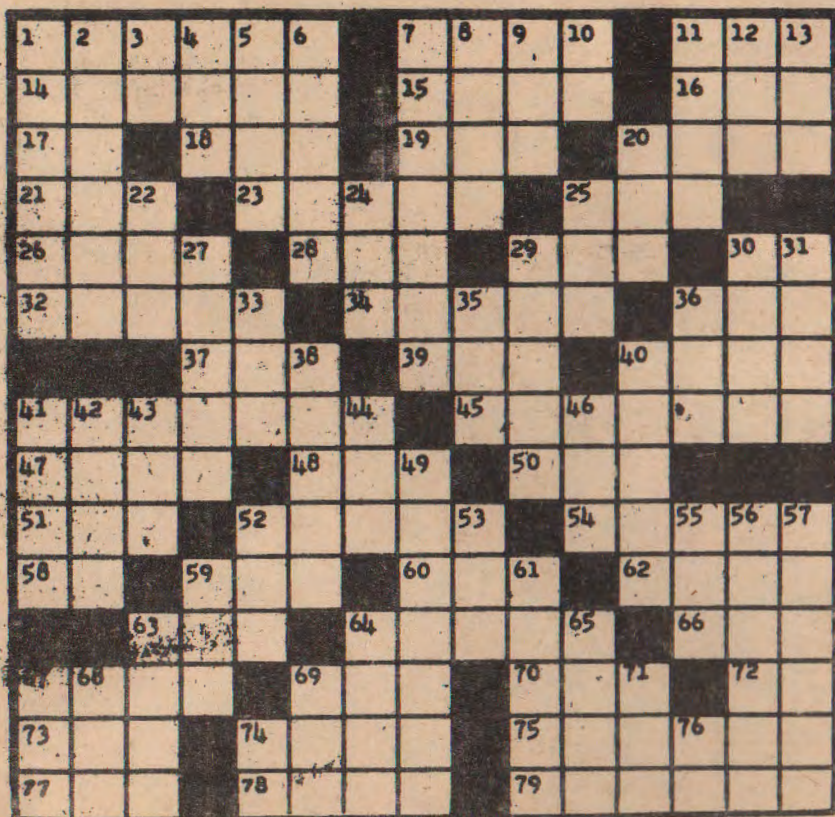
